Shalom and welcome dear friends, Adar 5778 B"H

Each year we come together to celebrate with our shul community, and with the Jewish community at large, the joy of working together in building a closer relationship with Hashem and with Klal Yisroel. Perhaps one could ask, "Why is that a cause for celebration?" It's a good question. Maybe we should just pat each other on the back, say yasher koach, and move on. I'd like to share my thoughts on this topic with you.

A big part of life is coming to an understanding of and clarifying our mission here in this world and then going about trying to accomplish that mission. We're striving to fulfill our purpose on earth. The Ramchal describes this in the beginning of his great work, "Mesillas Yesharim," ("The Path of the Just"), as the foundation of piety and the underpinning of our service to Hashem. 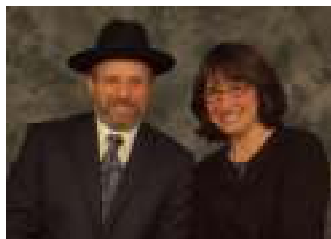

Honorees

Louis and Gail Feinstein



Congregation Tiferes Yisroel is proud to announce that Louis and Gail Feinstein are this year's anniversary concert honorees.

Louis, a native of Baltimore, grew up in a warm, traditional Jewish home. His connection with a former college fraternity brother who had become an Aish HaTorah rabbi based in Potomac, Rabbi Chaim Feld, first led him to Rabbi Goldberger. Through his friendship with Rabbi Feld and his family, Louis began to experience the beauty and depth of a Torah lifestyle. But with his second year of law school beginning, Louis was unable to continue to go to Potomac for Aish HaTorah events, so Rabbi Feld then recommended that he contact Rabbi Goldberger and Etz Chaim's Rabbi Porter in Baltimore. Louis soon went to an Etz Chaim class led by Rabbi Goldberger and, inspired by the Rabbi's words, decided to see what his shul was like. When Louis showed up on a Friday night several days before Rosh Hashanah, he was moved by the incredible spirit of the davening and the genuine welcome he received. He decided then and there to come regularly to "Rabbi Goldberger's shul."

Gail, a Milwaukee native, grew up in a close-knit family with a strong Jewish identity. Active in B'nai Brith and Reform youth groups as a teen, Gail attended college at the University of Michigan, later moving to Oregon in search of spiritual community and the beauty of nature. Ironically, Gail and Louis attended the University of Michigan at the same time but were not destined to meet until years later. It was in Oregon that Gail met a group of Shomer Shabbos people for the first time, and this encounter inspired her to study in Israel, where she learned at the Midreshet Rachel Seminary for eighteen months. She decided to return to the United States to attend graduate school in social work, and it seemed that everyone she knew in Israel and Milwaukee told her that the place for her was Rabbi Goldberger's shul. Sure enough, on her first visit there, davening Shabbos morning in the old TY garage, she fell in love with the shul, and immediately chose Baltimore as her new home, where she developed a close relationship with the Goldbergers, and found the wonderful and inspiring community she had always wanted.

Hashem orchestrated Louis and Gail's first meeting in 1994, shortly after Gail's visit to Baltimore. Louis, on his way to the airport to leave for a year of learning at Machon Shlomo in Har Nof, stopped to say goodbye to his close friends Aaron and Shoshana Shamberg. While Louis was speaking with Aaron on the front porch, Gail, literally having just pulled into town, came to get the keys to the apartment she had rented across the street from

the Shambergs. Aaron introduced the two, and unbeknownst to them, the seeds for a future life together were sown that day.

The following summer, Louis returned to Baltimore and to Rabbi Goldberger's shul, where Gail was now a regular attendee. Mazel brought Louis and Gail to the same Shabbos tables — at all three meals — on Louis's first Shabbos back from the Holy Land! Conversation ensued, followed by the formation of a slow but steady bond that led to dating and, finally, marriage in January of 1998, with Rabbi Goldberger, of course, as mesader kiddushin.

The new couple settled into Gail's apartment, and within a year a son, Yaakov Chaim, was born. Sadly, Yaakov Chaim a"h, was born with medical challenges, and passed away after only one year of life. Reflecting on this part of their early married life, Louis and Gail are quick to point out that, despite the pain of such a loss, there was an incredible outpouring of compassion and a remarkable level of support by the Rabbi and Rebbetzin and the TY kehilla that, to this day, have left a deep and indelible impression upon this resilient couple. Louis and Gail have been blessed with three more children — Sivia, 17, Avraham Meir, 14, and Eli, 11, and much of their energy and dedication to their Judaism is invested in their parenting.

The Feinsteins have always sought to make a contribution to Rabbi Goldberger's shul. As a new member, Gail was a regular on the old Motzei Shabbos cleaning crew, and has also put her efforts over the years into arranging and promoting shiurim given by the Rabbi and Rebbetzin, contributing to Camp Shabbos and Camp Yom Tov activities, shalosh seudos meals and holiday events. After suggesting to the Rabbi that a hospitality coordinator would relieve him of this responsibility, she was immediately "hired" and has served in the role for 13 years. Not only does she ensure that visitors to the community have places to stay and Shabbos and Yom Tov meals to share, but she is a resource for those looking to relocate to Baltimore. A therapist by profession, Gail readily shows empathy and grace and makes it easy for guests with whom she interacts to view Tiferes Yisroel as a natural stopover and desirable spot to revisit.

Louis was a shul officer for three years and served as the Purim card coordinator. He is a dedicated, familiar, and welcoming face on Shabbos, offering a smile, a handshake and a kind word to veterans and newcomers alike. As members of the kehilla, Louis and Gail are the preeminent face of all that is warm and welcoming about Tiferes Yisroel.

Both Louis's and Gail's parents have developed a warm relationship with the Rabbi and Rebbetzin over years of sharing life cycle events, and are grateful that their children have such dear friendships and the loving guidance and support of wonderful mentors.

The couple's relationship with the Rabbi, Rebbetzin and Tiferes Yisroel family has continued to deepen over time. Louis and Gail eagerly express their profound gratitude for the openness, passion, sincerity, kindness, and acceptance that they see as the pillars upon which the shul stands.

Honorees

Lev Avraham and Rachel Rosenstock



If you have visited Rabbi Goldberger's shul in the past ten years, you have met Lev Avraham Rosenstock.

This can be stated with certainty, because Lev Avraham was shul Vice President for Membership for almost ten years, and he made it a point to ensure that every visitor to our spiritual home was made to feel welcome. With his boyish grin, eager and accommodating disposition, and an emotional intelligence that guides him in addressing others with just the right combination of forthrightness and deference, Lev Avraham has played an indispensable role in helping visitors feel the warmth and acceptance that is a key part of the Tiferes Yisroel experience. With Lev Avraham continuing in his role as Membership Chairman, and with his wife and best friend, Rachel, by his side, they have contributed mightily in helping our shul build its sterling reputation for unparalleled kindness and kinship.

Lev Avraham, also known as Louis, was born in Baltimore during the blizzard of 1966, but this had no impact on his sunny personality. A happy, sports-minded child, Lev Avraham developed an artist's eye at an early age, and attended MICA where he received his degree in photography.

Lev Avraham lived and worked as a freelance photographer in Baltimore City until, one day, and seemingly out of the blue, he received a call from the Baltimore Jewish Times, asking if he would like to do freelance, to which he responded with a resounding yes. This led to a great deal of regular work with the JT, where, at times, he would mingle with numerous rabbis and Jewish communal figures. He ended up working on an article alongside Shani Dinovitz, who invited him to the home of her parents, Rabbi and Mrs. Yakov Dinovitz, for a Shabbos meal, and, from there, Lev Avraham's interest in Judaism began to grow.

A second serendipitous event took place when Lev Avraham's close friend Yosef Colabella suggested that Lev Avraham attend classes at Etz Chaim. He agreed, and, when asked by Rabbi Alexander Seinfeld, "Do you have a soul?" was shocked to hear the Rabbi answer his own question in the negative, stating instead that "You ARE a soul; you HAVE a body." This revelation led Lev Avraham into a deep state of introspection; and upon finishing the eight-week series of classes with Rabbi Seinfeld, Lev Avraham went on to form deep connections with other frum families, ultimately finding himself, again at Yosef Colabella's urging, attending services at Rabbi Goldberger's shul. That meeting turned into a lengthy and rewarding relationship between Lev Avraham and the shul that continues to this day.

Rachel, Lev Avraham's biggest fan and supporter, is Cleveland-born but considers Baltimore her lifelong home, having been raised here from an early age. Community-minded from childhood, Rachel volunteered with the Red Cross and Health Care for the Homeless, giving of her time, energy and caring to all in need.

Rachel attended Catonsville Community College and went on to acquire her nursing

degree from the University of Maryland. She moved to New York City to do her nursing residency at NYU Medical Center, and it was there that she found herself, one late summer day, seeking to reconnect with her traditional Jewish roots by finding a reasonably priced ticket for High Holiday services. Her initial efforts were met with disappointment, when she discovered that many Upper East Side shuls expected non-congregants to pay \$1,000 or more per seat, but Rachel persisted and was delighted to learn from a close friend that she could attend a Rosh Hashana Aish HaTorah event for the mere price of \$50! She immediately bought a ticket, smiling to herself at the bargain she had procured.

As with Lev Avraham's experience with Rabbi Seinfeld, the Aish HaTorah speaker peppered the High Holiday question-and-answer session with provocative, searching inquiries into whether man had a soul. Rachel was intrigued and decided to join the learning partners program offered by Aish, as well as to attend classes with the inimitable Rebbetzin Esther Jungreis. Rachel's learning process continued to evolve until she found herself storing her personal items at her parents' home, and heading to Neve Yerushalayim Women's Seminary for six months of Torah immersion.

When Rachel returned as a religious woman to Baltimore, she was introduced to Lev Avraham by Tanya Sporn, who knew both, and thought they would really hit it off. Tanya's intuition was on the mark, and an initial meeting in early 2006 turned into a September engagement, a vort in the Dinovitzes' sukkah, and a Chanukah wedding on a beautiful fall day outside Frank and Danielle Sarah Storch's pool house.

Lev Avraham and Rachel took up residence in the Cross Country Apartments on Clarks Lane, where several of the Goldberger children also lived during that same time period. The Rosenstocks saved up their pennies, and were thrilled when they were able, two years ago, to move into a beautiful home on Taney Road.

Judaism and dedication to Jewish ideals and practices permeate the life of this wonderful couple. Even while they are fully engaged in raising Elyahu, 16, Meira, 15, Akiva Simcha, 8, and Yehudah Shalom, 3, they make ample time to invest energy in both the shul's and the community's needs. Lev Avraham has been the longtime editor of the Lev Echad bulletin, for which he writes a dvar Torah every week. He also tends to many of the "little" mitzvos that are required to keep the shul running smoothly, such as keeping candles well stocked and lit, and emptying and tallying the proceeds from tzedaka pushkas. Rachel gives of her time and talent by working for the Red Cross. She is a huge supporter of her husband's efforts and cares deeply about the shul's vibrant character, adding her own talents to the mix whenever possible.

The Rosenstocks give exceptional credit to the Rabbi and Rebbetzin for being the kind of role models that have enabled them to appreciate that every child can be both different and happy. Lev Avraham and Rachel have always been awed by the uniqueness of each Goldberger child, and have taken up the torch and dedicated themselves to bringing out the exclusive and special nature of each of their own offspring.

Lev Avraham and Rachel do not own smart phones, do not have a television set, and do not allow recreational computer use in their home. Rachel is firmly convinced that the intimacy and strength of her marriage to Lev Avraham, as well as the solid bond they have with each of their children, are a direct result of these technological limitations. In a world gone mad, and with addiction to the internet at an all-time high, the Rosenstocks proudly wear the banner of electronic simplicity, and every day are reaping the genuine, person-to-person benefits of this way of life.

Tiferes Yisroel is proud to have Lev Avraham and Rachel Rosenstock as longtime, dedicated and resolutely involved members of our shul. This awesome couple and their beautiful children add color, texture and depth to our amazing congregation, and it is why we endearingly label them a "picture-perfect" TY family, and bestow upon them the honor accorded on this memorable day.

Moshe and Shula Davids



Congregation Tiferes Yisroel is proud to announce that the Jewish Leadership Award honorees at this year's anniversary concert are Moshe and Shula Davids. The Davidses have been dedicated members of the Baltimore Orthodox community for many decades, and their devotion to the community and its needs is both remarkable and noteworthy.

Shula, a Baltimore native, met Moshe, originally from Washington, D.C., when they were introduced to each other by mutual friends, and they recently celebrated their 52nd wedding anniversary this past December. Today, they are the proud parents of Chani, Itta, Yaakov, Yossi, Leib, and Chaim, and are grandparents and great-grandparents to a host of precious children, residing in Baltimore, Lakewood, and Eretz Yisroel.

Shula's early years as a married woman were largely spent raising her children in the ways of Torah, yet she also found plenty of time, with Moshe's heartfelt agreement and participation, to host many families for uplifting Shabbos and Yom Tov meals. When the children became more independent, Shula then transitioned into her most notable communal role at the Baltimore Mikvah, attending to thousands of local women over the past 25 years, and serving, as well, in an administrative position, offering information and tours to visitors, and helping to keep the Mikvah in proper working order. In her modest way, Shula has handled the communal needs of Baltimore's Jewish women deftly and professionally and is the recipient of the hakaras hatov and gratitude of all those who have met her, and we thank her for all her efforts on behalf of the women of our community.

Moshe moved to Baltimore from the D.C. area at the age of 17 to be closer to his mother's family after his father's untimely passing. He graduated from Talmudical Academy, followed by a one-year stint at Ner Israel under the tutelage of Rabbi Kulefsky, zt"l. Yet, even before his Baltimore education began, Moshe credits his tremendous yearning for a deep and profound relationship with Hashem to his connection and discussions with Rabbis Meir and Nechemia Malin zt"l. The father of these prominent men was a dayan in Brisk, and each was a refined product of the Mir Yeshiva. Moshe's acquaintance and tutelage under these men, starting

around bar mitzvah age, was the primary and motivating force in his becoming religiously grounded, and this early and profound experience continues to impact his strength of character and religious conviction to this day.

Moshe's professional training led him to work as a probation officer, first with Baltimore City, then for the duration of his career in Washington, D.C. His genuine and welcoming manner made it easy for him to serve his charges, and he retired after nearly 25 fulfilling years on the job. Moshe's outgoing yet humble demeanor also made it easy for him to offer up his talent to the Baltimore community, and hundreds of mispallelim can readily testify to his consummate abilities as a ba'al tefilla. The sounds of his deep and mellifluous voice have resounded for over 50 years at his longtime makom kavua, Bais Lubavitch, on Clarks Lane, and he has also appeared as a guest chazzan in a number of shuls over the past five decades. Additionally, he leyned at Levindale monthly for a number of years, volunteered for Jewish Big Brothers of Maryland, where he visited with and gave chizuk to Jewish prisoners serving time in the Maryland prison system, drove for the NWCP since its inception, and worked for the New York-based shaatnez laboratory, under the auspices of Joseph Rosenberger, a"h.

Retirement has seen no diminution in this delightful couple's busy schedule. Shula has been a companion to a multitude of senior women over the last 25 years, driving them to doctor's appointments or accompanying them on short trips to the store for necessities, and she is still going strong in her role as helper, aide and companion. Many of these relationships that she developed over the years constitute a great source of interpersonal wealth and connection for Shula; she regards many of these wonderful ladies that she has assisted as her surrogate mothers, and they view her as their daughter.

Moshe continues to remain active as a chazzan, especially on the High Holidays, as well as maintaining a chavrusashaft with several distinguished members of our community. He can readily be seen and heard at numerous communal simchas, raising his powerful and moving voice in song and in celebration of all the most important Jewish life cycle events. The Davidses' friendship with Rabbi and Rebbetzin Goldberger is lengthy and ironclad, dating back to the days when services took place in the shed behind what is now the shul. Moshe and Shula's admiration for the outpouring of chesed and Torah living, as exemplified by the Rabbi and Rebbetzin, has always been a guiding force in their ongoing quest for meaning and purpose. It is with this thought in mind that we honor the achievements of Moshe and Shula Davids, and wish them both many more years of growth, happiness and the opportunity to offer their unique gifts to the community.

Our Guest Entertainer Yehuda Green



While the world of Jewish music has become saturated with “Shlomo Style” performances and performers, none have captured the hearts and souls of audiences around the world with the soft-spoken success of Yehudah Green.

Born to a prominent Chassidic family in Jerusalem, Yehudah received his first exposure to the music of Reb Shlomo Carlebach at the age of five. Despite his tender age (or perhaps because of it), Yehudah immediately connected with Shlomo’s sincere, almost spiritual, soulfulness on a truly organic level. Rather than imitate it, his youthful innocence and exuberance enabled him to absorb its essence into his musical DNA and ultimately into his signature performance style.

It wasn’t until almost two decades later in New Hill, England, when Yehudah had the privilege to share the stage with his rebbe (to this day Yehudah describes himself as a student of the saintly Rav Shlomo, rather than just a singer of his songs).

Those fortunate enough to have been in the audience that evening describe an event that transcended any concert they’ve been to before or since. Clearly Shlomo sensed in Yehudah a kindred

spirit — someone who shared his voice and deep regard for the power of the niggun.

That night evolved into a relationship that became the musical equivalent of “the passing of the torch.” Despite his perpetually busy performance schedule, Shlomo made it a point to join Yehudah at least three times a year in Israel for standing room only performances that became the hottest ticket in town — regardless of who else happened to be in town.

Those now legendary performances led to an inevitable invitation to the famed Carlebach Shul on Manhattan’s Upper West Side, where Yehudah’s honest, earthy style immediately set him apart from the countless singers who incorporate interpretations of Shlomo into their performances. Perhaps the greatest compliment of all came about ten years ago when Yehudah was chosen to lead services during the Yomim Noraim.

Like the legend who inspires him both personally and professionally, Yehudah’s fan base is a living lesson in Jewish demography. The audiences at his sold-out concerts are comprised of people from Williamsburg to Westchester. Attend a Yehudah Green concert and odds are that you’ll find yourself sitting between a traditionally dressed resident of Skver on one side, a clearly Mizrachi type from Englewood on the other, and a Uman yarmulkeh-clad Lower East Side hipster behind you.

Like Shlomo, the honesty of Yehudah’s music unites our people as only our almost universal love of song can. Regardless if its an intimate kumsitz or a sold-out concert, Yehudah’s style evokes an emotional response that few, if any, performers can match.

Or, as he describes it — with a level of modesty that invariably brings his mentor to mind, “Music is about honesty — not affectation ... since childhood my music and singing just naturally went in Shlomo’s direction...it’s that “emes” that connects with audiences and Baruch Hashem lets them respond on a much deeper level.

Words of Appreciation from Lev Avraham Rosenstock

Rachel and I find it nearly impossible to find the words to express our gratitude for being chosen as this year's TY Anniversary Concert co-honorees. I would like to wish a hearty mazel tov and yasher koach to Louis and Gail Feinstein, and to Moshe and Shula Davids, and I'd like to extend a warm welcome to all of our TY members and guests. I will begin by offering tremendous hakoras hatov to HaKadosh Baruch Hu for all the chesed, hatzlacha and bracha that He has brought into my and Rachel's life together: a beautiful family — our children — our amazing Rabbi and Rebbetzin — and all of you, our dear friends. A special thank you to Yankie and Cathy Dinovitz, Aryeh and Bracha Goetz, Heshy and Chaya Dachs, Ari and Caryn Blum and Lenny and Glenna Ross for their friendship, guidance and support over the years. Thank you to the Rosh Kollel, HaRav Kostelitz, and my rebbe, Reb Shragi Baumgarten, from whom I learned much Torah during my years as a talmid at the Community Kollel. To Shuki Nissan for, well, for just being Shuki — for his friendship and for his passion for learning and living Torah. And I'd like to thank my beloved wife Rachel, my eishes chayil, who has loved me and supported me throughout our entire life together.

When I came to Congregation Tiferes Yisroel thirteen years ago, I was immediately greeted by warm and friendly smiles, and a welcoming sense of camaraderie. Rabbi Goldberger came right over and introduced himself and asked my name, and right away I felt a connection. Although the concept of davening was completely foreign to me, something was triggered deep inside, something that I had never felt before. By the time davening was over, I already felt like a member of the kehillah, and could not wait to come back again the following week. Rabbi and Rebbetzin Goldberger have always been a big part of our lives, and have always been there for us to offer their guidance, love and support every step of the way down our spiritual path together.

Tonight, we celebrate the 32nd anniversary of Congregation Tiferes Yisroel, and it is certainly no coincidence that 32 is the gematria of lev — לָו. We believe that a person's name is a reflection of their essence. Rachel once told me that all she ever looked for in a person was a "lev tov," especially in a spouse (a piece of advice given to her by Rebbetzin Esther Jungreis). I try each and every day to live up to that expectation, to treat others with the "heart of Avraham," to be kind and giving to my wife, my family and my friends, as well as everyone I encounter on a daily basis. I believe that having a "lev tov" is an essential element to spiritual growth, because it is the heart that guides us in our every thought, action and deed; it is the heart with which the Shema commands us to love Hashem and warns us to protect ourselves from going astray.

And of course, there's the Lev Echad, my "second wife" as Rachel puts it!

It was three years ago when Caryn Blum approached me with the idea of taking over the Lev Echad. With a little coaxing, I agreed, and the very

next day an elated, enraptured and euphoric Suzanne Kayne came by to give me a two-hour crash-course in Microsoft Word. So excited for me to take over, Suzanne bought me the program and wished me luck! I struggled a bit at first, but as I became more familiar with the program, it got easier and more enjoyable to work on each week. A few months into it, I started writing a weekly dvar Torah, and as Suzanne put it, made it my own. Over the years, many of you have come up to me thanking me for writing the dvar Torah each week, and I'd like to tell you how much I appreciate the feedback, especially from the Rebbetzin! I'd like to thank Suzanne for all her help and support in the first year of my editorship, and a very special thank you to my trusty copy editors Glenna Ross, Rena Levi and Ann Stiller.

While preparing for Shabbos Beshalach, I came across an amazing Torah lesson brought down by Rav Levi Yitzchak of Berditchev. He states that the lesson of Krias Yam Suf was to show how each person who crossed the sea, from Moshe Rabbeinu to the simplest maidservant, had the potential to reach incredible levels. Rav Levi explains that every Jew realized that he could indeed be great, and that with the appropriate effort, he could burst past all the barriers in his life to attain tremendous levels. Rebbe Nachman of Breslov once said to his chassidim: "It appears to you as if the main attainments and accomplishments of the tzaddikim come only as a result of their lofty souls, but, in truth, it is not that way at all! Every single one of you has the ability to reach my level and be exactly like me; it all depends on the effort and work you put in." In his classic sefer Chovas HaTalmidim, the Piaseczner Rebbe writes to a student: "When we speak to you, we don't know to whom we are speaking. But neither do you know who you are, or who you will become when you grow in avodah and Torah, whether you will become a tzaddik and gaon whose name will spread throughout the world, or even a wealthy oved Hashem who gives much tzedakah and is a tribute to his people, an individual such as whom each parent will bless his child to be."

The message here from these great Torah luminaries, I believe, is that no matter whether you are the seventh-generation grandson of a chassidic dynasty or a forty-year-old baal-teshuvah, Hashem gives a person the same potential for success in attaining high spiritual levels, and it is up to that individual to put forth the effort and hishtadlus to achieve it. Congregation Tiferes Yisroel is a virtual "breeding-ground" for spiritual growth and Torah learning. Our kehillah is an eclectic mix of Jewish people from all different backgrounds and levels of Torah education. Yet, under the leadership of Rabbi and Rebbetzin Goldberger, we all come together as "eesh echad b'lev echad." That is why I came to this shul thirteen years ago, and that is why I call Tiferes Yisroel my home.
