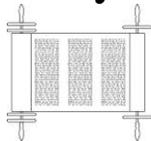

The Weekly Parsha



Parshas Vayeishev

**“But he was a youth with the sons of
Bilhah and with the sons of Zilpah”
(37:2)**

Sforno posits that due to his immaturity, Yosef sinned by telling tales about his brothers. He was inexperienced and, thus, could not foresee the consequences of his actions. This does not negate the fact that he was very intelligent and was later able to counsel the Egyptian hierarchy. Intelligence and wisdom are independent of maturity. Yosef had the ability to offer sound advice based upon his brilliance. Yet, his puerile attitude precluded his ability to envision the sequel to the stories he was telling his father about his brothers. It would seem from Sforno's explanation that Yosef's age played a negative role in his debacle. I think that we might be able to view his attitude in a positive light. After all, we find that Yehoshua, successor to Moshe Rabbeinu as Klal Yisrael's leader, was referred to as a *na'ar*.

All too often a leader is confronted with a dilemma: an infraction occurs to which he must respond. Yet, he procrastinates, because he feels that he must study all of the political ramifications. Usually, he ends up either responding poorly or not responding at all. Why? Because he fears the consequences. This is where *naar*, the ability to maintain a certain level of immaturity, to see an infraction and respond immediately - regardless of the backlash - plays a pivotal role. Otherwise, while he dabbles around looking for excuses to either act or not act, Hashem's Name is being publicly profaned. At times, a leader must step forward and take action, blind to the potential consequences.

Chazal tell us that because Yosef placed his trust in the *sar ha'mashkim*, Chamberlain of Cupbearers, instead of Hashem Himself, he was punished with a two-year extension of his sentence. What did Yosef really do wrong? There is such a thing as *hishtadlus*, endeavoring. Part of *hishtadlus* is to ask the chamberlain to intercede on his behalf. This does not diminish his trust in Hashem. The

commentators, each in his own way, offer explanations for Yosef's actions and, thereby, teach us lessons in the meaning of faith and trust in Hashem. Horav Nosson Wachtfogel, zl, the venerable Mashgiach of Beth Medrash Govohah, underscores this question by citing the fact that in preparing for his confrontation with Eisav, Yaakov Avinu employed three forms of *hishtadlus*: *doron*, he sent a gift; *tefillah*, he prayed to Hashem; *milchamah*, he prepared for war. Why then are Yosef's actions discountenanced?

The Mashgiach cites Horav Chaim Vital, zl, who distinguishes between Yaakov's *hishtadlus* that was carried out together with *tefillah* and Yosef's *hishtadlus* that was exclusive of *tefillah*. While Yosef certainly prayed to Hashem, it was not together with the *hishtadlus*. Every act of *hishtadlus* must be accompanied by prayer, supplicating Hashem that this act of *hishtadlus* be successful. Likewise, when one goes to the doctor, he should entreat Hashem with a *kapital*, chapter, of Tehillim, that this visit should be therapeutic. Thus, one realizes that the physician is only a *shliach*, Hashem's agent. It is Hashem who dispenses the cure. He chooses to deliver it through His various emissaries.

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Divinely Orchestrated

Parshas Vayeishev tells the story of Yosef and his brothers, and how their relationship went from bad to worse, resulting in Yosef being sold as a slave and taken to Mitzraim. As an expression of his deep love for Yosef, Yaakov made him a “fine woolen tunic,” and the Torah states: “His brothers saw that it was he whom their father loved most of all his brothers, so they hated him” (Bereishis 37:4). Yosef makes matters worse by revealing his two dreams to his brothers, as the Torah then states: “And they hated him even more – because of his dreams and because of his talk” (ibid. 37:8), and after the second dream, “So his brothers were jealous of him, but his father kept the matter in mind” (ibid. 37:11).

Clearly Yaakov was aware of the brothers' feelings of animosity towards Yosef; one might even suggest, as stated in the pasukim, that Yaakov's favoritism towards Yosef played a major role, leaving Yaakov himself primarily responsible for the contention between Yosef and his brothers. With all that being said, it is almost impossible for me to understand what happens next: “Now his brothers went to pasture their father's flock in Shechem. And Yisrael said to Yosef, ‘Your brothers are pasturing in Shechem, are they not? Come, I will send you to them.’... So he sent him from the valley of Chevron, and he arrived at

Shechem” (ibid. 37:12-14). Every year I read this parsha, I always struggle with this apparent *kasha* - why would Yaakov send his beloved son Yosef to Shechem, of all places, to look for his brothers? Shechem was a dangerous place for Yosef to travel there alone, and his brothers despised him! Was Yaakov not concerned for Yosef's safety? Surely, at some point in the thought process, this must have seemed like a bad idea to Yaakov, so why did he do it?

We find the answer in the Midrash, based on a Rashi: The word עמק, “valley,” is related to עמוק, “deep.” Thus, the phrase “from the valley of Chevron” implies “from the depth of Chevron”; Yosef's departure from Chevron originated from the deep designs concerning Avraham, who was told by G-d that his descendants would sojourn in a land not theirs. Yosef's departure from Chevron began the process that resulted in Yaakov's exile to Mitzraim (Bereishis Rabbah 84:13). The midrash explains that by sending Yosef from Chevron to find his brothers, whether through *ruach hakodesh* or Divine inspiration, Yaakov was actually setting into motion the fulfillment of Hashem's promise to Avraham.

The Malbim expands on this concept in his essay “The Divine Plan Versus Free Will.” He writes: “Although it is true that G-d's general plan will ultimately be done despite human intervention, humans have the free will as to what specific part they will play in this plan. Even if G-d's plan was for Yosef to become viceroy of Mitzraim, and for Yaakov and his family to ultimately migrate there, this could have come about through any number of scenarios, and not necessarily through the brothers selling Yosef as a slave. Indeed, this approach is the one found in the Sefer Akeidas Yitzchak: Sha'ar 28, which states that while the overall outcome was G-d's plan, all the interim steps in the story of Yosef were products of human free will. Yaakov's sending his beloved Yosef on this dangerous mission defies natural explanation; it can only be understood as the Hand of G-d fulfilling the ‘deep counsel of the righteous Avraham, who is buried in Chevron and was promised by G-d that his offspring would be enslaved and oppressed in a foreign land.’” The Malbim adds, “In addition, while the sale of Yosef was done with free choice, the events leading up to it were all Divinely orchestrated. Even the hatred itself that drove the brothers to sell Yosef was planted in their hearts by G-d” (Yalkut Shimoni: Bereishis 37:141). A gutten Shabbos.
