## The Weekly Parsha



### Parshas Pinchas

**“Pinchas son of Elazar son of Aharon the Kohen, turned back My wrath from upon the Children of Israel, when he zealously avenged My vengeance among them, so I did not consume the Children of Israel in My vengeance.”  
(25:11)**

At the end of last week’s parsha, the Jewish people began to sin with the non-Jewish Midianites. Even Zimri, the leader of the tribe of Shimon, was caught up in transgressing. Anxious to stem the spread of the sin, Aharon’s grandson Pinchas publicly killed Zimri. Rashi writes that the Jewish people began to embarrass Pinchas. They questioned how a person whose maternal grandfather (Yisro) was an idolater could murder the leader of a tribe. Therefore, the Torah specifically emphasizes Pinchas’s paternal descent from Aharon.

The logic behind the Jews’ argument and Hashem’s response is difficult to grasp. If they knew the law that permitted Pinchas’s actions, why did they insult him? If they were unfamiliar with the law and viewed him as a cold-blooded murderer, of what benefit was it to point out his paternal lineage? In what way did it change the reality that one of his grandfathers served as a priest for idol-worship and that in their minds, he had killed the leader of a tribe without justification?

Rav Meir Shapiro explains that the value of a mitzvah is measured by the degree to which its performance runs counter to a person’s natural inclinations and therefore represents a greater test of his devotion to Hashem. The Jews attempted to minimize the greatness of Pinchas’s actions not by insinuating that he was a cold-blooded killer, but by hinting that it had come easy to him because his grandfather cruelly killed animals as part of his idol-worship.

The Torah therefore emphasizes that this act was performed with great difficulty and internal resistance. Pinchas’s natural instincts came not from his allegedly merciless maternal grandfather, but from his paternal grandfather Aharon, a man whose entire life was dedicated to the pursuit of peace. The Lekach Tov derives from here the importance of adapting ourselves to the Torah and not attempting to interpret the Torah’s laws in light of our personal preferences, a lesson illustrated by the following story.

A person once remarked to Rav Yitzchok Hutner that the performance of certain mitzvos is too difficult for him since they run counter to his nature and he is unable to change. Rav Hutner responded by likening the man’s argument to the case of a motorist speeding down the highway who suddenly sees flashing lights in his rear-view mirror. He pulls over, and the policeman approaches and asks why he was driving 83 mph on a highway with a speed limit of 50.

The man foolishly answers that he did nothing wrong, as the car was set to cruise control and he wasn’t even the one driving at that speed. The officer dismisses his specious defense by noting that he was the one to initially set the cruise control to an illegal speed. Similarly, when a person comes before the Heavenly Court and attempts to justify his ways by noting that certain mitzvos ran counter to his very essence, he will have a difficult time explaining who was responsible for creating within himself a nature which runs counter to the Torah.

While every person has different mitzvos that specifically challenge him, the Mishnah in Avos teach that the strong person is one who conquers his evil inclination (4:1) and that the harder a mitzvah is for a person, the greater will be his reward for doing it (5:22), a lesson we should learn from the eternal covenant of peace that Hashem gave to Pinchas for acting counter to his peaceful nature.

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### Know Your Shul Members-

#### Lev Avraham and Rachel Rosenstock

A sticker on Lev Avraham Rosenstock’s bumper says, “We are not human beings having a spiritual experience. We are spiritual beings having a human experience.” It’s kind of ironic, he says, because this concept is core to the story of his becoming frum, but he already had the sticker before that happened. A

friend who was converting brought him to Etz Chaim to hear Rabbi Alexander Seinfeld, author of *The Art of Amazement*. The rabbi asked how many people believed they had a soul. After hands went up, he said, “I’m here to tell you that you don’t have a soul. You *are* a soul; you have a body.” The body is temporary, the soul eternal: This idea of the duality of existence really resonated with Lev Avraham (who went by Louis then); he already had the sticker on his car.

The same friend later brought him one Friday night to Rabbi Goldberger’s shul. It was quite a night for him.

“I had long hair, earrings in both ears, tattoos. I walked in and did not feel out of place. Everyone was very welcoming. I grew up here in Baltimore, and I had no idea that there were Orthodox Jews who were open to people like me. I didn’t know what Torah-observant meant, nor did I think that there were people like Rabbi Goldberger, who would reach out to any Jewish person with understanding and compassion.”

He still has the tattoos. “I don’t mind them, in the sense that it reminds me of from where I came. It keeps me humble. Sometimes if I get a little judgmental, I remind myself that ten years ago, that was me. It reminds me that people can change. As my friend Arthur told me once, ‘Every saint has a past; every sinner has a future.’”

Lev Avraham’s career as an editorial and public relations photographer led him towards frumkeit—and then frumkeit led him away from photography. After the Baltimore Jewish Times tapped him “out of the clear blue sky,” his work began to offer him a window into observant life. Shooting pictures for a piece written by Shani Dinovitz led to his virtual adoption by her parents, Yankee and Cathy Dinovitz. But becoming shomer Shabbos meant turning down a lot of the assignments he was used to taking on Friday nights and Saturdays; at the same time, digital was supplanting the film process he loved, and still misses. Today he shoots simchas occasionally, while being a full-time stay-at-home “Abba,” learning at the Community Kollel, and serving the shul as a member of TY’s Executive Board and editor of the Lev Echad.

“It’s like in Devarim,” Lev Avraham says, “when Moshe names the places where Bnei Yisrael camped. I look back and recognize all the different steps I took to get to where I am today. I see how Hashem wove the tapestry: He gave this to me, and he took that away.”

One of the new strands was Rachel. She had grown up in Pikesville, he in Randallstown, but they had never met until a friend introduced them nine years ago. They met in March, had their vort in the Dinovitzes’ sukkah, and were married in Frank Storch’s driveway, on a sunny, 72-degree December day, the second day of Chanukah.

Rachel has worked in nursing since 1995. Medicine runs in the family: her father is a podiatrist, her uncle, an optometrist; a cousin is a plastic surgeon. She loves nursing: "It's definitely my thing." For the past eight years, she has trained certified nursing assistants for the American Red Cross, three weeks in the classroom and one week in a nursing home.

The most rewarding part of her job is when her students land jobs they enjoy, using skills she taught them. "It's amazing when you teach people, starting with hand washing, and some of them go on to be PAs, or are taking premed."

Education is also an inherited value. Her great-grandfather Frank (Ephraim) Cohen, who davened at Glen Avenue shul, was very involved with Talmudical Academy in its early years—the same school that has educated her sons. "He owned a distillery. During the Depression, from what I understand, he gave a lot of money to help TA stay open, even though his only son had died. That's extremely meaningful to me."

The Rosenstocks' children are Eliyahu, 14, who will be starting high school at Ner Israel this fall after 9 years at TA; Meira Batia, 13, who is very active on the Bais Yaakov newspaper staff; Akiva Simcha, 5 ½, who likes to tell stories and will let you know if it's going to be a true one; and Yehudah Shalom, 4 months (14 lbs.), who is about to start eating oatmeal.

Amidst this busy life, Rachel likes to keep things simple. She doesn't have a smart phone or an email address and has never seen a Facebook page. For pleasure, she loves to read, and, since reading Rebbetzin Kanievsky's book on the subject, has loved the mitzvah of challah. "It tastes pretty good, too," she says, "so it's a win-win."

For staying in touch the old-fashioned way, Rachel says she cherishes the TY kehilla, both for the personal connections and for the guidance others offer as examples in raising their families and growing personally, with Torah leading the way.
