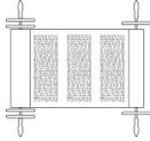

## The Weekly Parsha



### Weekly “What’s Your Shailah?” with Rabbi Yehuda Leib Goldberger

**Question:** My daughter needs new clothes for camp. Can I buy them during the three weeks?

**Answer:** You may buy them before the nine days. Once the nine days begin, you are not allowed to buy them.

The *שלחן ערוך* brings a *מנהג* not to recite a *שהחיינו* during the three weeks. Therefore a person should refrain from activities that require a *שהחיינו* such as eating a new fruit and buying items which require a *שהחיינו* (and under certain circumstances recites one on their inheritance). The *חומרא יתרא* – exceeding/overly stringent practice. Others explain that this custom is not due to *אבילות*; rather, because the three weeks is an ominous time for the Jewish people and it is inappropriate to thank Hashem for bringing us to this time (which is part of the text of the *שהחיינו* we do not make a *שהחיינו*. While the *הלכה* is to refrain from activities which require a *שהחיינו*, the *משנה ברורה* is lenient on *שבת* (according to the Arizal, one should refrain on *שבת* as well).

Nowadays we do not make a *שהחיינו* on most garments. The garment would have to make you feel a significant amount of joy in order to say a *שהחיינו*. Since buying new clothing is now commonplace, it is not significant enough to recite a *שהחיינו*. Therefore, as far as the *שהחיינו* is concerned, there is no problem in buying clothing. However, there are those who maintain that even though there is no *שהחיינו*, there is a certain feeling of happiness in getting new clothing and one should not do so during the three weeks. The *משנה ברורה* questions this opinion, but many others agree with it. One who has strong positive feelings about buying new clothing should make an attempt to plan accordingly and avoid buying new clothing during the three weeks. In the event that one did not do so, and the clothing is a necessity, it is permitted to buy them.

Even if the garment does require a *שהחיינו* (e.g., a new suit), if it is truly necessary to buy it (e.g., job interview), you may buy it. This is

based on the *רמ"א* who allows one to consume a new fruit if it will not be available later. If possible, you should wear it for the first time on *שבת* and recite the *שהחיינו* then.

Often times, not having the right clothing is a significant source of stress for a young lady. Therefore, if there is an actual need (even a minor one), you may buy the clothing even if it requires a *שהחיינו* in accordance with the *רמ"א* and the *משנה ברורה* mentioned above. It bears repeating that one should try to plan ahead and avoid this issue. The three weeks is not a time to get distracted from our feelings of loss for the *בית המקדש*.

This is only relevant before the nine days. Once the nine days begins one may not buy new clothing, regardless of the *שהחיינו*.

### Women of Valor

In this week’s parsha, Hashem commands Moshe and Elazar to “Take a census of the entire assembly of the Children of Israel” (Bamidbar 26:2), and included in the listing of the tribe of Menasshah, the Torah states, “Zelophehad ben Hopher had no sons, only daughters; Mahlah and Noa, Hoglah, Milcah and Tirzah” (ibid. 26:33). The chapter concludes with “These are the ones counted by Moshe and Elazar HaKohen, who counted the Children of Israel in the plains of Moab... And of these, there was no man of those counted by Moshe and Aharon HaKohen, who counted the children of Israel in the Wilderness of Sinai” (ibid. 26:63-64). Rashi comments that the Torah emphasizes that “there was no man” because only the women of that generation were still alive at the time of the second counting. The women cherished the Land, and they did not participate in the sin of the *meraglim*. However, the men of that generation accepted the slanderous report regarding the Land, and were forbidden entry and “sentenced to death” in the midbar. Chapter 27 opens with the daughters of Zelophehad, who came to Moshe to request a portion of land in Eretz Yisroel that they believed was the rightful inheritance of their father, thus demonstrating their love for the Land.

The Torah is replete with examples of how the women excelled in their devotion to and faith in Hashem. Chazal teach us that in the merit of the righteous women, our forefathers were redeemed from servitude in Mitzraim (Sotah 11b). It was the copper from the mirrors that they made in Mitzraim to beautify themselves to maintain family life that was used to make the laver in the Mishkan. Similarly, the women were addressed first by Hashem’s command to Moshe: “So shall you say to the daughters of Yaakov and relate to the sons of Yisroel” (Shemos 19:3) by Har Sinai at

Matan Torah. Nor did the women participate at all in the Sin of the Golden Calf. It was the women who cherished the Land, and thereby merited entering Eretz Yisroel, while the men all perished in the midbar. Rav Shlomo Wolbe writes: “In contrast to those who believe that women have an inferior spiritual status, the Torah clarifies for us their true level of greatness.”

Rashi tells us “that their [the daughters of Zelophehad] eye saw that which the eye of Moshe did not see,” prompting Hashem to teach Moshe the laws of inheritance. Rav Wolbe adds, “There is another lesson to be gleaned from the daughters of Zelophehad: They are yet another example of the emphasis the Torah places on the importance of each individual. Their simple request, which demonstrated an intense spiritual desire, brought them honor in the eyes of their generation and all future generations, since Hashem recorded their dialogue in the Torah. Every individual has the potential to leave this mark!” (Shiurei Chumash, Parshas Pinchas 26:64, 27:5). A gutten Shabbos

### Parshas Pinchas

#### “Pinchas ben Elazar ben Aharon HaKohen turned back My wrath upon the Children of Israel” (25:11)

The mystics teach that through his actions, Pinchas atoned for the sin of Nadav and Avihu. The Chiddushei HaRim points out a number of similarities between these two incidents in which Pinchas corrected mistakes made by Nadav and Avihu.

The Gemara (Eiruvin 63a) teaches that Nadav and Avihu were punished for issuing a legal ruling in the presence of their teacher Moshe. Pinchas rectified this by specifically going to discuss his actions with Moshe before acting. The Torah (Vayikra 10:1) also teaches that Nadav and Avihu were punished for bringing an incense-offering which they weren’t commanded by Hashem to offer. Pinchas corrected this by doing an action which in a sense he wasn’t commanded to do. The Gemara (Sanhedrin 82a) teaches that such an act of zealotry may only be done by a person who knows the law on his own, as a Rabbi who is asked about the law may not instruct others to perform it.

Additionally, just as Nadav and Avihu gave up their lives for the dedication of the Mishkan, Pinchas also endangered his life when he entered Zimri’s tent to kill him, as Zimri could have easily attacked him first. The Chiddushei HaRim suggests that this is the reason that the laws of the sacrifices which are offered on the

festivals are specifically taught in Parshas Pinchas. Just as Nadav and Avihu represented the first sacrifices in the Mishkan, Pinchas rectified their actions when he risked becoming a sacrifice for a proper purpose, and the laws of the offerings are therefore concluded in this parsha.
