

The Weekly Parsha



Parshas Ha'azinu

"The Rock! Perfect is His work... a G-d of faith without iniquity, righteous and fair is He." (32:4)

Many of us go through life wondering... why a tzaddik, a thoroughly righteous individual, has to beg for a piece of bread to soothe his hunger pains, a glass of water to alleviate his thirst, a garment to clothe his body. This is, regrettably, his lot in life. Why? Certainly, Hashem has no problem addressing this person's material needs. The Chafetz Chaim, zl, analogizes this to a wealthy man whose only son was taken seriously ill. No one was able to help him, until a world-famous physician successfully diagnosed his illness and gave him medicine to save his life. In order to prevent the illness from recurring, the doctor strongly admonished the father to see to it that his son never eat any red meat.

One day, the father had to leave for an extended business trip. He reminded his wife that their son was not to have any meat. A few days later, the mother was having dinner, and the odor of the steaks overwhelmed her son to the point that he ran in and grabbed a piece of steak and gulped it down. By the time his father returned from his trip, the son was hovering between life and death. Once again, the father summoned the physician and pleaded with him to save his son's life. "I will never leave him again," the father cried. It took some time, but the doctor succeeded once again in saving the son's life.

Soon after, the father made a large banquet for family and friends, but did not invite his only son. In fact, his son was barred from entering the room where so many succulent meats were on display. People wondered how a father could be so "cruel" to invite everyone but his own son. Little did they realize that the father was performing the greatest service for his son.

The same thing occurs in this world. Hashem celebrates with many people, and it appears that everyone is at the party except his closest devotees. They seem to be barred from attendance. In reality, Hashem is true and just, and there is certainly a very good reason for their lack of inclusion at the party. They do not complain because they have unequivocal faith in Hashem's system of justice. One last caveat that allows us a penetrating perspective into the

manner in which Hashem balances the reward He bestows.

Horav Arye Leib Hakohen, zl, the Chafetz Chaim's son, related that as a youth, his family lived in abject poverty. His father studied Torah day and night, while his mother eked out a pittance from their little grocery store. Once the situation became so impossible that his mother turned to her husband and asked, "Look at 'that' man who is illiterate, who never opens a sefer, whose children are boorish and uncouth. Yet, they are wealthy. They never want for anything. While you devote your life to the pursuit of Torah and mitzvos, with your children following in your footsteps, still poverty and starvation is all you have to look forward to. Why?"

The Chafetz Chaim turned to his wife and - in his quiet and gentle manner - replied, "Do you think that it would be right that a man who is not gifted with an astute mind, who has not tasted the sweetness of Torah, who has not sensed the beauty of mitzvos, and whose children are equally deficient, should also be deprived of material success? We should be happy that Hashem has granted us so much!"

What a beautiful thought! All too often we find reason to complain about our material circumstances, while we seem to ignore the spiritual gifts that Hashem has granted us. I dare say that anyone would not even dream of exchanging one for the other.

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The Power of Rain

Parshas Ha'azinu is Moshe Rabbeinu's final "song of admonishment" to the Bnei Yisroel before he takes leave of this world, leaving his faithful servant Yehoshua in their charge. He begins by calling for the attention of the heavens and the earth, to summon them as witnesses to the final warning which follows (Minchas Yehudah; Sifsei Chachamim). The song begins with, "May my teaching drip like the rain, may my utterance flow like the dew" (Devarim 32:2). Rashi comments on this pasuk: "This is the testimony that you should witness, that I say in your presence, 'The Torah that I gave to Israel, that it is life for the world like this rain which is life for the world when the heavens drip dew and rain.'" In addition, the heavens and the earth were called upon to bear witness because it is through them that Hashem provides man all of his sustenance - rain from the heavens and food from the earth.

Rabbi Shlomo Wolbe asks in what way is Torah similar to rain? Rav Yerucham Levovitz explains, "Rain dampens the soil and creates a fertile environment for the seeds planted within, but the actual growth of the plant comes

from the seed itself. Similarly, although the Torah prepares and cultivates a person for spiritual growth, a great portion of the growth must originate from inside the person himself." Rabbeinu Yonah writes, "If a person does not arouse himself, how will mussar help?" (Shaarei Teshuvah 2:26), indicating that a person must internalize what he gains from his Torah learning, and use this knowledge to inspire *himself* to grow.

Rav Wolbe makes a similar observation regarding the energy of Succos: "The Yom Tov of Succos has the potential to be one of the most spiritually uplifting times of the year if we allow it to be. We sit in makeshift 'Clouds of Glory' surrounded by Hashem's Divine Protection, and we rejoice in the recent forgiveness we attained on Yom Kippur. The opportunity for spiritual growth that Succos affords us is immense. If we fail to arouse ourselves, however, we might leave the succah just as we entered it" (Shiurei Chumash, Parshas Ha'azinu 32:2; Alei Shur, Vol. II, p.145).

Rain also has a cleansing effect, both physically and spiritually, as we find in the case of the mikvah, which can be used to purify our bodies and our souls, as well as our *keilim*. In Selichos for Yom Kippur Maariv we say, "Forgive, please, wantonness and error of those created for Your Name's sake, their iniquitous sin purify with your generous rain." Here, and in many other places in our davening, the Sages use rain and dew as similes for G-d's gift of life (Shabbos 88a), which counteracts the deadly effect of sin. Again, we see how rain serves to purify our souls and increase our vitality.

After Shemini Atzeres, we begin to add "Who makes the wind blow and the rain descend" to the beginning of the second bracha in Shemoneh Esrei. The Talmud (Taanis 7a) states: "The day of rainfall is greater than the day of the Resuscitation of the Dead, because the future revival is only for the righteous, whereas rainfall comes for both the righteous and wicked alike. Since rainfall is compared to revival, the Sages included it in the blessing for the Resuscitation of the Dead." Rain causes the buried seed to rot and disintegrate, after which it germinates and produces a beautiful plant. This parallels the Resurrection of the Dead, when the "planted" body will emerge in a superior form. Both are evidence of Hashem's *gevurah*, might. In addition, rain supplies nourishment from which human bodies are formed, as 65% of our bodies consist of water. Thus, "rain is tantamount to a downpour of human life" (Rav Avigdor Miller; Artscroll Shemoneh Esrei).

We see how Hashem uses the power of rain for both life-giving and sustaining purposes, but also, as we know from Parshas Noach, rain can cause death and destruction. Even today - especially today - Klal Yisroel must heed Moshe's warning in Parshas Ha'azinu and

allow the holy Torah to guide us through every facet of our lives. May we all be zoche to have Hashem "rain down" his blessings upon us and continue to "reign over" us for all eternity. A gutten Shabbos.
