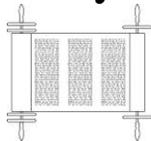

The Weekly Parsha**Parshas Beha'aloscha**

“Now the manna was like coriander seed...its color was like the color of the bedolach” (11:7)

“Israel said, ‘We have nothing before our eyes but the manna,’ and the Holy One, Blessed is He, had it written in the Torah, ‘Now the manna was like coriander seed, etc.’ As if to say, ‘See, you who come into the world, what My children complain about. Yet the manna is so valued.’” (Rashi)

Rashi explains that in response to the complaint of the Jews that they have nothing to look forward to but the manna, Hashem wrote in the Torah a description of how wonderful the manna was as if to say, “Look, inhabitants of the world, at what my children are complaining about.” Rav Pam notes that although we don’t merit to hear it, a Divine voice expressing frustration over the things we complain about still goes out regularly. We live in a time of unprecedented freedom and material bounty, and we are surrounded by a society which influences us to believe that we are entitled to immediate gratification, to have everything we want, when and exactly how we want it. If we would only step back and view our lives with the proper perspective, we would be so overwhelmed by the blessings we enjoy that there would be no room to complain about trivialities.

Every time that a husband comes home to a messy house, filled with children’s toys and dirty clothes, and once again berates his wife over her inability to keep their house clean, a Heavenly voice challenges, “How many families would do anything to have children and would gladly clean up the mess that accompanies them, and here is somebody who has been blessed with healthy children and is upset that they make his house disorderly? Where are his priorities?” When a husband or a child complains about eating the same supper for the 3rd consecutive night, Hashem can’t help but point out how many poverty-stricken families would do anything to eat this dinner every night for a year, if only to enjoy a nutritional and filling repast. Every time that the parents of the bride and groom quarrel over petty wedding-related issues such as who will walk which child down to the chuppa, a Bas

Kol wonders how many parents will cry themselves to sleep that evening over their inability to find a proper match for their aging son or daughter, and who would gladly accede to any terms the other side would set ... if only there would be another side. The next time we find ourselves upset about issues which are objectively nothing more than nuisances and minor inconveniences, let us remember the lesson of the manna and open our ears to hear Hashem’s response to our complaints.

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Two Silver Trumpets

Chapter 10 in Parshas Beha'aloscha begins with Hashem’s command to Moshe to “Make for yourself two silver trumpets...and they shall be yours for the summoning of the assembly and to cause the camps to journey...” (Bamidbar 10:2). These trumpets were for Moshe’s exclusive use; he had the status of a king in whose honor trumpets are sounded. The trumpets were hidden just before Moshe’s death; even Yehoshua, his successor, was not permitted to use them (Rashi). Moshe was commanded to sound the trumpets for various occasions: to assemble the leaders or to summon the entire nation, to signal the time to break camp, to celebrate the Festivals and Rosh Chodesh, and to alert the nation to prepare to wage war. Each one required a different series of blasts of the trumpets, which are referred to here as a long blast (*tekiah*) and a short blast (*teruah*), the same type of blasts that are sounded from the shofar on Rosh Hashana. The Sages derived from here the halacha that when the trumpets were sounded, a long straight *tekiah*-blast was to be sounded first, followed by the choppy *teruah* sound, and followed again by the straight *tekiah*-blast. This, too, say the Sages, is the way that we are to sound the shofar on Rosh Hashana – *tekiah - teruah - tekiah*, these verses being the Torah source for our practice (Malbim).

The Malbim writes: “These verses describe trumpets made out of silver; if we scratch their surface, however, we will find nuggets of gold, teaching us important lessons about the sounding of the shofar that we are commanded to perform on the Day of Judgment, a day when all people of the world pass before Hashem like sheep in single file. The Sages teach that ‘trumpet’ (*chatzotzrah*) is another word for ‘shofar’ (Shabbos 31b), and they compared the laws of shofar of Rosh Hashana to the laws of the trumpets referred to in these verses.”

This concept that the trumpet blasts described in our parsha are directly related to the shofar blasts of Rosh Hashana is alluded to by the pasuk, “The sons of Aharon...shall

sound the trumpets, and it shall be for you an *eternal decree* for your generations” (ibid. 10:8). As Rashi mentioned above, the two silver trumpets were hidden away right before Moshe’s death, so the Torah is clearly alluding to something more eternal; the Sages identify this as Rosh Hashana.

The *tekiah* and *teruah* are two distinctly different sounds, each conveying a different message. The Malbim writes that these two sounds represent the two paths that can arouse one to reflect upon his actions and to return to the ways of the Torah through *teshuvah*. One path is through the fear of punishment, by realizing that harsh ramifications await those who foolishly refuse to wake up and examine their ways. The sound of the *teruah* is a series of broken sounds, like a wailing cry, and comes to arouse alarm and fear of the impending judgment, and of the punishment that follows. The other path is to become ever more aware of Hashem’s greatness and exaltedness, leading to the love and awe of Hashem, causing one to fully subjugate himself to Him. The long, uninterrupted sound of the *tekiah* conveys happiness, and was therefore the sound blown when a new king was coronated, or when the king visited the people. Thus, the sound of *tekiah* arouses one to *teshuvah* through recognizing Hashem’s *malchus*.

As the Rambam states, the sound of the shofar on Rosh Hashana is like a bugle blowing reveille for a slumbering soul, saying, “Wake up, you sleepers, from your sleep, and you slumberers, rouse yourselves from your slumber and return to G-d” (Overview-Artscroll Rosh Hashana Machzor). Just as Moshe’s silver trumpets were used to blow *tekiah* and *teruah* to arouse the people to come together to perform a specific task in the *midbar*, so, too, we blow *tekiah* and *teruah* with the shofar today to arouse the people to do *teshuvah* every year on Rosh Hashana.

“When you go to wage war in your Land against the *enemy who oppresses you*, you shall sound short blasts (*teruah*) of the trumpets... and you shall be saved from your foes” (ibid. 10:9). On this pasuk, the Malbim suggests that “the enemy who oppresses you” refers to the *yetzer hara*, the evil inclination; “you shall sound *teruah*-blasts,” arouses one to repent out of fear of retribution. Hashem will then give us Divine assistance so we can rise to higher levels, to realize His greatness and be prepared to serve Him with love and joy. Then, we “shall sound the *tekiah* upon the trumpets,” and our *teshuvah* will reach the higher levels of love and awe. Although *teshuvah* out of fear is a lower level, it is still *teshuvah*, and worthy of Hashem’s mercy and forgiveness. After doing *teshuvah* out of fear, the repentant will most likely become inspired to strive for the higher levels of love and awe. It is then that Hashem will *save us* from our ultimate foe- the *yetzer hara*, and grant forgiveness and atonement.

May we all be zoche to hear the blasts of the *chatzotzros* in the time of Moshiach. A gutten Shabbos.
