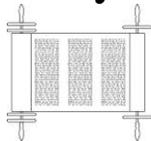

## The Weekly Parsha



### Parshas Korach By Rabbi Ozer Alport

**“To the sons of Levi, behold! I have given every tithe in Israel...for the service that they perform, the service of the Tent of Meeting (18:21)**

The Torah stresses that the Levites should have no portion or inheritance in the land of Israel. In lieu of a share in the land, Hashem rewarded them with the agricultural tithes that the other Jews were obligated to give to them in exchange for the Divine service that they performed in the Temple.

The Mishnah (Taanis 4:2) teaches that the Levites were divided into 24 groups known as “*mishmaros*.” Each week, one group would serve on behalf of the others, and they had a 24-week rotation with a new group working each week. Each of the *mishmaros* was further subdivided such that its members only worked on one day of the week in which their turn fell. If each individual Levite worked only one day every 24 weeks, which comes out to two days annually, why couldn’t they receive a portion in the land of Israel which they could work to support themselves like the other tribes, and ascend to work in the Temple at their designated times?

The Meshech Chochmah answers that this question is predicated on our inability to appreciate the tremendous sanctity and holiness which was required to work in the Beis HaMikdash, the place where Hashem’s Presence continuously rested and was palpable. Serving Him in such a holy place couldn’t be done in the haphazard manner in which many people perform their jobs. The *kedusha* of the Temple left no room for errors or distractions. As such, it required six months of preparation and working on himself for a Levite to reach the level of piety and sanctity necessary for him to serve properly in Hashem’s Presence for 24 hours.

## Blossoms and Almonds

After the supernatural deaths of Korach, Dasan and Aviram, and 250 of their loyal followers, the Torah relates that the entire

assembly of the Bnei Yisroel revolted against Moshe and Aharon, saying, “You have killed the people of Hashem!” (Bamidbar 17:6). This display of civil unrest brought outrage to Hashem, and He proclaimed to Moshe and Aharon, “Remove yourselves from this assembly and I shall destroy them in an instant!” (ibid. 17:10). Following Moshe’s command to his brother, Aharon rushed out to the camp with a fire pan and incense to provide atonement for the people, for “the fury had gone out from the presence of Hashem, and the plague had begun” (ibid. 17:11). Aharon was successful in bringing an end to the plague, but once it was over, the Torah states, “Those who died in the plague were fourteen-thousand, seven-hundred” (ibid. 17:14).

Immediately following this episode, Hashem commands Moshe to take a staff from the leader of each tribe and “each man’s name shall you inscribe on his staff. And the name of Aharon shall you inscribe on the staff of Levi...” (ibid. 17:17-18). To conclusively establish that Aharon was chosen by the Almighty to serve as Kohen Gadol, Hashem miraculously caused Aharon’s staff to blossom. The Midrash states, “In order to forestall possible claims that one staff contained more moisture than the rest, and therefore blossomed, Moshe cut twelve identical staffs from one big log. He then commanded each *nasi* to mark his name on one” (Bamidbar Rabbah). Moshe then took the twelve staffs and placed them in the *Ohel Moed*, with Aharon’s staff placed directly in the middle of the others. Rashi states, according to the Midrash, that Moshe did so with Aharon’s staff so no one should assert, “Aharon’s staff sprouted because it rested on the side that is closer to the *Shechina*.” The Torah then states: “On the next day, Moshe came...and behold! the staff of Aharon...had blossomed; it brought forth a blossom, sprouted a bud and almonds ripened” (ibid. 17:23).

In his sefer *Darash Moshe*, HaRav Moshe Feinstein, zt”l, asks why the need for the additional miracle of having a blossom, a bud, and a ripened almond remain on Aharon’s staff? He answers his own question with the following thought: “Perhaps Hashem intended to demonstrate that the blossoms of sanctity do not disintegrate. The fruit of the mitzvah is the performance of the mitzvah itself, and the blossoms are the preparations leading up to it. From here we learn that even the blossoms remain forever, for all the toil and pain that a person must endure in order to fulfill a mitzvah and learn Torah remain with him; the preparation which goes into the performance of a mitzvah will forever endure. The blossoms are the means by which the fruit can grow, and they symbolize the preparation to ensure that the ultimate aim, the performance of the mitzvah, is realized. The blossoms, these

preparations for Torah study and mitzvah observance, are never lost, and reward is paid for all of them.”

The Midrash states that after the entire series of signs and miracles of Aharon’s staff, all the Bnei Yisroel were convinced that Moshe’s prophecy was true in all details. “Aharon’s staff never withered; its stem, blossoms and almonds remained evergreen. Hashem commanded Moshe to place it near the Aron as testimony for future generations that, from all the tribes, Levi was chosen for *Kahunah* and service in the Mishkan (and Bais HaMikdash). The Jewish kings were entrusted with preserving Aharon’s staff, and before the destruction of the first Bais HaMikdash, King Yoshiyahu concealed it together with the other holy vessels” (Bamidbar Rabbah).

Reb Moshe adds: “The toil in Torah and mitzvos is itself good fortune for a person. For this reason, the blossoms and unripe fruit remained with the ripe almonds on Aharon’s staff, for they were all holy. This miracle transpired because Aharon merited the *Kahunah* by dint of his deed, for in all his toil and his work, there was nothing superfluous or wasteful. The same holds true for all who study the Torah. The actions they perform to enable them to learn Torah and perform mitzvos are blossoms, and they too will endure forever.”

R’ Tarfon writes in the Mishnah: “If you have studied much Torah, they give you great reward” (Avos 2:21). HaChassid Yaavetz states that it is not knowledge for which one is rewarded -- it is the effort exerted in its pursuit that elicits G-d’s magnanimity. One is rewarded in accordance with his efforts. Unlike other tasks, where incomplete work is worthless, spiritual challenges which are even partially met are deserving of reward (Artscroll Pirkei Avos Treasury). A gutten Shabbos.
