**Davening with the Shul Minyan:** Come join the TY Minyanaires for weekday and Shabbos davening and give our minyan a boost.


**Attending a Shiur:** What do you want to learn? We will be asking for your input and suggestions to offer compelling shiurim.

## The Weekly Parsha



### Parshas Korach

**“To the sons of Levi... I have given every tithe in Israel as a heritage in exchange for the service that they perform... of the Tent of Meeting” (18:21)**

The Torah stresses that the Levi'im should have no portion or inheritance in the land of Israel. In lieu of a share in the land, Hashem rewarded them with the agricultural tithes that the other Jews were obligated to give to them in exchange for the Divine service that they performed in the Temple.

The Mishnah (Taanis 4:2) teaches that the Levi'im were divided into 24 groups known as *mishmaros*. Each week, one group would serve on behalf of the others, and they had a 24-week rotation with a new group working each week. Each of the *mishmaros* was further subdivided such that its members only worked on one day of the week in which their turn fell. If each individual Levi worked only one day every 24 weeks, which comes out to two days annually, why couldn't they receive a portion in the land of Israel which they could work to support themselves like the other tribes, and ascend to work in the Temple at their designated times?

The Meshech Chochmah answers that this question is predicated on our inability to appreciate the tremendous sanctity and holiness which was required to work in the Beis HaMikdash, where Hashem's Presence continuously rested and was palpable. Serving Him in such a holy place could not be done in the haphazard manner in which many people perform their jobs. The *kedushah* of the Temple left no room for errors or distractions. As such, it required six months of preparation and working on himself for a Levi to reach the level of piety necessary for him to serve properly in Hashem's presence for 24 hours!

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### Turning Sixty

This Shabbos has a special significance as we are zoche to celebrate the 60<sup>th</sup> birthday of our beloved Rav, Rabbi Goldberger. The

Mishnah (Avos 5:25) teaches that “a sixty-year-old attains seniority,” referring to the intellectual maturity that is gained at this age. The Gemara (Kiddushin 32b) states that the word קִנְיָה is a contraction of הֵא קִנְיָה, *this [person] has acquired [wisdom]* (Tiferes Yisroel). The age of sixty is a significant milestone, for one who lives past sixty has avoided the Heavenly punishment of a premature death (see Moed Kattan 28a). It was for this reason, as stated in the Gemara (ibid.), that R' Yosef made a party for his colleagues when he turned sixty (Artscroll Pirkei Avos).

The number sixty is represented in the Aleph-Beis by the letter Samech, ס. In his sefer, *The Wisdom in the Aleph-Beis*, R' Michael Munk writes: “The ס, a closed round letter, represents the idea of Divine סִמְךָ, support, both in the active sense that G-d provides support to man and in the passive sense that man relies on Him. Man's confident reliance in G-d's support is a mainstay of Jewish belief; it is fundamental to man's mission on earth as the final words of Koheles make clear. There, Shlomo HaMelech summarizes all his teachings with the words סוּם דְּבַר, *the sum of the matter*. He teaches that this ‘sum’ is to fear Hashem and to adhere to His laws (12:13). The word סוּם is written with an enlarged ס to emphasize the fundamental requirement of reliance on G-d's support (Osios R' Akiva).

I find it most appropriate to apply this concept of **support** to the role that Rabbi Goldberger plays as our dear friend and spiritual leader. I believe that none of us here could honestly say that without the love and support of the Rabbi (and Rebbetzin), we would be able to reach the place in life where we now stand, as individuals and as members of this kehillah. Through all of life's trials and tribulations, the good as well as the bad, each of us can be assured that just as we can always rely on Hashem, so, too, can we rely on Rabbi Goldberger to be there with us to offer his guidance and support. The Rabbi's love for Yiddishkeit and all Jewish people, as well as his *yiras shamayim* and *avodas Hashem*, is truly an inspiration for us all and a reflection of his great leadership. For this, we are eternally grateful, and look forward to many more years of sharing our lives together with him. On behalf of the entire kehillah, I would like to wish Rabbi Goldberger a very happy birthday. May Hashem continue to bless him with all good things – health, wealth, happiness and success, in both the physical and the spiritual.

### How Did Korach Die?

This week's parsha tells the story of Korach and his rebellion against Moshe and Aharon (and, ultimately, against Hashem). *Chazal* agree that Korach died as a result of his brazenness in challenging Moshe's authority and for causing *machlokes* amongst klal

Yisroel; however, the exact cause of his death is of major dispute among the *meforshim*. As the Torah states, Hashem exacted two miraculous punishments upon the followers of Korach who participated in the rebellion: He brought down a fire from *Shamayim* that consumed two hundred and fifty men outside the Ohel Moed, and He opened up the earth and swallowed Dasan and Aviram and all of their possessions, including their tents and their entire families. Yet Korach's name does not specifically appear in either of these two incidents.

There are four opinions that I learned as to how Korach died. The popular opinion, as brought by the Ibn Ezra, is that Korach was swallowed by the ground and descended alive down to *Gehinnom* along with Dasan and Aviram. The Midrash describes how those who descended were heard screaming their confession, “Hashem is righteous; His judgment truthful; the words of His servant Moshe are true; and we are *reshaim* for having rebelled against him” (R' Bachye). The Gemara (Sanhedrin 110a) states: “Rabbi Yochanan says: Korach was neither among the swallowed nor among the burned; he died in a plague. He was neither among the swallowed, as it is written: ‘And the earth opened its mouth and swallowed them and their houses and all the men who were with Korach’ (Bamidbar 16:32), from which it is inferred: but not Korach himself. Nor was he among the burned, as it is written: ‘When the fire consumed two hundred and fifty men (ibid. 26:10), but not Korach.’ The Gemara continues: “It was taught in a *baraisa*: Korach was among both the burned and among the swallowed. He was among the swallowed, as it is written: ‘And the earth opened its mouth and swallowed them with Korach’ (ibid. 26:10). He was among the burned, as it is written: ‘And fire came forth from Hashem and consumed the two-hundred and fifty men’ (ibid. 16:35), and Korach was with them.” The Midrash, following the *baraisa*, states that Korach was punished *middah-keneged-middah* - since he denied the veracity of the Torah [which speaks of heaven and earth], he was punished with “fire from heaven” and was “swallowed by the earth” (R' Bachye). The fourth opinion, in line with that of Rabbi Yochanan, is that Korach died in the plague that killed the 14,700 men (ibid. 17:14).

“Rabbi Elazar HaKappar said: Jealousy, lust and glory remove a man from the world” (Avos 4:28). Korach was guilty of possessing all three of these poor *middos*, and was removed from the world, as it is said, “A man with such reprehensible qualities will inevitably lose his faith in the Torah and will attain neither intellectual nor ethical excellence; he will therefore be removed from the world (Rambam). According to other commentators, the “world” mentioned here refers to the World to Come. Thus, the person who is enslaved by

his own self-importance can never find the humility of heart to come before Hashem to offer repentance; therefore, jealousy and lust, compounded by glory, prevents one from finding a place in the World to Come (Yamin Moshe).

So Korach's death remains a mystery, but we can learn from his life the importance of distancing oneself from these three character traits, as well as *machlokes*. Rather, we should strive to emulate Moshe Rabbeinu and Aharon, and acquire the traits of extreme humility and shalom. A gutten Shabbos.
