Tuesday nights, we continue our shiur for men in the Malchus Shlomo at 8:15 pm with Rabbi Goldberger.


Wednesday nights, a shiur in Rabbeinu Bachya with Jay Taffel at 7 pm.

Weekly Parsha
Parshas Vayeitzei

“Such is not done in our place, to give the younger before the elder” (29:26)

A young yeshiva student was once in the house of the Tchebiner Rav. The Rav began to tell the young man about a certain girl whom the Rav believed would make a good match for him. At one point, while discussing the girl's family and her numerous strengths, the boy asked if it would be possible to see a picture of the girl before rendering a final decision about meeting her. Overhearing the conversation from the kitchen, the Tchebiner Rebbetzin demonstrated her quick mind and remarkably sharp wit in rebuking the boy for his suggestion by calling out, “*Lo yei'aseh kein binkomeinu laseis hatzeirah lifnei habechirah!*”

Literally, Lavan was defending his actions in switching his daughters under the chuppah against Yaakov's accusation of deceit by maintaining that the local custom was that the younger daughter may only get married after her older sister has been married off. However, saying the verse with the Rebbetzin's native Polish pronunciation (which is critical to the punch line), it can be reinterpreted to mean, “Our custom is that we don't give a picture (the Hebrew word for picture, *tzurah*, was pronounced by her the same as the word *tzeirah*, referring to the younger daughter) before you meet the girl (the word for a young girl, *bachurah*, is pronounced similarly to the word *bechirah*, which refers to the older daughter)”

**Two Roles, Two Sisters,
Two Wives**

In Parshas Vayeitzei, the Torah devotes three complete chapters (29-31) to the telling of the story of Yaakov and Lavan. The purpose of Yaakov's journey to Charan was to find a wife, as the verse states: “Arise, go to Paddan-aram... and take a wife from there from the daughters of Lavan, your mother's brother” (Bereishis 28:2). Upon his arrival in Charan, Yaakov meets Rochel [at a well!], and he

“kissed Rochel, and he raised his voice and wept” (ibid. 29:11). According to the Midrash, Yaakov wept because he foresaw that Rochel would not be buried with him in the Cave of Machpelah (Rashi). “Lavan had two daughters... the older one was Leah... the younger one was Rochel. Leah's eyes were tender... Rochel was beautiful of form and beautiful of appearance. Yaakov loved Rochel... he said [to Lavan], ‘I will work for you seven years, for Rochel, your younger daughter’” (ibid. 29:16-18). And so it was established that Yaakov would marry Rochel, but as we all know, sometimes things do not always go according to plan...

“And it was, in the morning, that behold it was Leah! So he [Yaakov] said to Lavan, ‘What is this you have done to me? Was it not for Rochel that I worked for you?’” (ibid. 29:25). Rashi explains this pasuk to mean that only in the morning did Yaakov realize that he had married Leah instead of Rochel: But at night Yaakov assumed that she was not Leah, because Yaakov had given signs to Rochel by which she could identify herself to him, but when she saw that they were taking Leah to him, she said, “Now my sister will be humiliated.” She therefore arose and gave her those signs. We see from this Rashi why Rochel allowed her father to deceive Yaakov, to spare her sister the humiliation of Lavan's trickery. But what remains unanswered is why Hashem allowed Lavan to swindle Yaakov into marrying Leah?

The Midrash states that when Yaakov confronted Leah in the morning, he made harsh accusations against her: The entire night he called her Rochel and she answered him. “Trickster, daughter of a trickster!” he later said to her. “Am I not a student of the book you wrote?” she answered. “When your father called you Eisav, did you not answer? So too, I answered when you called me Rochel” (Bereishis Rabbah 70:19). Rav Asher Weiss writes: “Lest we misinterpret this as a domestic quarrel regarding matters of dishonesty, we must pause to consider the reasons for Yaakov and Leah's deception. Yaakov posed as Eisav not in order to claim any worldly benefit for himself, but to ensure that the spiritual blessings of Heaven and earth would fall into the right hands, in order to ensure the destiny of the Jewish people as the heralds of Hashem's Torah. Without Yitzchak's blessings, Bnei Yisroel could not possibly endure the hardships of *Galus*.”

We see from this explanation why Yaakov was justified in deceiving his father, but what reason did Leah have? By comparing her deception to Yaakov's, Leah alluded to him that she did so with a similar intent. The Kozhnutzer Maggid and other Chassidic leaders explain that while Yaakov and Eisav were still in Rivka's womb, they had already divided this world and the World to Come between them (Rashi, Bereishis 25:22). Eisav

was to inherit this world with all its physical pleasures, while Yaakov was to inherit *Olam Haba*. Eisav, a “man of the field,” was inclined towards physicality, and spent his days enjoying the pleasures of the physical world. In contrast, Yaakov, a “wholesome man, abiding in tents,” was to devote his life to purely spiritual pursuits [mainly, the study and dissemination of Torah]. Had Eisav used his physical prowess to serve G-d, then he could have used Yitzchak's blessings to sanctify Hashem's Name in the physical world. However, Eisav used his inclination toward physicality to fulfill his lascivious desires, leaving Yaakov no choice but to assume both roles, the physical and the spiritual. Therefore, Yaakov took over Eisav's role, and the blessings for material wealth, “May G-d give you the dew of the heavens and the fatness of the earth, and abundant grain and wine” (Bereishis 27:28) were bestowed upon him. Rav Asher Weiss adds: “Had Eisav fulfilled his potential and utilized his physicality in Hashem's service, then Leah would have truly been his partner and his helpmate in this lofty endeavor. However, since this task ultimately fell upon Yaakov's shoulders, Leah became his destined bride alongside Rochel.”

Alternatively, the Midrash states that after their children were born, Lavan and Yitzchak arranged for the two firstborns, Eisav and Leah, to marry, and for Yaakov to marry Rochel. This is why, according to Rashi, that “Leah's eyes were tender,” (ibid. 29:16), for she was under the impression that she was destined to marry Eisav. The Midrash says that Leah poured out her heart to Hashem, entreating Him to let her become the wife of a tzaddik. While praying, she wept so much that her eyes become swollen. When Eisav sold his first-born status to Yaakov for a bowl of lentil stew (ibid. 25:31-34), he in essence sold his pre-arranged marriage to Leah along with it - therefore, Leah's fervent prayers were answered. The Kozhnutzer Maggid adds that when Yaakov said, “I am Eisav, your firstborn,” he spoke the truth. [The good aspects of Eisav's soul] were given over to Yaakov along with the birthright. At that moment, the Heavens appointed Leah as Yaakov's destined bride.

We now find an answer to our question: Hashem allowed Lavan to deceive Yaakov in order to fulfill his destiny as the father of the Jewish Nation, by marrying both sisters and assuming both the physical and spiritual roles. Michtav M'Elياهو explains the respective roles of the two sisters: Rochel was Yaakov's intended mate for this world, and Leah was his intended mate for the higher “spirit world.” Rochel was the wife of Yaakov and Leah was the wife of Yisroel – the name signifying his higher spiritual role of the future. It is illustrative of this concept that Rochel was the mother of Yosef, who would save his family

[and the world] from famine; Leah was the mother of Levi and Yehudah, the tribes of priesthood and the Davidic Messianic monarchy. Because his destiny was to become Yisroel, Yaakov had to marry Leah, and Hashem arranged for him to do so, notwithstanding his deep love for Rochel (Artscroll Stone Chumash). A gutten Shabbos.
