Wednesday nights, Rabbeinu Bachya on Bereishis after Maariv with Jay Taffel.


Thursday nights, "Parsha Preview," (with hot potato kugel) following Maariv.

Weekly Parsha
Parshas Pekudei
 By Rabbi Ozer Alport

“He brought the Aron into the Mishkan and emplaced the Partition sheltering the Aron... as Hashem had commanded Moshe” (40:21)

In his commentary on our verse, the Baal HaTurim points out that the Torah emphasizes that every aspect of the construction and assembly of the Mishkan was done precisely as Hashem commanded Moshe. In fact, the phrase “as Hashem commanded Moshe” is used 18 times in Parshas Pekudei. As there are no coincidences in the Torah, the Baal HaTurim explains that this number alludes to the 18 blessings recited thrice-daily in the prayers known as Shemoneh Esrei.

I once heard a beautiful and profound insight into the explanation of the Baal HaTurim. Hashem told Moshe (31:1-5) that Betzalel should be in charge of building the Mishkan and its vessels, for He had imbued him with Divine wisdom and with expert artistry and craftsmanship skills. We are accustomed to viewing artists as free-thinking and creative spirits, valuing self-expression over adherence to strict rules and guidelines. Since many of the specifications for the Mishkan weren't absolute and even numerous deviations wouldn't invalidate it, one might have expected Betzalel, with his “artistic spirit,” to improvise and attempt to “improve” upon Hashem's blueprint. Therefore, the Torah stresses that he followed each and every instruction down to the smallest detail.

Similarly, many people today complain that they feel constrained by the standard text of our daily prayers, which was established almost 2000 years ago. They feel that as our daily needs change, so too should our expression of them. However, based on the Baal HaTurim's comparison of the daily prayers to the construction of the Mishkan and its vessels, we may suggest that on a deeper level, he is hinting to us that we need not feel stifled by the repeated expression of our needs and entreaties using identical phrases, as illustrated by the following story.

A close disciple of Rav Yechezkel Abramsky once mentioned that an acquaintance of his had recently undergone a difficult kidney transplant. Rav Abramsky sighed, feeling the other Jew's pain, and then remarked, “I pray every day that I shouldn't be forced to undergo such a procedure.” The surprised student questioned why he made a

special point of reciting this unique prayer daily. Rav Abramsky responded that this request is included in the standard wording of Birkas HaMazon, in which we request that we not come to need *matnas basar va'dam* - gifts of flesh and blood (e.g. transplants).

The student challenged this explanation, as the simple understanding of the words is that we shouldn't need monetary gifts from other humans (“flesh and blood”). Rav Abramsky smiled and explained that the Sages incorporated every need we may have into the text of the standard prayers. Any special request we can read into the words of a prayer was included in the original intention of that prayer.

Just as Betzalel followed Hashem's precise guidelines for the creation of the Mishkan and still found room for creative expression by doing so with his own unique intentions and insights, so too our Sages established the standard wording of the prayers with Divine Inspiration, articulating within them every feeling we may wish to express. Many times, in the midst of a difficult situation, we begin the standard prayers with a heavy heart, only to find a new interpretation of the words which we have recited thousands of times jump out at us. This newfound understanding, which has been there all along waiting for us to discover it in our time of need, is perfectly fit to the sentiments we wish to convey, if we will only open our eyes to see it and use our Sages' foresight to express ourselves.

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The Silver Sockets

Parshas Pekudei begins with a computation of all the materials donated for use in the building of the Mishkan: “These are the reckonings of the Mishkan... The silver of the census of the community was one hundred talents... The hundred talents of silver were to cast the sockets of the Mishkan and the sockets of the Partition... a talent per socket” (Shemos 38: 21, 25, 27). This section of the Torah lists only the silver that was accumulated through the census whereby each adult Jewish male over the age of twenty donated a half-shekel (ibid 30:13). There were exactly forty-eight planks in the Mishkan, each plank requiring two sockets; the remaining four sockets supported the four pillars that held the Partition—certain in front of the Holy of Holies. The Ohr HaChaim notes that the Torah (ibid. 38:25) means to stress the miracle that there was absolutely no waste in casting the sockets; one talent of silver was allocated for each socket, and each socket weighed exactly a talent when it was completed. There were

exactly one hundred talents of silver collected by the census, and exactly one hundred silver sockets were cast for the Mishkan.

Rashi verifies this precise computation by explaining the half-shekel donations in straight mathematical terms based on the verse: “...a half-shekel in the sacred shekel for everyone who passed through the census takers, from twenty years of age and up, for the six hundred three thousand, five hundred and fifty (ibid. 38:26). Rashi writes: “Six hundred thousand half-shekalim are three hundred thousand whole shekalim. At the rate of three thousand shekalim per kikar, this is one hundred kikar. [The three thousand five hundred and fifty half-shekalim which were collected in addition to the six hundred thousand already accounted for come to one thousand seven hundred and seventy-five shekalim, the number mentioned at the end of verse 25, from which the silver was used to make the hooks for the pillars] (ibid. 38:28).”

HaRav Moshe Feinstein adds the following thought: “It is noteworthy that each and every Jew donated a uniform half-shekel for the sockets, no more and no less. To understand this, we can say that the sockets, upon which the entire structure of the Mishkan rested, symbolized the *emunah* of the Jews, the foundation upon which the Mishkan was built. When it comes to *emunah*, all Jews must be on an equal footing, for anyone whose faith is deficient cannot possibly bring into his home the *kedushah* that must reside in a genuine Torah home. His good deeds will be faulted, as will the upbringing he gives his children and descendants, and his other activities. Therefore, each of us must strive to strengthen his own faith and that of those around him, for only when our faith is complete, is it possible to talk of performing any of the mitzvos properly. Perhaps this is the meaning of the Sages' saying (Makkos 24a) that the prophet Habakkuk came and placed them [the mitzvos] on one mitzvah; a *tzaddik* lives on his faith. Only someone who is solid in his faith can be a *tzaddik*, for unless one's performance of mitzvos is based on the strong faith that the same G-d Who created the world and everything in it also commanded us to do the mitzvos, then the mitzvos he does will have no lasting value.”

With Purim rapidly approaching, it is interesting to note that a connection to our verse can be found in the Megilla: “If it pleases the king, let it be recorded that they be destroyed; and I will pay ten thousand silver talents into the hands of those who perform the duties” (Megillas Esther 3:9). According to the Targum, Haman offered to pay ten thousand silver talents for the destruction of the Jewish people in order to “undo” the merit of the half-shekels that were donated for the silver sockets of the Mishkan (Tosafos, Megilla 16a). But the wicked Haman was deficient in his thinking,

for the Jewish people brought the half-shekel as a donation with the *kavanah* of making a *Kiddush Hashem* through *teshuvah* with the building of the Mishkan; Haman, however, was willing to use his donation for *rishus*, and in the end, all that silver ultimately fell into the hands of Esther and the Jewish people.

The Me'am Lo'ez writes: The king told Haman to "Keep the silver. Do as you wish with these people" (Megillas Esther 3:11). In a way, the king's words were prophetic. He literally said, "The silver (הַכֶּסֶף) shall be given to you (לְךָ). The gematria of הַכֶּסֶף is 165, the same as that for הָעֵץ, meaning the "tree" (or in this case, the "gallows"). The gematria of עֵץ is 50, the height of the gallows (ibid. 5:14) that Haman constructed to hang Mordechai. In a way, Achashverosh was saying, "Your gallows [from which you will be hanged] will be fifty cubits high." It seems that Mordechai's unwavering *emanah* and the merit of bringing the half-shekel for the Mishkan were both contributing factors to the miraculous salvation brought down in the story of Purim. May we be zoche ourselves to witness the ultimate salvation and Final Redemption of the Jewish people. A gutten Shabbos.
