

Weekly Parsha**Parshas Ki Seitzei**

“It shall be when Hashem, your G-d, gives you rest from all your enemies all around,... you shall wipe out the memory of Amalek” (25:19)

The pasuk implies that the command to erase the memory of Amalek applies primarily after Klal Yisrael is settled and at ease, with no fear of its enemies. This is substantiated by Ibn Ezra. In the Talmud (Sanhedrin 20b), Chazal teach that the Jewish people were commanded to carry out three mitzvos when they arrived in Eretz Yisrael: inaugurate a king, destroy the descendants of Amalek, and build the Beis Hamikdash. We wonder why it is necessary to first establish monarchy before we set out to destroy Amalek? There were many battles imposed upon the Jewish people when they entered Eretz Yisrael, battles in which they were to inflict permanent damage upon every member of the seven nations. Why was there no prerequisite to establish kingship before going to war with these nations?

Horav Tuvia Lisitzen, zl, explains that the fear of Amalek's impact upon our nation is specifically when we are at rest. We are enjoined to remember when Amalek struck us. He came right after Krias Yam Suf, prior to Mattan Torah, when the Jewish people were at the apex of our spiritual development. We were on an incredible spiritual “high.” It was at a point when “the simple maidservant at the sea saw a greater revelation of the Almighty than what was seen by the great prophet Yechezkel.” The entire world feared and trembled from us. It was specifically at this unique time, at the zenith of our spiritual stature, that Amalek chose to attack. His goal was to “cool off” the water, to downplay Klal Yisrael's position, to make it easier for others to do the same.

Our greatest fear of Amalek is when there is peace and serenity, when calm and prosperity reign. That is when Amalek attacks. His goal is to shatter the calm, to demonstrate to others that Klal Yisrael can be taken. Furthermore, it is at such a time when we are at ease, that we tend to forget who our Protector is.

Likewise, when monarchy has been established and there is a symbol of power in conjunction with the throne, then there is greater reason to fear Amalek's incursion. His goal is to mitigate the fervor, to destroy the calm, to rally others against us. This is when

we are to see to it that his plan is not allowed to materialize.

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Fighting the Ultimate Enemy

Ki Seitzei begins with, “When you will go out to war against your enemies, and Hashem, your G-d, will deliver him into your hand...” (Devarim 21:10). Rashi describes, “When you will go to war” as an optional war; that is, wars other than those such as the war of the conquest of Eretz Canaan and the war against Amalek. Those wars were not optional, but rather fulfillments of G-d's commandments.

But this pasuk can also refer to a Jew's ongoing war with his *yetzer hara*. This war within each and every one of us is a constant struggle; the *yetzer hara* is a most ferocious enemy who never relents. He should never be underestimated -- he is a master of disguise, and knows how to mask illusions as reality and how to rationalize evil as good.

As we conclude the second week of Elul, we must strengthen our resolve and prepare a strategy to defeat this enemy. This is a time for deep introspection, and it's entirely up to each individual to determine what needs to be done to prepare ourselves for the Yomim Nora'im. As Hillel asks, “If I am not for myself, who will be for me? And if I am (only) for myself, what am I? And if not now, when?” (Avos 1:14). R' Yonah interprets this Mishnah as “expressing the advantage of self-motivation over external inducement or coercion.” If one is not properly motivated, no outsider can bring him to his maximum potential. Not to say that people cannot be motivated by others, but true change can only come from within. He adds that “if I am only for myself, what am I?” is a consequence of man's intrinsic inclination for evil, and offers the following parable: “A king told his sharecroppers that anything over thirty bushels was theirs to keep – but they were able to produce only five bushels. When the king questioned the small yield, they countered, ‘We worked diligently, but the field is inferior and can only yield five bushels.’ Similarly, man, inhibited spiritually by his *yetzer hara*, has a limited spiritual capability. Even with his free choice, his accomplishments will never attain the level his duties demand. Nevertheless, G-d rewards man for his efforts in combating these built-in limitations.” R' Yonah concludes: “Do not put off your spiritual pursuits for tomorrow on the assumption that you will have time then. You may find yourself as busy tomorrow as today. Furthermore, the spiritual progress you could have experienced today is irretrievable” (Artscroll Pirkei Avos Treasury). Bottom line: when it comes to mitzvah performance and

teshuvah, one should never put off until tomorrow what he can accomplish today.

The Ramchal describes the objective of the war against the *yetzer hara*: “Man serves G-d by observing all His commandments, and the root purpose of this service is to make man always conscious of G-d, and to turn him in His direction. The guiding principle is that man must realize that G-d created him only so that he could have the opportunity to draw himself “close” to his Creator, but this “closeness” becomes possible only if man overcomes his Evil Inclination, consciously deciding to subjugate himself to his Creator, and fulfill His commands. Man must reverse his inclination towards the physical, conquering his mundane tendencies, but he will be able to do so only if he manages all of his affairs only for the sake of attaining this goal, having no desire for anything else” (Derech Hashem 1:4:6).

The Ramchal then identifies the ultimate weapon that Hashem gave us to fight the *yetzer hara* and successfully achieve our purpose in this world: “G-d granted us one particular means which can bring man close to Him more than anything else. This is the study of His Revealed Torah...Through its reading and comprehension, man not only earns excellence and perfection for himself, but he also elevates and perfects the entire fabric of Creation. This is particularly true in the case of the study of the Torah” (ibid. 1:4:9).

We should strive to learn Torah with holiness and purity; to learn *b'simcha*, *b'yirah*, *b'ahava* and *l'shmah*, and with the proper kavana of fulfilling G-d's will, as we ask Him in the bracha of *Ahava Rabba* to “instill in our hearts to understand and elucidate, to listen, learn, teach, safeguard, perform and fulfill all the words of Your Torah's teaching with love.” The true goal is to learn Torah in order to serve G-d by living a Torah life, not merely for intellectual prowess.

R' Noach Weinberg writes: “The shofar is blowing; you are moving closer to *Yom HaDin*, the Day of Judgment. You are at war. The enemy is at the gate. Now is the time to fight the great battle against the *yetzer hara*.” May we all be zoche to successfully overcome our *yetzer hara*, and continue growing in our Torah learning, refining our *middos*, and improving our *avodas Hashem*. Teshuva and change must come from within, and now is the time to develop a battle plan. The *yetzer hara* is a most formidable enemy, and we must overcome his daily attempts to bring us down and transgress the Torah. It's Elul! - if not now, when? A gutten Shabbos.
