Chanukah Lights - The Ohr HaGanuz

It has been a long time since we have gotten together in full force. Thank G-d, our minyan is going well, as are our shiurim, both in the shul and on Zoom. We miss you and hope everyone is feeling well beH.

Chanukah is a time of great light. The Chassidishe Sefarim say that the "Ohr HaGanuz," the Hidden Light from the six days of Creation, shines through the lights of the menorah. Simply being in the presence of the menorah after it has been lit brings the light into our very own neshamos and personalities. Some have the *minhag* to stay with the candles for a half hour and say Tehillim and simply look at the lights. My Rebbi ztz"l, HaRav Shloime Twerski, used to say that looking at the menorah changes the way we see the

What do these holy teachings mean to us in a practical sense? I would like to suggest that it has to do with purpose. Living with purpose and living without purpose are two very different life experiences. Living with purpose elevates, energizes, and enables us to focus on what we are doing with our lives. Living without purpose is more like wading through life. How blessed we are that we have our Holy Torah through which we gain deep insight as to our purpose in life. At the same time, we get bogged down in day-to-day life and lose sight of our purpose as Jews. What is our purpose? One way to define it would be to bring Hashem's presence into our daily life and into the world through what we think, feel, say, and do. The bumps and bruises of life often bring about a loss of focus. How do we recapture that purpose?

Hashem delivered to us, through the Chachamim, the Chanukah lights. translates into an opportunity for us - an opportunity to regain the unique awareness of our purpose here in the world. Our mission is to light them, sing near them, daven near them, and experience the illumination they bring to us. Perhaps the Ohr HaGanuz embodies the original purpose Hashem had in mind for us when He created the world. It was hidden. We have to search for it. Perhaps, in Rabbi Twerski's words, the change in the way we see the world is in regaining the vision of our purpose. "Shivisi Hashem l'negdi tamid" -- "I place Hashem before me always." (The words of Dovid HaMelech). Any gain in that direction is positive and impactful, and it influences our full life involvement in the world.

I think that this year I'm going to be thinking about purpose when I sit by our candles, and I'll be hoping to walk away with a little more clarity than before. How about you? Wishing everyone a lichtig and a freilechen Chanukah.

The Sparks of Mashiach

There is a principle that the Torah does not necessarily follow a chronological order. In many of the parshios, there are events that take place that are seemingly out of order, or do not flow with the rest of the parsha. Occasionally there are verses, or even entire chapters, that do not seem to relate to the rest of the story, but if one searches and delves deeper, the connection can often be found. We find such a chapter in this week's parsha, Chapter 38, the story of Yehudah and Tamar.

Chapter 37 concludes with Yosef being sold by the Midianites to Potiphar, "a courtier of Paraoh, the Chamberlain of the Butchers" (Bereishis 37:36), and Chapter 38 begins with "It was at that time that Yehudah went down from his brothers and turned away toward an Adullamite man whose name was Hirah" (ibid. 38:1). Other than Yehudah being the one who suggested selling Yosef into slavery, there seems to be no connection to the two chapters. Rashi explains the juxtaposition as follows: "To teach you that Yehudah's brothers took him down from his greatness when they saw the distress of their father. They said, 'You said to sell him. Had you said to return him, we would have listened to you" (Tanchuma Yashan 8: Shemos Rabbah 42:3).

This entire chapter tells the story of Yehudah and Tamar, and the events that led up to the apparent illicit encounter that resulted in the birth of their twin boys, Peretz and Zerach. Chapter 39 picks up right where Chapter 37 left off with "And Yosef had been brought down to Mitzraim" (ibid. 39:1), as if the previous chapter had never interrupted the story of Yosef. I have always wondered why the Torah interjects this story of Yehudah and Tamar into the story of Yosef, and how, if at all, these two episodes were related. In order to try and resolve this matter, we need to take a look at two earlier pasukim from Sefer Bereishis.

In Parshas Lech Lecha, Hashem says to Avraham, "Know with certainty that your offspring shall be aliens in a land not their own -- and they will serve them, and they will oppress them – four hundred years... the nation that they will serve, I shall judge... afterwards they will leave with great wealth" (ibid. 15:13-14). In Parshas Vayeitzei, Hashem appears to Yaakov in his dream of the סלם and says, "Behold, I am with you; I will guard you wherever you go, and I will return you to this

soil; for I will not forsake you until I will have done what I have spoken" (ibid. 28:15). Hashem's promise to Avraham is an obvious allusion to the *galus* and servitude in Mitzraim. However, the promise to Yaakov seems more long-term; that Hashem will be with Yaakov (Klal Yisroel) until the "End of Days," when His promise will be fulfilled -- the Final Redemption and return to Eretz Yisroel, not merely the redemption from Mitzraim.

It seems to me that these two chapters are directly related to each other in the sense that they represent the two "bookends" of the entire history of the Jewish people! By placing these two chapters together, the Torah is teaching us that Hashem, in His Infinite Wisdom, was simultaneously setting into motion the beginning of the long galus for Bnei Yisroel, starting with Yosef being sold into slavery and going down to Mitzraim, and creating the sparks of the Mashiach, the Final Redeemer, through the union of Yehudah and Tamar.

Yehudah was merely acting as the agent of Hashem, and his "decision" to sell Yosef and seemingly inappropriate relationship with Tamar was all really a part of the Divine Plan: the fulfillment of Hashem's promise to Avraham and Yaakov, literally charting the course of history for the Jewish people. From the beginning, Yehudah was destined for greatness, proving himself to be zoche to leadership and Malchus. A gutten Shabbos.

Get to Know Your Shul Office

This is the first in a series of interviews with the people who perform the many different responsibilities of our shul office so you can get to know them and to find out what they do. If you ever need the shul office, you will know whom to contact!

Interview with Eileen Bailis Rosenbaum

Lev Echad: Eileen, you are part of the shul's volunteer office. Can you tell us a little bit about yourself?

Eileen: I grew up in Queens, NY. Most of that time in Bell Park Manor Terrace (garden apartments not too dissimilar to Pickwick or Cross-Country Manor). I attended public schools (elementary, middle and high school), Queens College and Columbia University. I received a bachelor's degree in Occupational Therapy and practiced OT for my entire working career. I met my husband Jerry at Columbia. After he graduated, we "traveled halfway around the world and back." We spent a year and a half in Scandinavia (Sweden and Denmark), before returning to the States (Newport News, and then Richmond, VA; Philadelphia, and finally Baltimore). Our two children were born in Virginia.

LE: How long have you been a part of the shul?

Eileen: We have been members of Tiferes Yisroel for about 25 years.

LE: How about telling the readers about your responsibilities as part of the shul office.

Eileen: I keep track of the shul calendar for events, i.e., rentals, and scheduling for shul events. When we have rentals, I send out the contracts, contact the Rabbi, and other volunteers so all are informed of upcoming events. I also enter the events onto the shul website calendar.

LE: That sounds important! But what is that like right now?

Eileen: Right now, there is little to do. Under normal circumstances, it is very variable from less than an hour a week to several hours in a day. It totally depends on how many people call for rentals.

LE: Just so we know for the future, under what circumstances would someone contact you?

Eileen: Anyone who wants to rent the shul for a kiddush, shalosh seudos, or a bris (or some other family simcha) should get in touch with me, as well as shul members who are scheduling events such as Sisterhood meetings, concerts, Shabbatons, or any other event. It is important to call to avoid conflicts. While the website calendar is generally up to date, tentative events will not be there (and I might not be able to get to putting it online right away).

LE: What would you say is the hardest part of your job?

Eileen: Negotiating scheduling conflicts (which, fortunately, are rare).

LE: And finally, what is the best part of your job, what gives you the most pleasure?

Eileen: Knowing that I am helping the shul is of great pleasure. It is always nice to hear of simchas that people are planning and would like to hold in the shul. And with the rentals,

we are raising money to help support Tiferes
