The Weekly Parsha



Parshas Vayakhel/Pekudei By Rabbi A. Leib Scheinbaum

"All the wise-hearted among you shall come and do all that Hashem commanded" (35:10)

The foundation-stone upon which Judaism rests is obedience. It is the principle which defines the individual's true commitment to Torah and mitzvos. This does not preclude the importance of using one's intelligence to understand the profundities of the Torah. In the final analysis, however, the Jew should be committed as a consequence of a sense of obedience and faith, not rationalization and scrutiny. "All the wise-hearted among you": How does one identify the truly "wisehearted?" - [those who] "do all that Hashem commanded." Hashem gave us mitzvos for our own benefit. We do not necessarily understand the inherent good in everything that He has told us to do. Nonetheless, we accept and do, executing Hashem's command obediently and without question. That is the definition of an observant Jew.

The first Jew to respond to Hashem with obedience was our Patriarch Avraham Avinu. Hashem called to him, and Avraham replied: Hineni, "Here I am, ready and prepared to do whatever You ask of me." This was the highest expression of obedience, of commitment and dedication to the Almighty. Yet, some individuals have had the audacity to refer to the method of observance displayed by the observant as nothing more than "doglike obedience." They have taken this greatest example of obedience, love and faith and transformed it into a mindless act. In the end Avraham was "supposedly" rejected, happy and finally at peace when the angel instructed him to halt the proceedings. These people grab at the opportunity to paint Avraham as the first reformer, rejecting human sacrifice, when Hashem asked him to sacrifice Yitzchok.

In his commentary to Bereishis 22:11, Horav S.R. Hirsch, zl, takes the individual who was one of the founders of secular Judaism to task for his mindless and blasphemous exegesis of the Akeidas Yitzchok. Clearly, one who studies our Chazal has a broader picture of the dialogue between Hashem and Avraham. Our Patriarch was acutely aware of what he was doing. Hashem commanded, and Avraham listened, responding immediately.

In a lecture to parents, Rav Hirsch searches for the primary reason why, at times, children sway to the left of their parents' teachings. He hypothesizes that children, who are very perceptive, can tell when their parents' own commitment is, at best, complacent. When these parents instruct their children to serve Hashem, they act only as compliant messengers, speaking in His Name, but not actually conveying the echo of the pulse of their own hearts. Children perceive when their parents do not consider the fulfillment of Hashem's will as the very foundation of their own happiness. Regrettably, parents often feel that it is enough to just ask that their children observe, demanding nothing else of them. They are wrong. Children who gravitate away sense a distinction between the manner in which their parents ask them to do their personal bidding and the manner in which that they ask them to obey Hashem.

Chazal teach us, *Asei retzono k'retzonecha*, "Make His will your own." In other words, do His will as you would your own. Indeed, your will should be His will. Your hopes and wishes should coincide with those of Hashem.

When we stood at Har Sinai and proclaimed, Na'aseh v'Nishma, "We will do and we will listen," we were elevated to become Hashem's nation. It was precisely this obedience that has established our position as the eternal nation. It raises us to the level of the ministering angels who do Hashem's bidding without question and without seeking reason. Through these words we became servants of the Supreme Master. Is that so bad? True human dignity is reflected in the ability to obey unconditionally and to maintain a sense of duty to a Higher Authority. Those who view Orthodoxy as a form of self-degradation rob themselves and others of the greatest moral freedom: the ability to serve the Almighty unequivocally and without question.

The Silver Sockets

Parshas Pekudei begins with a computation of all the materials donated for use in the building of the Mishkan: "These are the reckonings of the Mishkan... The silver of the census of the community was one hundred talents... The hundred talents of silver were to cast the sockets of the Mishkan and the sockets of the Partition... a talent per socket" (Shemos 38: 21, 25, 27). This section of the Torah lists only the silver that was accumulated through the census whereby each adult Jewish male over the age of twenty donated a half-shekel (ibid 30:13). There were exactly forty-eight planks in the Mishkan, each plank requiring two sockets; the remaining four sockets supported the four pillars that held the Partition-curtain in front of the Holy of Holies.

The Ohr HaChaim notes that the Torah (ibid. 38:25) means to stress the miracle that there was absolutely no waste in casting the sockets; one talent of silver was allocated for each socket, and each socket weighed exactly a talent when it was completed. There were exactly one hundred talents of silver collected by the census, and exactly one hundred silver sockets were cast for the Mishkan. *Gevaldig!*

Indeed, Rashi verifies this precise computation by explaining the half-shekel donations in straight mathematical terms based on the verse: "...a half-shekel in the sacred shekel for everyone who passed through the census takers, from twenty years of age and up, for the six hundred three thousand, five hundred and fifty (ibid. 38:26). Rashi writes: "Six hundred thousand half-shekalim are three hundred thousand whole shekalim. At the rate of three thousand shekalim per kikar, this is one hundred kikar. [The three thousand five hundred and fifty half-shekalim which were collected in addition to the six hundred thousand already accounted for come to one thousand seven hundred and seventy-five shekalim, the number mentioned at the end of verse 25, from which the silver was used to make the hooks for the pillars (ibid. 38:28)."

HaRav Moshe Feinstein adds the following thought: "It is noteworthy that each and every Jew donated a uniform half-shekel for the sockets, no more and no less. To understand this, we can say that the sockets, upon which the entire structure of the Mishkan rested, symbolized the emunah of the Jews, the foundation upon which the Mishkan was built. When it comes to *emunah*, all Jews must be on an equal footing, for anyone whose faith is deficient cannot possibly bring into his home the kedushah that must reside in a genuine Torah home. His good deeds will be faulted, as will the upbringing he gives his children and descendants, and his other activities. Therefore, each of us must strive to strengthen his own faith and that of those around him, for only when our faith is complete, is it possible to talk of performing any of the mitzvos properly. Perhaps this is the meaning of the Sages' saying (Makkos 24a) that the prophet Habakkuk came and placed them [the mitzvos] on one mitzvah; a tzaddik lives on his faith. Only someone who is solid in his faith can be a tzaddik, for unless one's performance of mitzvos is based on the strong faith that the same G-d Who created the world and everything in it also commanded us to do the mitzvos, then the mitzvos he does will have no lasting value."

Before Purim, we read Parshas Shekalim and Parshas Zachor; Zachor reminds us that the wicked Haman [the Agagite] descended from Amalek, and Shekalim connects our verse to the Megilla: "If it pleases the king, let it be recorded that they be destroyed; and I will pay ten thousand silver talents into the hands of

those who perform the duties" (Megillas Esther 3:9). According to the Targum, Haman offered to pay ten thousand silver talents for the destruction of the Jewish people in order to "undo" the merit of the half-shekels that were donated for the silver sockets of the Mishkan (Tosafos, Megilla 16a). But the wicked Haman was deficient in his thinking, for the Jewish people brought the half-shekel as a donation with the *kavanah* of making a *Kiddush Hashem* through *teshuvah* with the building of the Mishkan; Haman, however, was willing to use his donation for *rishus*, and in the end, all that silver ultimately fell into the hands of Esther, Mordechai and the Jewish people.

The Me'am Lo'ez writes: The king told Haman to "Keep the silver. Do as you wish with these people" (Megillas Esther 3:11). In a way, the king's words were prophetic. He literally said, "The silver (הבסף) shall be given to you (לד). The gematria of הכסף is 165, the same as that for העץ, meaning the "tree" (or in this case, the "gallows"). The gematria of לד is 50, the height [in cubits] of the gallows (ibid. 5:14) that Haman constructed to hang Mordechai. In a way, Achashverosh was saying, "Your gallows [from which you will be hanged] will be fifty cubits high." It seems that Mordechai's unwavering emanah and the merit of bringing the half-shekel for the Mishkan were both contributing factors to the miraculous salvation brought down in the story of Purim. A gutten Shabbos.

From this Week's Daf

"They said about R" Akiva that he would distribute to the children parched grain and walnuts on Pesach eve, so that they should not fall asleep and they should ask questions. It was taught in a Baraisa: R' Eliezer says: We snatch matzos of the night of Pesach on account of the children, so that they should not fall asleep. It was taught in a Baraisa: They said about R' Akiva that in all his days he never said, 'The time has come to stand up in the Study Hall and leave, other than on erev Pesach and erev Yom Kippur. On erev Pesach, he would halt the study session so that the children should not fall asleep at night. And on Yom Kippur, he would halt the study session so that they should feed their children." (Pesachim 109a).
