

Weekly Parsha**Parshas Shemos**

“She saw the basket among the reeds and she sent her maidservant and she took it. She opened it and saw him, the boy, and behold! ...She took pity on him and said, ‘this is one of the Hebrew boys.’” (2:5-6)

In eulogizing his beloved teacher Rav Moshe Feinstein, Rav Nissan Alpert observed that many people complained that Rav Moshe was so overly generous in writing *haskamos* (letters of approbation) for newly published books that they proved nothing and were essentially worthless. Rav Nissan suggested that Rav Moshe constantly acted based on his desire to do kindness and help another Jew rather than conducting himself according to the strict letter of the law. He therefore preferred to write approbations whenever possible without extensively analyzing the text to confirm its merit and value.

Rav Alpert likened this philosophy to that which was exemplified by Pharaoh's daughter. Upon descending to the river, she heard a crying infant and immediately went to assist him and remove him from the river. Only after acting with mercy and helping a baby in need did she pause to look at and identify the child as a Jewish infant.

When approached for a charitable contribution or to assist with our time, how many times do we first look over the beggar or analyze the worthiness of the organization and turn them away empty-handed due to a lack of perceived merits? Let us learn from the ways of Pharaoh's daughter and Rav Moshe Feinstein that we should act first and foremost with kindness without extensive analysis of the recipient's merit. This should arouse Hashem to reciprocate by similarly treating us with compassion without an in-depth examination of our merits.

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The Days of Shovavim

Sefer Shemos tells the grueling story of the birth of the Jewish nation – from the servitude and exodus from Mitzraim, to Matan Torah and

the redemption. It is brought down by our holy Sages and Kabbalists that Parshas Shemos marks the beginning of a very propitious time, an *עת רצון*, for klal Yisroel to focus on doing teshuvah, especially for the sins of immorality. This unbelievable and fortuitous period of time is referred to as *Shovavim*, an acronym for the first six parshios found in Sefer Shemos: Shemos, Va'eira, Bo, Beshalach, Yisro and Mishpatim. During a leap year [as it is this year], we add “Tat,” Terumah and Tetzaveh to make it *Shovavim-Tat*, making it a full two-month period of *עת רצון*. The word *שובבים* also appears in Tanach in the pasuk: “Return, O wayward (*שובבים*) sons, and I will heal your waywardness (*שובתיכם*)” (Yermiyahu 3:22). The reference to “wayward sons” teaches us that *שובבים* is symbolic of the teshuvah that one is exhorted to do during this six-week [or eight-week] period that we read these parshios. The kabbalists suggest that *Shovavim* is the time when one should be careful to do teshuvah, and especially in regards to transgressions relating to immorality. The teshuvah of *Shovavim* has many avenues. Some have the custom of studying the halachos relating to such transgressions. Some people fast [on Mondays and Thursdays] and give extra tzedakah. Some take upon themselves a *ta'anis dibbur* – a “fast of speech.” It is said that if one refrains from any and all superfluous speech [only speaking words of Torah and davening] for each Shabbos of *Shovavim*, he can achieve the highest levels of *tikkunim*, rectification of the soul.

The society of Mitzraim was completely degraded, and their culture was filled with rampant immorality and pleasure seeking; sorcery and black magic; and the most extreme forms of *avodah zarah*. Paroah himself claimed that he was G-d. All of these forces of evil created an atmosphere saturated with *chomer* and *tumah*, and the Bnei Yisroel had sunk down to the lowliest depths. The *Shovavim* tell the story of their journey up from the depths and out of Mitzraim to Matan Torah and their redemption. Each year, this period of time enables a Jew to cleanse himself through teshuvah for these particular sins, as we today struggle to release ourselves from the grips of an immoral culture. Like those in Mitzraim, we can use this *עת רצון* to raise ourselves up from the depths of our physicality, and try to elevate the physical to higher, spiritual levels. Rabbi Y.Y. Jacobson once explained that this is the sole purpose of the *neshama*, to affect the *guf* by elevating it to the *neshama*'s level of spirituality: “The lowlier the *guf*, the loftier the *neshama*.”

The Nesivos Shalom writes: “When a Jew is sunk in forty-nine levels of impurity and sees no way to extricate himself from his predicament, his redemption is through Shabbos and Hashem's great love for him. The Divrei Shmuel teaches that the greatest

rectification is through the Shabbosos of *Shovavim*. It is a time that is conducive to rectifying sins of immorality, since this part of the Torah describes the exodus from Mitzraim, the most immoral country in the world. Blemishes in matters of immorality are very deep and can be exceedingly difficult to repair, and need extra effort to rectify. Exalted teshuvah is when a Jew once again feels Hashem's great love for him, even if he himself feels that he is still in a lowly state. Shabbos is the rectification for such a blemish, for on this day a Jew is capable of reaching a deep feeling of the tremendous love Hashem has for him, and through this he can return to his roots like a newborn. This is also the concept of the period of *Shovavim*. At the time of the Exodus, the Jewish People could not be redeemed in a natural manner, but rather through their *Emunah*, which drew upon them the great love of Hashem. The way to merit this great love of Hashem is by believing in it, and with the power of this faith, we can merit the redemption.”

Teachings in Chassidus explain that the Ari HaKadosh revealed that the days of *Shovavim* are a period auspicious for *Teshuvah* and *Tikkun*. He explains: When the Yidden were in Mitzraim, the hard work imposed upon them was in order to lift up and gather all *Nitzotzos Hakedushah*, “holy sparks” that fell in the wrong places after the sin of Adam Harishon. Through the hard work and suffering, they [the Bnei Yisroel] lifted up most of it, but we still need to work on gathering the rest of the *Nitzotzos*. When they are all completely restored, Mashiach will come. Although they were not subjected to the harsh labor, the Levi'im did the work of lifting the *Nitzotzos* through their study of Torah and *Avodah*. The concept of *Nitzotzos* is contained in deep Kabbalistic teachings, and are in the domain of the people who are devoted to a life of high-level purity. The Seforim teach us what is relevant for us to know. With every sin, and even more with sins of *Kedushah*, *Nitzotzos* fall into the *Kelipos*. By learning Torah, doing mitzvos, and accepting suffering *b'ahavah*, we lift them out of their *Galus*.

I heard in a shiur by Rabbi Duvi Bensoussan in the name of Rav Shimshon M'astrapole that each year there is a two-month period of time, an eight-week *עת רצון* with incredible potential for teshuvah and re-connection to Hashem: Elul and Tishrei, through Selichos, Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, Sukkot, Hoshana Rabba and Shemini Atzeres. In case we somehow missed that opportunity, there is another “two-month *עת רצון*” period with the same unbelievable potential for teshuvah and re-connection to Hashem - *Shovavim* [in a leap year]. Rabbi Bensoussan emphasized the huge opportunity for incredible *tikkunim* during *Shovavim* every year, even when it lasts for only six weeks. Now is the time! The next eight

weeks of *Shovavim* provide an incredible opportunity to reach new levels of teshuvah and *tikkunim*. May we all be zoche that Hashem should pull each and every one of us up and out of our own "Mitzraim," and bring us to the Final Redemption. A gutten Shabbos.
