Weekly Parsha



Parshas Lech Lecha

"And there was quarreling between the herdsmen of Avram's livestock and the herdsmen of Lot's livestock... the Canaani and Perizi were then dwelling in the land" (12:7)

Rashi explains that Avraham and Lot were not quarreling; rather, their herdsmen were disagreeing with one another. Apparently, Lot's herdsmen lacked integrity, so that they would allow their sheep to graze in other people's pastures. They justified their nefarious actions with the notion that Hashem had promised the land to Avraham. Since the Patriarch had no direct heirs, the inheritance would go to his closest relative, Lot. Therefore, they had a claim to the land. This is why the Torah concludes this pasuk by emphasizing that the Canaani and Perizi were still in the land. Avraham had not yet become its legitimate owner.

The commentators, each in his own inimitable manner, explain why the pasuk ends with a reference to the pagan nations that continued to occupy the land. Sforno offers what I feel is a practical and timely response. He comments, "The quarrel between two relatives who were strangers in the land was odious in the eyes of the native dwellers who were led to believe that they were men who were prone to argument. This led them to assume that if they quarreled among themselves, how much more so would they dispute with the native dwellers? In other words, since they would be the minority living with a majority of pagans, they were exposing themselves to the contempt and eventual enmity of the land's inhabitants.

To put this exposition into perspective: Avraham was a true tzaddik, a very righteous person. While Lot was clearly not on Avraham's spiritual plateau, he was far from the average pagan. The two seemed to live in harmony. It was their herdsmen, their followers, who were embroiled in controversy. Perhaps their issues were very real, and they might have even been centered upon halachic interpretation, but why should the govim, gentiles, have to hear about it? Why should the outside world be privy to every machlokes, disagreement, within the Orthodox Jewish community? Furthermore, how are we to reach out to our own non-observant brethren when they see or hear some of the "goings- on" in the Orthodox Jewish community? This constitutes a gross *chillul Hashem*, desecration of Hashem's Name. We now understand what concerned Avraham. When the herdsmen quarrel, it does not remain simply between them. It becomes known outside the sheltered environs of our community, where it is exploited and publicized in the most derogatory manner. Regrettably, what concerned the Patriarch then still leaves reason for concern today.

Exile and Redemption

Parshas Lech Lecha tells the story of Avraham Avinu and Sarah Imeinu, the first Patriarch and Matriarch and progenitors of klal Yisroel. After Avraham's miraculous victory over the four kings, Hashem promises to make him and his descendants His eternal heritage, and establishes a ברית, a covenant, between Himself and Avraham, referred to by the Torah as the ברית בין הבתרים, the "Covenant Between the Parts." The new chapter begins: "The word of Hashem came to Avram in a vision, saying, 'Fear not, Avram, I am a shield for you; your reward is very great'... He [G-d] took him [Avraham] outside, and said, 'Gaze, now, toward the Heavens, and count the stars if you are able... So shall your offspring be!'... he trusted in Hashem, and He reckoned it to him as righteousness" (Bereishis 15:1-6).

Rashi states that G-d considered Avraham's faith as an act of righteousness; however, the Ramban understands this verse differently: Avraham's faith had been established so clearly and so often that his belief in G-d's promise now could hardly have been remarkable. Instead, he explains, it was Avraham who reckoned Hashem's promise of children as a manifestation of righteous kindness, for Hashem had made the promise unconditionally, without regard to Avraham's future merit (Artscroll Stone Chumash). To ratify His promise to Avraham, Hashem establishes the ברית בין הבתרים, which ends with a very cryptic pasuk: "Birds of prey descended upon the carcasses... Avram drove them away" (Bereishis 15:11).

The dark symbolism of this pasuk can be understood in different ways. Rashi states that Dovid HaMelech would seek to utterly destroy the enemy, but Hashem would "drive him away," pending the coming of Mashiach. The Radak says that the birds represented the enemy nations, which would try to abrogate the enemy nations, which would try to abrogate the statement of the enemy nations, which would try to abrogate the witnessing today with our very eyes), or as the Ramban notes, to prevent Israel from serving

G-d, but the Ramban adds that He [Hashem], or the descendants of Avraham, would "drive them away" (Artscroll Stone Chumash).

"As the sun was about to set, a deep sleep fell upon Avram; and behold – a dread! Great darkness fell upon him... He said to Avram, 'Know with certainty that your offspring shall be aliens in a land not their own – and they will serve them, and they will oppress them – four hundred years... the nation that they will serve, I shall judge, and afterwards they will leave with great wealth" (Bereishis 15:12-14). These three pasukim in the Torah are the foreshadowing of the exile and redemption from Mitzraim, but also allude to all future exiles leading up to the Final Redemption. The Radak states that Avraham was about to be told by G-d about the darkness and bitterness of exile, and Hashem symbolized those times to Avraham by casting sleep, dread, and darkness upon him. The Midrash finds in this pasuk an allusion to the four progressively intensifying subjugations under the Four Monarchies: "dread" represented Bavel; "darkness" was Media-Persia; "great darkness" was Greece [the Syrian-Greeks of Antiochus]; and "fell upon" was the crushing present exile initiated by Rome (Bereishis Rabbah 44:18). These four periods of exile would be conditional on Israel's deeds, and even if klal Yisroel would prove to be unworthy and these exiles would come about, they would occur centuries later, in the distant future. But, before then, Hashem now tells Avraham that there would be an exile that had to take place, and with this prophecy, the "wheels" for that exile had "begun to turn."

"Know with certainty that your offspring shall be aliens in a land not their own – and they will serve them, and they will oppress them – four hundred years... the nation that they will serve, I shall judge" (ibid. 15:13-14). The Ramban states that Hashem assured Avraham that "Just as I will cause your offspring to suffer, so will I punish the oppressors for the violence they will do to klal Yisroel. Rashi adds that the word "also" indicates that the Four Monarchies, which represent all the enemy nations that will persecute Israel throughout its history, will "also" not escape punishment for their cruelty.

We have witnessed the most horrific cruelty, brutal savagery and adroit wickedness; unspeakable atrocities and heinous war crimes beyond the scope of human logic and reason. Degradation with no semblance of acceptable human behavior whatsoever, yet the world remains silent — even offers justification! Just as Avraham was assured that G-d would bring retribution against the enemies of klal Yisroel, so too, the Navi expounds: "Thus said Hashem/Elokim: Behold, I am against you, Gog... I will lead you astray and seduce you... I will bring you upon the mountains of Israel. I will strike your bow... and cast down your arrows. You will fall upon the mountains of

Israel, you and all your cohorts and the peoples that are with you; I will give you to the bird of prey... and to the beast of the field as food. You will fall upon the open field... I will dispatch a fire against Magog... and they will know that I am Hashem. I will make My holy Name known among My people Israel... I will not desecrate My holy Name any longer; then the nations will know that I am Hashem, the Holy One in Israel. Behold, it is coming and it will happen - the word of Hashem/Elokim" (Yechezkel 39:1-8). The Navi concludes the chapter with the promise of redemption: "Now I will bring back the captivity of Yaakov and show mercy to the entire House of Israel and be zealous for My holy Name. They will bear their shame and all their betrayal that they committed against Me... and none will make [them] afraid, when I return them...and gather them in from the land of their enemies and I will become sanctified through them in the eyes of the many nations. Then they will know that I am Hashem, their G-d, for I have exiled them... and I will bring them to their land, and will not leave any of them there... for I will pour out My spirit upon the House of Israel - the word of the Lord Hashem/Elokim" (ibid. 39:25-29). May Hashem release our captives, heal those who were injured, and bring comfort to those who lost friends and family al kiddush Hashem. May He pour out His Wrath against our enemies and utterly destroy them, and bring Mashiach now! A gutten Shabbos.
