

The Weekly Parsha



Succos: Happiness Plus

As Succos approaches, there are several questions that don't quite make sense about this Chag. The basic understanding of the verse (Vaikra 23:42,43) as explained by Gemara in Succah (11b) is that we are commanded to commemorate that we lived in "Succos" in the desert referring to Annanei Hakavod (the Clouds of Glory that protected us in the desert) so too now we live in Sukkos nowadays. However, a number of questions remain:

There were a number of other miracles that happened on our way to the homeland as well, such as water flowing from the well of Miriam and manna that fell every morning. How come we commemorate only the Annanei Hakavod? Why don't we have a holiday called "Mayanot" and as part of the celebration we would drink water from the wells?!

Second, the holiday really should be in the month of Nissan, Pesach time, which is when the Clouds first appeared, upon the beginning of our journey in the desert, so why are we celebrating it on the 15th of Tishrei six months later?

Finally, Succos is called Zman Simchaseinu (Time of our Happiness) and, even though we are supposed to have simcha on all chagim here, according to the title of the chag, we have to go an extra step (Rambam Hil. Lulav 8:12). Why?

The Vilna Gaon (on Shir Hashirim 1:4) explains that we celebrate Succos in the month of Tishrei not because of the commemoration of the Ananei Hakavod themselves but rather their return on the 15th of Tishrei. Where did they go? Well, it all started when the Jews panicked, because they thought that Moshe died since he appeared to be taking a bit longer to get the luchos (tablets) when he went up to Har Sinai for 40 days after receiving the Torah (no "Jewish time" for him). Consumed by panic, people decided to build the golden calf. Now, of course, that was a miscalculation on their part and their failure to maintain commitment to the relationship with Hashem. Therefore, Hashem withdrew his presence from the Jewish people including the Ananei Hakavod. The story does have a good ending — at the beginning of the month of Elul Moshe went back up onto the mountain and after 40 days (which falls on Yom Kippur) he obtained forgiveness for the whole nation from

Hashem and brought down the new set of luchos. Right then, he was commanded to build the Mishkan (the Tabernacle). Five days later, all the materials were donated by the Jewish nation and on the 15th the building of the Mishkan began. At the commencement of the building the Ananei Hakavod returned reflecting the return of Hashem's presence among the Jewish nation. We were back on good terms with our Creator.

What is the extra Simcha on Succos about? Interestingly, the Mishkan represents the Chuppa of the "marriage" of the Klal Yisroel and Hashem. And just like the Chuppa represents the highest level simcha, of the beginning of a married relationship, so too does building of the Mishkan. We know that Jewish holidays are not simple historical commemorations. These are times that were created in the time-space reality of the world for eternity and we have a chance to tap into them every year with the same intensity as when these times were originally created. Therefore, having gone through Pesach — which was the time of the formation of our nation, Shavuot — receiving of the Torah, Rosh Hashanah — where we tapped into our individual and national purpose in this world in the service of the King, Yom Kippur — where we adjusted our course by doing Teshuvah, now on Succos we tap into the eternal connection and extra Simcha of knowing and feeling the love between us and Hashem.

We can also learn an eternal lesson from this. Every relationship starts with excitement of new connection and new opportunity. That is what happened with us at Pesach (leaving Egypt to serve God) and Shavuot (receiving the details of what the commitment is about). However, any relationship has its ups and downs. The true Simcha comes from knowing that both parties are committed to being with one another through thick and thin. Succos teaches us an invaluable lesson — whenever one is facing a challenge in his relationship (like what happened with the golden calf) whether it is with his friends, family, internally with himself, or even when one feels that Hashem is not there for him, he must remember to work on the relationship. This can be done by addressing issues in the proper way where the parties are open to taking responsibility for their feelings and actions and take time to understand one another, which will ultimately bring them much closer with an abundance of Simcha as their relationship moves to a new level of closeness. Chag Sameach!

YomTov. Included in this thank you are all of the unnamed mothers, fathers, siblings and grandparents who volunteer and assist as well as to Tiffany and her staff for their efforts on behalf of our children. Camp Shabbos and Camp Yom Tov are excellent value-added benefits for Tiferes Yisroel.

There are some ongoing challenges with Camp Yom Tov (and Camp Shabbos) that need to be addressed.

- Pilfering food from Camp Yom Tov/Shabbos by teenagers and adults: Please stop! Remind your teenagers that this is not OK. The food is clearly labeled for Camp Yom Tov/Shabbos and is intended for their consumption.
- Middos tovos and derech erez: All children must treat and speak with the adults associated with Camp Shabbos respectfully. Please remind your children about proper conduct and the importance of making a Kiddush HaShem (especially on Shabbos and Yom Tov).
- Visit your children and check in with them. Camp Shabbos is not a replacement for parental supervision and nurturing. Your visits encourage your child's positive behavior and encourage the staff to remain engaged with your child.
- If your child does not want to remain under the supervision of the Camp Shabbos staff and volunteers, they are the parents' responsibility. The staff is not responsible for your child. This is an occurrence you should talk about with your child and plan for.

Weekday Evening Classes with Rabbi Goldberger

Between mincha and maariv, Rabbi Goldberger teaches Hilchos Mezuzah from the Shulchan Aruch. After maariv, we learn Sfas Emes on the parsha. Join us also for the Bais Medrash learning program each weeknight after maariv.

Yizkor

In Yizkor, the souls of the departed are remembered in prayer to G-d and in monetary pledges to charity. It is founded upon the principle that a mitzvah of the living affects the souls of the deceased when performed in their memory.

The Midrash (Sifri: Shoftim) states that even departed souls require redemption. Redemption is brought about by means of charity as in the verse (Isaiah 1:27) "Zion shall be redeemed with judgment, and those who return to her with tzedakah."

In temple times, the souls of the righteous that were gathered in the spiritual Temple in heaven (which is not bound by material confines) would descend to the earthly Temple, blessing it with infinite properties.

Nowadays, when we no longer have a physical Temple to visit, we remember souls of the departed so that their merit should bless us too and stand us in good stead (Ta'amei Haminhagim p. 245).
