There are two times for candle lighting. The earlier time is Plag HaMincha (one and a quarter seasonal hours [Shaos Zemanios] before sunset [a seasonal hour is equal to one-twelfth of the total time from sunrise to sunset]) and is the earliest time to light candles. The later time is the regular candle lighting time and is 18 minutes before sunset, the latest time to light candles. If one wants to light candles when the shul accepts Shabbos, this is approximately 40 minutes after the start of Mincha.

## Memories of Karen Rosenfelt

It's easy to understand how a person with chronic illness can become discouraged and negative. We aren't surprised to hear a person who has suffered for many years complain or question why Hashem has given them a bitter fate. But how often do we see a chronically ill person who has used the experience to develop intense gratitude for each day of life?

Such was the case with my dear friend and neighbor Karen Rosenfelt a"h. Today we buried Karen. In addition to being born with a chronic lung condition, Karen battled cancer for many years. If she was in pain — and in retrospect I realize she must have been — I had no idea. Despite all the challenges and discomfort that surely accompanied her extensive medical treatments, I only knew Karen — not as an ill person — but as the most joyful person in my acquaintance. It may seem like a trite cliché, but it is simply the truth: I never heard Karen complain about her situation. Never. On the contrary, as she had far exceeded the doctor's predictions of her remaining time to live, she treasured each day as a separate and incredible gift. She was even childlike in her appreciation of everything around her.

The last time I had a long conversation with her, I pushed her in her wheelchair to meet Bob as he came home from shul Friday night. I had come to visit her, see if she needed any help — to give to her. But I was the one who did the receiving. She beamed and regaled me with all the things she appreciated. She's had such a wonderful life, she told me, a fabulous marriage, two wonderful sons both married to terrific wives, two beautiful granddaughters, one just born this year. And she delighted in our block: Wasn't it wonderful that there were such nice families living on the block, that everyone got along ... how she loved to see all the children playing. And wasn't it wonderful that an addition was being built onto one of the houses on the street into which would move a new family with more children.

While she gushed about the gift of life she had been granted, she also talked often and openly about her impending death. She said, "I know I don't have long to live. Each day that I'm alive is so wonderful." And she quipped, referring to the PBS series we both love, "But I sure hope I live to January to watch the new season of Downton Abbey!" And then she turned to praising me, detailing which features of my face she found most beautiful, how she loves my spirit, my sweet husband and adorable children, my wardrobe, my French onion soup, how from the first time she saw me, she had always wanted to get to know me and how happy she was that we were friends. I had to laugh out loud she

made me out to be the most beautiful, perfect and special person in the world. "You are the president of my fan club, Karen!" Boy, did she make people feel good.

Karen and I shared the same career, social work. When she first heard I was starting a private practice, she was delighted for me. She often asked how the practice was, what kind of clients I was seeing, how many clients, how I liked the office space, and so on. She was so caring and interested in others. She wasn't just making pleasant conversation, asking the expected questions and waiting politely for a perfunctory answer. She really wanted to share in my life, and clearly had nachas from her younger friend's career.

A few years ago, our whole shul had been davening fervently for Karen, Judy Ference a"h and Esther Nechama Margolese a"h, three amazing women who were all fighting cancer. Karen, Batsheva Goldman and I drove together to Judy's levaya (funeral). In the car Karen said "Well, I'm next!" Some may call this gallows humor. I don't. I call it emunah, complete trust in the goodness of Hashem. Karen knew her life would be cut short. But she was not afraid of death. She was at peace with her Creator. When it was her time, she would go, grateful to Hashem for all the gifts He had given her.

"Karen," I told her that beautiful Shabbos evening on her front porch, "you are an inspiration to us all. You may be the one who is dying, but you are the one who is teaching us all about life."

It was an honor to be Karen's friend. If I can cultivate just a bit of the Simchas haChayim (joie de vive), serenity and gratitude with which Karen overflowed, I will be a very lucky person indeed. I will miss you, Karen.

### Hospitality Initiative

"More than the calf wants to nurse, the cow wants to give milk." (Pesachim 112a)

Every week during shul announcements, we invite our guests for a Shabbos meal in our homes. Our Sages elaborate on the many deep reasons why this mitzvah is so important. Yet, sometimes it's just not possible. Other times, it is possible, and we would really love to host

a guest, but we can't because we haven't had a discussion with our spouse ahead of time.

We're now inviting you to "opt in" to our Shabbos hospitality reminder. The Shabbos hospitality reminder is simply an email sent to you every Thursday, B'N, which reminds you about hosting guests for Shabbos so you can discuss this with your spouse.

If you can host a guest, great! There will be a link in the body of the email which directs you to an online chart (asking for your name, number of guests, male or female, day or night). You are not signing up to host a guest, rather you are expressing your desire to host a guest. Since we will probably have more available hosts than guests, you shouldn't assume that you will have the opportunity to host.

If there are available guests, Hillel Zeitlin, or the person in charge of hospitality, would approach you after davening Friday evening or Shabbos day. If you are still able to host a guest, Hilly will make the arrangements with you. If something changed and you are no longer available, that's OK. And if you don't show up in Shul, then you shouldn't expect a guest at your door.

It's likely that you may sign up week after week but will not have the honor of hosting a guest. Please don't let that discourage you from saying yes whenever you can. Even though you may not host a guest, your good intentions are significant. This will only be successful if you sign up as often as you can.
