Portrait of a Rabbi

If you make a bid, you will be charged \$275 now, which will be applied to your bid if you win. If you do not win, you will receive a higher-numbered litho, prioritized according to the time you made your bid.

Our annual Chanuka Carnival will be on Sunday, December 21, from 1 to 3 pm in the shul Simcha Hall.



Jersey Shore Torah Bulletin

BE CAREFUL WHAT YOU ASK FOR

“Yitzhak entreated Hashem ... Hashem allowed Himself to be entreated by him, and his wife Ribkah conceived.” (Bereshheet 25:21)

Rashi explains that the implication of the masculine singular form lo, “by him,” is that Hashem responded specifically to Yitzhak Abinu’s prayer, as opposed to that of his wife, Ribkah Imenu. In addition, he explains that the root of the word, va’ye’etar, “and he entreated,” is the word atar, which denotes abundance. The sense of the pasuk is that Yitzhak prayed abundantly — every which way, in order to effect a positive response from the Almighty. Why was it necessary to pray so hard in every manner possible?

Rav Yosef Chaim Sonnenfeld, z”l, gives us a powerful — almost frightening — insight into the concept and efficacy of prayer and its far-reaching implications. Rashi teaches us that on the day that Esav went out l’tarbut ra’ah, left the fold and publicly displayed his true malevolent character, Abraham Abinu died. The Patriarch was originally supposed to live five more years — to age 180. He died prematurely, so that he should not be privy to the infamy wrought by his evil grandson. This means, explains Rav Yosef Chaim, that Yitzhak’s and Ribkah’s prayers had severe ramifications for the Patriarch. Had the prodigal twins been born five years later, Abraham could have lived out his entire pre-determined lifespan. Their prayer — if accepted — would be the indirect cause of Abraham’s premature demise. Frightening! We see now why Yitzhak had to pray with such fervor. He was not simply asking for a child. It was much more. He did not know this, but Hashem, Who knows all, was well aware of the difficulty of this decision.

What a powerful lesson for us. We all pray and, while Hashem certainly listens to each and every prayer, the reply is not always, in our limited perception, positive. Sometimes, the answer is “no!” We have difficulty understanding His ways, but, He has reasons for everything.

Rav Yosef Chaim adds that this idea is underscored in the pasuk in Ashrei — Retzon yere’av yaaseh, v’et shav’atam yishma v’yoshi’em, “The will of those who fear Him, He will do; and their cry He will hear, and save them.” This verse seems redundant. With the above, we understand that there are times when we ask for something which we ultimately might regret or which will

eventually cause us pain. The pasuk teaches us that Hashem listens twice — before and after — we ask for something. At first, it is good. Then we realize — or become aware — that the ramifications are not good. We pray again. He listens — once again. May our prayers be heard, and may we know for what to pray. (Peninim on the Torah)

NOTHING BUT THE TRUTH

“And Ya’akov said, ‘Sell this day your birthright to me.’” (Bereshheet 25:31)

The Midrash cites that Ya’akov resorted to self-sacrifice in order to attain the birthright from Esav. It continues to justify Ya’akov’s desire for the birthright. This seems puzzling, for we have no indication of self-sacrifice on Ya’akov’s part in order to gain the birthright. The Torah only mentions that Ya’akov was able to exact the birthright from Esav through cunning and guile. We may suggest that Ya’akov indeed displayed a magnificent sublime form of self-sacrifice. The attribute which characterized Ya’akov is emet (truth) and he excelled in it. For Ya’akov to resort to what seems to be subterfuge, even justifiably, goes against the very essence of his personality. His inability to act with complete veracity at that point is tantamount to the most supreme form of self-sacrifice. (Peninim on the Torah)

RABBI’S MESSAGE

“The man became great and kept becoming greater” (Bereshheet 26:13)

Yitzhak Abinu becomes fabulously wealthy. Rashi says that the Philistines who lived with Yitzhak said, “Better the dung (fertilizer) from Yitzhak’s mules than the silver and gold of Abimelech.” They said this because in the previous verse it says that when Yitzhak planted in the land, the yield was me’ah she’arim, one hundred fold more than normal. The gentiles were idolaters, and when they saw this tremendous abundance, they attributed this to Yitzhak having some miracle formulas. They thought he put it in the dung of his mules that was used to fertilize the land. Therefore they said that this dung was worth more than gold and silver.

They weren’t completely wrong. Yitzhak used these mules to dig his wells of water. These wells all provided precious water, an unusual feat. Many times wells are dug without success, but here they always hit water, which sanctified Hashem’s name. Since these mules were blessed, because they brought about the sanctification of Hashem’s name, their dung provided tremendous amounts of produce. The gentiles attributed the success to some miracle potion, but it wasn’t that at all. It was the spiritual greatness of Yitzhak.

Imagine today, if someone we know opens a store in a certain neighborhood. In a short

amount of time the store is a tremendous success. The store, always packed with customers, consistently sells all the goods that the owner puts in. You can bet that someone who notices this will open a store in that same neighborhood. That person figures it’s the great location, therefore he opens a store close by. That person is thinking like the Philistines. He attributes the success to some physical factor and wants to duplicate it. This shows a lack of understanding of the true source of blessing.

Whenever we see success try to find the merit that causes that success, instead of a talent. If we copy that merit, we can gain success too. Shabbat Shalom. Rabbi Reuven Semah
