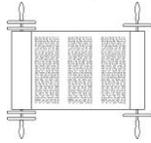

The Weekly Parsha



Chasidic Insights – Selections

Ch. 41, v. 1: “Va’y’hi mi’keitz shnosayim yomim u’Faroh choleim” — “Va’y’hi” is an expression of sorrow and pain, a phonetic “woe.” Woe to the person who at the end, “va’y’hi mi’keitz,” of his years and days, “shnosayim yomim” becomes disheveled and distressed, “u’Faroh” (as in “u’fora es rosh ho’ishoh”) (Bmidbar 5:18), and realizes that he has spent his life pursuing a dream, “choleim,” and not doing things of lasting value. (Rabbi Avrohom of Mikolayov)

Ch. 41, v. 1: “Va’y’hi mi’keitz shnosayim yomim u’Pharoh choleim” — Woe when at the end of one’s years and days it is discovered, “u’Pharoh” from the word form “poro’ah,” as in “u’fora es rosh” (Bmidbar 5:18), that life has passed by like a dream. (Rabbi Yisroel Dov Ber of Yashnitz in Dvir Hamutzna)

Ch. 41, v. 3, 4: “Olose acharei’hen ... vataamode’noh eitzel, Vatochalnoh” — The seven emaciated cows represent the evil inclination. They first rise against a person, “olose,” then stand right next to him, “vataamode’noh eitzel,” and then finally overpower and swallow him, “vatochalnoh.” (Sfas Emes)

Ch. 41, v. 14: “Va’y’ritzuhu min habore” — Through the merit of Yoseif’s considering himself “min habore,” of a lowly nature, he merited to “va’y’ritzuhu,” that they elevated him. (Degel Machaneh Efrayim)

Ch. 41, v. 16: “Va’yaan Yoseif” — Note Yoseif’s extreme humility. He interrupted Paroh and called out in a loud voice, “va’yaan,” that the wisdom of divining a dream was not to his credit, but rather a gift from Hashem. (Rabbi Moshe Yechiel of Ozhrov in B’eir Moshe)

Ch. 41, v. 16: “Bilodoy” — It is outside of me. I would prefer to be left out of this and have you deal directly with Hashem, “Elokim yaa’neh es shlome Paroh.” (Rabbi Simchah Bunim of Parshizcha)

Ch. 41, v. 36: “V’hoyoh” — “V’hoyoh,” and it will be a great joy if, “ho’ochel l’fikodone lo’oretz,” if a person realizes that his sustenance and wealth for his “artzius” existence are only given to him as a safekeeping, “l’sheva shnei horo’ov asher ti’h’ye’noh b’eretz Mitzyorim,” for the seven decades of years that a person suffers physical deprivation on earth, a place of limitations, “v’lo siko’reis ho’oretz boro’ov,” and he will not be cut off through hunger during his earthly existence, in the merit of realizing that one’s worldly possessions are his for

safekeeping only, and not his permanent possession. (Nirreh li)

Ch. 41, v. 38: “Ish asher ruach Elokim bo” — In spite of Yoseif’s external activity of styling his hair, “ruach Elokim BO,” internally the spirit of Hashem burns fiercely. (Rebbe R’ Bunim in Kole Simchah)

Ch. 41, v. 45: “Tzofnas Paa’nei’ach” — The base inclinations that are hidden deep inside a person were open and evident to Yoseif. (Rabbi Volf Strikiver in Zeir Zohov)

Ch. 41, v. 45: “Tzofnas Paa’nei’ach” — Yoseif was able to hide his greatness even when he was a viceroy and open to the scrutiny of the public. (Imrei Emes)

Ch. 41, v. 45: “Tzofnas Paa’nei’ach” — When elevated to the position of viceroy, it became clear to Yoseif why he had to go through tough times, when Hashem’s good was hidden from him. (Degel Machaneh Efrayim)

Ch. 41, v. 46: “Va’yeitzei Yoseif milifnei Faroh” — In spite of all the honours heaped upon Yoseif by Paroh who changed his name to Tzofnas Paa’nei’ach, an Egyptian name, he left the same Yoseif, unaffected by it all. (Rabbi Menachem Mendel of Deizsh in Maaglei Tzedek)

Ch. 41, v. 47: “Vataas ho’oretz ... likmotzim” — When involved with earthly activities, it should be “likmotzim,” with limitations. (Rabbi Chaim Cheikel of Amdur in Chaim Vochesed)

Ch. 41, v. 56: “Va’yiftach Yoseif es kol asher bo’hem” — Yoseif was the conduit for sustenance for the land. When hunger was felt he opened up the channels of provisions. (Rabbi Yaakov Yehudoh of Nad’r’zin in B’oho’lei Tzadikim)

For a limited time only, a beautiful pencil lithograph of Rabbi Goldberger, drawn by

Rabbi Hillel Shepard, will be available on a first-come, first-served basis on the shul’s website. The pencil drawing was inspired by a photograph of Rabbi Goldberger taken by Frank Storch, and, unbeknownst to the Rabbi, was created for him as a labor of love. Only 125 signed and numbered lithographs were printed. Proceeds from the sale of the lithographs will benefit the shul.

There will be two ways to obtain the lithographs. Higher numbered lithos (26-125) are a flat price of \$275. First-come, first-served for lower available numbers.

There will be a silent auction until December 21 for lower numbered lithos (6-25) with a minimum bid of \$400. The highest bids will receive the lowest numbers. Identical bids will be first-come, first-served at that level. For numbers below 6, or for more information, call Scott Parsowith at 410-591-9773 or email sparsowith@cclind.com.

If you make a bid, you will be charged \$275 now, which will be applied to your bid if you win. If you do not win, you will receive a higher-numbered litho, prioritized according to the time you made your bid.

For tax and maaser purposes, the value of each picture is \$175 with \$100 going to the shul. For silent bids greater than \$275, the value of each picture is two-thirds of the purchase price, with one-third going to the shul.

Focus on Chesed

A Man is Measured by How He Treats His Wife

A man's righteousness is measured by the way he treats his wife. If he is kind and considerate, he can be considered a tzaddik. If he is not, then he is lacking in chesed, and consequently, lacking in Torah. Our Sages say that Torah must go together with chesed. The reason for this is that the whole purpose of studying Torah is to make ourselves into more complete persons. When a fundamental trait, such as doing chesed for our fellow human beings, is missing, then something essential is lacking in our Torah learning.

Chesed starts at home. Where do you have a greater opportunity to do chesed than with your wife whom you see every day and who is so sensitive to your every word and gesture? You can do so much chesed with your wife just by saying a kind word, being considerate, or paying attention to her. Other people may not care or even notice what you say to them, but your spouse takes to heart every word you say.

Our Sages say that there are four things which need to be constantly strengthened. They are: Torah, good deeds, prayer, and derech eretz (proper manners and conduct). The Chofetz Chaim explains that good deeds means doing chesed for other people. If doing chesed for other people constantly needs to be strengthened, how much more so must doing chesed for one's own spouse, with whom one is likely to become overly casual and towards whom one may forget that he has an obligation to always be kind, need strengthening? When you encounter someone only once in a while, you are usually on your best behavior, but this is not so when you see the same person every day. Being kind and considerate to the person closest to you, since it does not come naturally, requires great effort and must be worked on constantly.

Doing chesed is what G-d wants from us, as it is written, "[He] tells you, O man, what is good and what G-d wants from you: to be righteous in judgment and to love chesed." The prophet teaches us here that part of the essence of Torah is the love of chesed. It is therefore implicit that performing acts of chesed is a fundamental way we can fulfill Hashem's (G-d's) will.

Part of "to love chesed" means that doing chesed should always be on your mind. You should always be thinking of ways to give benefit to other people. This is so much more true when it comes to our spouses, since without self-correcting thought a person takes everything for granted and may find himself far from doing chesed. Only a person who loves chesed will be alert enough to always remember to do it for his spouse.

If Chanukah is a holiday of Torah, then it is also a holiday of chesed, since they go hand in hand. There is no better time to start practicing chesed than on Chanukah, when a person is usually at home more than at other times of the year. And there is no more important person to do chesed with than your spouse.

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Money, Money, Money
