

Bo/Passover: “Because of This”

After commanding us to commemorate the date we left Egypt, the Torah also instructs us to transmit these memories to the next generation.

“On that day, you must tell your child, ‘It is because of this that God acted for me when I left Egypt.’” (Ex. 13:8)

The wording, however, is unclear. “Because of this” — what does the word “this” refer to? What is the reason that, for its sake, God performed the signs and miracles in Egypt?

MEMORIES FOR ALL GENERATIONS

One might think that the sole function of the ten plagues was to rescue the Israelites from persecution and slavery. In fact, the true goal of the miracles in Egypt goes far beyond the needs of that generation. Those historic events were meant to create an eternal inheritance for all generations. Their purpose is achieved as each generation preserves these national memories and transmits them to the next generation.

This is how the verse should be understood. The word “this” refers back to the beginning of the verse. “It is because of this” — so that “you will tell your child” — “that God acted for me when I left Egypt.” The ultimate purpose of the signs and wonders in Egypt is fulfilled as each generation absorbs the elevated impressions of those miracles, drawing from them their great light and holiness.

According to the Haggadah’s exegesis, “because of this” refers to the special foods that we eat to recall the Exodus: “The Passover Seder may not be conducted until the time when matzah and bitter herbs are set before you.” This does not contradict the explanation presented above; it simply adds an additional nuance. We commemorate the Exodus and recount its story to the next generation when we can physically point to the matzah and bitter herbs on Passover night. According to this explanation, the purpose of the Exodus is accomplished when we experientially transmit to our children the smells, tastes, and memories of that historic event.

Know Your Shul Members — Victor Reznick

LE: Where are you from originally?

VR: Labyrinth Road. I’m an old-timer. Ninety-two and seven-eighths. [Kein ayin hara.]

LE: How has the community changed since you were growing up here?

VR: The community has changed quite a bit. The rabbis, years, years back, they were in a bind, because if they came from Europe, they spoke and carried the traditions of their fathers and grandfathers, and did the same thing. If they came from Lithuania, they carried on like the Litvishe. My parents came from the Russian side, and they carried on like the Russians. Others were from Poland. Now there’s acceptance. That’s good.

When my mother came here, she didn’t

know her way around, but she knew where Lombard Street was. That’s where the kosher butchers were. When you went to the butcher, he was on trial. You were the one who judged his kashrus.

LE: How long have you been a member of Tiferes Yisroel?

VR: Two and a half years. My son and his family [Howard and Dvora Sora and their children, Zoe Reznick-Gewanter, Miriam Goldberger, Avigayil Pierce, Shua Reznick, Zehava Gerstenfeld, and Aaron Binyamin Reznick] were attending, and when my wife passed away, I joined. The rabbi’s a wonderful guy, wonderful man, good rabbi, very understanding. The people that visit, even if you don’t know them and they don’t know you, they turn out to be nice guys.

LE: You just welcomed a great-great-grandchild. Kein ayin hara, you must have a lot of descendants.

VR: Yes, is the answer. I never counted. My wife counted. My grandson, at Mir Yeshiva in Israel ... was asked by my wife, “Eli, how many do you have?” He says, “Bubbie, Chaya Tova went to the hospital twelve times, and on one occasion she had twins.” He wouldn’t say thirteen. I never counted until this past Chanuka.

Someone asked me how I did it. That’s easy: you marry young and live long.

LE: Do you have any parenting advice to share?

VR: Yes. It’s called Tehillim. You buy a Tehillim, use it in good health.

Somebody told me, You talk a lot about your mother. My mother was a very educated woman. Why? Her zaidy, my alter-zaidy, was a melamed. My mother was head of household when she was 10 years old. When my aunt was born, their mother died in childbirth. Someone said, go get a wet nurse. They brought a wet nurse, and another group came, too: the chevra kadisha. That baby’s granddaughter lives in California. Sixty-five or seventy-eight years later, to talk about it is easy, but can you imagine the trauma that she [my mother] went through?

My mother was caught in the wars and pogroms in Europe, and my father was over here raising money, and then he went over, but they spent all their money helping other people. He had to come back and raise more money, and he went back to get her, but then there was a war, in 1914. She lived with their four children under twelve from 1902 to 1913, living in the woods, foraging for food, and then six years later she was here in Baltimore, in 1919. The stories of how she lived, how she made it—Hashem was busy taking care of her.

LE: Do you have a favorite mitzvah or favorite aspect of Judaism?

VR: Help others. Everybody needs help—everybody.
