

Israel: Land of the Free

from the Ohr HaChaim commentary by Rabbi Chaim (ben Moshe) ibn Attar

"...Who took you out from Egypt, from the house of slavery." (Ex. 20:2)

Regarding the two phrases: "from Egypt" and "from the house of slavery," the first expression refers to the Exodus which has already taken place, while the last expression refers to the liberation in the future when the Mashiach will arrive.

The words: "Who took you out from Egypt" also provide the answer to the question why G-d did not simply replace the Egyptians in Egypt with the Jews and establish us as the rulers in that land. Why was it necessary to leave the land, to travel through the desert, etc.? Surely the Israelites would have derived greater satisfaction from such a solution to their problems than to march to Canaan and there to dispossess a people which had never done them any harm. Moreover, it would have demonstrated G-d's power if He dispossessed the Egyptians of their land!

G-d explained that inasmuch as the very land of Egypt was a house of bondage, this would not have been appropriate. This is as read in the verse: "When the Supreme G-d handed out the inheritance of the various nations, He established boundaries for the peoples in relation to Israel's numbers." (Deut. 32:8) The Zohar (I:108) comments that G-d handed out certain places on earth to the guardian angels of the various nations, and that the only land He did not assign to such guardian angels was the land of Canaan (Israel). G-d had reserved the land of Canaan for Himself.

The Torah says "house of slavery," describing the place as one assigned to one of G-d's servants (the guardian angel of Egypt). G-d did not want for the Jewish people to live in a homeland which "belonged" to the guardian angel of the Egyptians. He wanted the Israelites to reside in a country which was directly under His personal guidance.

Know Your Shul Members — Fred and Rena Levi

Fred Levi likes to tell the story of his first time in Rabbi Goldberger's shul. He and Rena davened at their neighborhood shul until, one yom tov in 1987, a coffee urn got too low on water and started a fire that destroyed the building. They were in limbo for a while, until Fred tried the new shul they had heard about, which met in a garage and had a lot of baalei teshuva. The Rabbi got up to speak, and in the middle of his drasha, Fred saw something that startled him. The Rabbi's toddler son came up and asked him something, and the Rabbi bent down to speak to him.

"Now, I grew up at a shul where no one even walked into the sanctuary while the rabbi was speaking, there was such decorum. When I saw Rabbi Goldberger stop and bend down to address this little child, I saw a rabbi who could balance between his family's needs and his shul's needs. He did it as comfortably as could be. I came home and told Rena, 'I think I've found the shul for our kids to grow up in.'"

Rena majored in English at YU's Stern College for Women, and early on she worked part time for the Baltimore City Schools. When she decided to go to work full time in the 1980s, Fred suggested computers, the wave of the future. She studied to become a computer operator and landed a job at an AT&T data center, mounting reels of magnetic tape and sitting at a big console delivering commands. Later she took programmer training at USF&G, where she stayed for several years before going to work for the state of Maryland. Currently a programmer analyst for the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene in her 22nd year of public service, she writes code to deliver reports requested by policymakers. Her favorite aspect of her job is being able to satisfy their requests.

Fred also started out in education. He received teacher training in college and taught for a few years, then went back for a degree in social work, which he practiced for 38 years at Jewish Family Services and Howard County Department of Social Services. When his father took sick, Fred retired from social work to have more time to help out during his treatment. Fred had moonlighted for some time as a photographer, and now this became his main occupation. He shoots simchas, makes portraits and does restorations and tabletop photography (images for websites). He has thoroughly enjoyed all these lines of work, which he says are different, yet related. His favorite pictures are those that bring the greatest satisfaction to his clients.

In the 1990s and early 2000s Fred was president of the shul and later secretary. Rena used to oversee child care on yom tov, and currently she copy edits the Lev Echad and is always ready to lend a hand with shul events. The Levis were the shul's banquet honorees in 1998. Fred insists, characteristically, that he has no idea why he was honored.

"I think they were just stuck and were looking. I know why they picked Rena, but I have no idea why they picked me, to tell you the truth."

Similarly, on the subject of how his family became intertwined with the Goldbergers' to the extent of being double mechutanim as well as sharing great-grandchildren with the Goldbergers' rebbe, Fred says, "I had nothing to do with that. I just witnessed it. I mean, nothing consciously, at least. The two of our kids that married, Shlomo and Ahuva, met on the playground of the shul, and Elie and Esther met at a camp run by the Shambergs, and at some point they let us know, this is whom they wanted to marry."

Holy Kehilla,

Wishing everyone a wonderful Shabbos. Here are some more of the results of the survey question — What would make our shul even better?

- More emphasis and activities around outreach, shidduchim and kids programs.
- More opportunities to get to know new members.
- Less talking during davening. It would be very helpful if there was a group of respected people who encouraged less/no talking in shul, especially on the men's side. I am not referring to a quick Good Shabbos or welcoming smile, and am happy that many of our members emulate the Rabbi and Rebbetzin's example in this, but rather to entire lengthy social or business transactions that are conducted quite loudly throughout the course of every Shabbos davening.
- Give people a sense of where we're at financially. It was very helpful for me when Caryn said if everyone doubled dues, we'd be in good shape (if I got that right). That helped give me a sense of budgeting our tzedaka.
- Consider putting a repair list out on a web spreadsheet along with what we think it will cost, and let people sign up to either do it (the handyman types), or pay for it and help a handyman/woman do it.
