

### Jersey Shore Torah Bulletin

“When you lend money to My people, the poor among you” (Shemot 22:24)

Why is the Torah adamant about charging interest?

A rich man does not necessarily deserve his wealth, nor a poor person his poverty. Affluence and poverty derive from acts of Hashem designed to test the person. The rich man should think that he is merely the caretaker of money which rightfully belongs to the poor man. It is placed in his custody to test him, to see if he will be blinded by riches.

This is implied in the words “et he’ani imach — the poor man’s money is with you.” When you extend him a loan, in reality you are granting him access to his money. Consequently, charging him interest on his money is adding insult to the suffering of poverty and a grave iniquity. (Vedibarta Bam)

### Know Your Shul Members — Yonatan and Andrea Grinberg

The Grinbergs’ story is a series of gam zu l’tovas. Growing up in Toronto, Andrea was “the family atheist.” She enjoyed science, philosophy, and the cello. She created her own mantras and doctrines, but in school was often told that her ideas of reconciling life’s contradictions were impossible.

“In philosophy, you’re either spiritual on a mountain, or you’re physical and a nihilist. What I discovered is that my ideas were in line with Judaism. For example, with modesty: the contradiction is that by covering something up, you reveal it more.

“Judaism gave me a sense of roots. Suddenly, every action I take is meaningful. It’s very liberating when you start thinking that way; also it’s a lot of responsibility.”

Shortly after making aliyah in her early twenties, Andrea was assigned to a chamber music group with a Yerushalmi violinist named Yonatan, who was headed for a master’s program in chutz la’aretz.

“I had found my niche,” Andrea says. “But when you find your soulmate ... We were going to Chicago for two years. What’s two years compared to a lifetime with someone?”

Unable to work in Chicago as a Canadian-Israeli, Andrea nevertheless discovered not one calling, but two: blogging and volunteering with an inner city children’s orchestra.

The blog told the story of her journey in Yiddishkeit. When a small section devoted to hair covering exploded with interest, and not only from Jewish women, it was clear this should be its own blog. Andrea’s father provided a name: Wrapunzel. Today Wrapunzel.com is a thriving business as well as an online community.

“Everything I’ve said I would never do in my life,” Andrea confesses, “I’ve wound up doing: being religious; leaving a career for a man; being some kind of fashion icon — growing up I hated anything gashmius; being a businessperson. Hashem’s having a good laugh up there.”

By the time Yonatan’s program ended, the Grinbergs were running the children’s orchestra, with over 100 kids. They dreamed of starting a music school in Israel but, acknowledging the importance of credentials in Israel, decided to stay for Yonatan to pursue a Ph.D. He was accepted into Peabody Institute’s doctoral program in performance.

The first people they met in Baltimore were Yaakov and Batsheva Goldman, and the first shul they visited was Tiferes Yisroel. It was an immediate click.

Yonatan says, “There are a number of things that are very special and unique about our shul which allow a lot of holiness and growth, probably mostly inspired by the Rabbi’s hashgafa and approach to us, the shul members. It has to do a lot with letting people find their own unique expressions within the realms of Torah. One of the translations you often hear for the word ‘shalom’ is peace, but shalom actually means harmony: different notes which combine together to create a much richer musical syntax and allow for much more diversity and possibilities than just a single line. You get people sitting right next to each other who are very different, both in their Torah and what they do in life, and somehow people mesh together on our common ground of loving to learn together, daven together, and connect together.”

In Baltimore the Grinbergs recognized a great need for children’s music instruction. Out of their work with individual students grew a children’s string orchestra, the

Baltimore Bows; the success of their first concert this past September led to the addition of a second group, with over 30 members at latest count.
