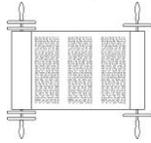

Turning “Nega” Into “Oneg”

The Ar”i zs”l writes that when one suffers, Heaven forbid, from any sort of crisis and consults a sadik, the sadik can intervene and thus transform the “nega” (affliction) into “oneg” (delight), and the “sarah” (crisis) into “rasah” (that which is pleasing). The Ben Ish Hai zs”l adds that this concept is alluded to in our parashah. Describing the leprous affliction (“sara’at”) that has been cured, the Torah writes, “vehinei hafach hanega et eno,” “The affliction has changed color.” The word used for “color” in his pasuk is “eno,” a contraction for “ayin shelo,” its color. However, it may also be understood as the letter “ayin.” Thus, the pasuk tells us that the “ayin” of the word “nega” should be switched and moved from the back of the word to the beginning, thus forming the word “oneg.” The “Zecher Haim” zs”l suggests that this idea is alluded to as well in the poem of the Ar”i, “Azamer Bishvahin,” recited by many on Friday night. One line in the poem reads, “Beshavin iturin de’al gabei hamshin,” “the seventy crowns on top of the fifty.” This may refer to the letter “ayin” — whose numerical value is seventy — placed behind the “nun,” whose numerical value is fifty.

This may also serve as a reminder to us that everything the Al-mighty does is, ultimately, for the best: “It is a time of crisis for Yaakov — and from it they shall be saved.” The Midrash relates the incident of one whose cow broke its leg and, as the owner went through the trouble to pick it up, he disclosed a hidden treasure in that spot. Here, too, one will at first feel despondent over having been inflicted by sara’at. However, in the end he will discover the “ayin,” and then when he looks back he will recognize the “oneg,” the delight of divine salvation. The mourning will soon turn into celebration, the melancholy into joy, and the one who has suffered will soon sing songs of praise and thanks to Hashem.

Know Your Shul Members — Klara Margaretten



In 1973 Klara Arbai and her mother lived a few floors below the vice president of the Jewish Museum of Budapest and his wife. One day they said they wanted her to meet someone. The man in question, Jack Marvin Margaretten, lived in Spain and was visiting Hungary for pleasure; the VP had befriended him in the museum and invited him for Friday night dinner. They came from the same part of Hungary, Derecske. Klara wasn’t sure—she was older—but she agreed. After three days of getting to know one another, the man’s visa expired, and he had to return to Spain. But he soon returned, and when he came again to her door, he later told Klara, her mother must have smelled something, because she looked him up and down. It was raining; they went to a coffee shop; he asked her to marry him. She said, “Let me think about it.” Five minutes later, she said yes. After waiting several months for government approval, they were married on October 7, 1973. The groom had to return to Spain the day after the wedding.

For several years the Margarettenes lived in Spain, flying to New York for the births of their children, first a daughter, then a son. When their son was born, Klara’s husband, an Auschwitz survivor, said he could not raise a Jewish boy in Spain. They decided to move to the States, but parnassah was difficult in New York, so they headed to Florida instead, opening a kosher candy store in Miami Beach in 1977. In 1979, they returned to Spain to pack up for good, detouring to Hungary to celebrate the High Holidays before going back to Florida. Unfortunately, Klara says, G-d had a different story. Her husband passed away there on Rosh Hashana, at age 50, and was buried in Budapest.

In 1980 Klara came to Baltimore with her

two children, ages 2 and 5. Her brother-in-law, Moishe Margaretten, had a chicken business here. Klara worked as a babysitter, but with her bachelor’s degree in chemistry, she was able to find a job with the University of Maryland School of Medicine. She remained there for 25 years, first in the Physiology Department researching aging, then in central vaccine development, in the gastroenterology group, in diabetes and celiac disease research. She has been retired for eight years. A takeaway from her career in medical research: when prescribed medicine, always ask about side effects.

Klara’s daughter Judy Landman went to Bais Yaakov from kindergarten through twelfth grade and is now married with five children. Klara’s son, William Paul, went to TA and graduated from Towson cum laude in finance and business. Both live in Baltimore. Klara has been coming to Tiferes Yisroel since its days in the garage; it’s close to home, and she likes the way the Rabbi conducts everything.

With her grandson typing, Klara is translating her husband’s writings into English, about his experiences during the war. He was a dreamer, she says, and would have liked to be a writer. He was deported to Auschwitz on June 29, 1944, at the age of 15.

One day earlier, Klara was born. Her father, a doctor in the hospital, had already been sent to a labor camp. Mother and baby had the good fortune to be kicked out of the hospital because they couldn’t pay; shortly thereafter, the hospital was liquidated. That luck held out for the two, though not for most of their family. It was easier to hide in the city than in the villages, which were surrounded and emptied. Klara’s mother’s parents did not survive, nor did any of her parents’ siblings. Her grandfather was killed in front of her grandmother and her mother. Klara’s father, they later learned, was made to dig his own grave in a forest in Yugoslavia. Once, after the war, Klara visited a writer who had been in the camp with her father. He asked Klara to put her hand on the table, and he said, “I have seen this hand before.” A postcard from her mother had reached her father in the camp. On it, she had traced their baby’s hand.

After the war, Klara’s mother remarried and had another son; her stepfather, who had lost two children in the war, was a real father for her. Klara says, “I hope he saw everything that’s going on from upstairs with my father and my husband, because unfortunately I have a lot of people up already. He passed away Yom Kippur night 1971. He blessed me. I still believe because he blessed me, I met my husband two years later.”

Klara plans to travel to Hungary in May for six weeks, to visit her mother, who is 95. She notes that in the current difficult economy, Jews are once again being scapegoated.

"I have five beautiful grandchildren, thank G-d, and I adore them. But I miss my husband more and more, because who will you share the joy with? Every day is a blessing."
