

The Weekly Parsha



Parshas Shelach

“And how are the cities in which it dwells - are they open or are they fortified?” (13:19)

Moshe Rabbeinu asked the meraglim, spies, to look closely into the nature of the land and its inhabitants. One can learn much by studying the habits and lifestyle of the people of the land. The Ohr Pnei Yehoshua from the Admor, of Galant, offers a penetrating insight into Moshe’s request that they check to see if the people dwelled in cities that were open or fortified. The spies went and discovered, to their chagrin, that the cities were fortified with lock and key. They figured that had they been living in open cities without fortification for protection, they would be easily conquerable. Now, what could they do to gain entry for battle?

Calev arose and implored the people to listen. He encouraged them, saying that they could “indeed” win the war. The greatest proof is that the cities in which the enemy lived were fortified. Had the cities been open, it would indicate that the inhabitants were on friendly terms with one another. Trust and camaraderie reigned in their communities. People had nothing to fear. Protection was not needed, since everyone got along. There was openness. They were all members of one large community. Had this been the case, they would have proven to be a formidable adversary. There is nothing more difficult to battle than a unified army.

Now, since the reports described how the people lived in fortified cities, there was a strong indication that they were their own greatest enemy. Apparently, discord and mistrust prevailed in the communities. When people lived in locked communities, it was a strong indication of trouble brewing from within. Such a nation would be easy to vanquish. Indeed, they were destroying themselves.

While this is a penetrating exegesis on the Chumash, it is an even greater lesson for us. When there is mistrust in a community; when openness is feared and everybody looks over his shoulder for fear of what his “friend” is plotting against him; when insecurity is the catchword to describe a community, then it is racing at high speed towards self-destruction. We must ask ourselves: Do these depictions characterize us? If so, are we prepared to do something to address the problem?

Know Your Shul Members- Eli and Lena Fleminger

Eli and Lena Fleminger (rhymes with “finger”, not “ginger”) celebrated their twelfth wedding anniversary this past week. In seminary, when she would hear someone say, “We got engaged in six weeks,” Lena would roll her eyes, but as it turned out, that’s how it was for her and Eli.

“Honestly, we could have done it in three or four, but I said, ‘Let’s try to be a little bit normal.’ It was apparent to both of us very quickly.” Both had become frum after college; Eli learned at Machon Shlomo and Lena at Neve Yerushalaim. Rabbi Porter’s brother-in-law, Rabbi Unger, made the shidduch. The Flemingers’ children are Avraham Chaim, 10, Tuvia, 7, Yehuda, 5, and Aviva, 2. They celebrated their anniversary, Eli says, by hiring a babysitter.

Here’s how you might have spotted Eli recently: at the Lag b’Omer bonfire, playing clarinet; at Shacharis, wearing his tefillin on his right arm; on the Great Wall of China, posing for a snapshot with friendly strangers.

Eli grew up in St. Louis, where his father has played viola with the symphony orchestra for 45 years. He has a degree in economics and works for the US Department of Agriculture, where he analyzes foreign banks for loan guarantees the USDA issues to help increase American agricultural exports. He learned some Chinese before traveling to Beijing this past April for work, and while there he was able to haggle with store owners and respond to frequent questions about his yarmulke.

“Some people said, ‘You’re Jewish, you must be a businessperson’; they associated Jews with money.” Overall, though, he found very little anti-Semitism in China. He did provoke some consternation when he brought out his tuna and crackers at a fancy business lunch, but on the other hand, people seemed excited to meet a Jewish person. Somewhere in China, he notes, there’s a picture of him on the

Great Wall with some people wanted their picture taken with him because of his yarmulke. From the delicious loose-leaf tea served at all the meetings, Eli gained new appreciation for the phrase, “all the tea in China.”

Before having kids, Lena, who grew up in York, PA, and worked in publishing and public relations, first in Philadelphia and then in the University of Maryland’s Office of Public Affairs. After Avraham Chaim was born, she took a few years off from work, but felt like she was losing her mind staying home full time. Now she sells new and second-hand sheitels, and she makes and sells her own “hand-tied” variety. Instead of wefts of hair sewn into the wig cap with an industrial sewing machine, individual small groups of hair are hand-sewn in with a tool similar to a tiny crochet hook. It takes 45-50 hours to make a hand-tied sheitel, but it’s “tremendously more comfortable and natural.” In addition to her frum clientele, much of Lena’s business comes from people who have medical hair loss, who want something that doesn’t look like a wig.

“A lot of them buy wigs made by companies for people with hair loss. They are generally horrible quality, and very expensive. These women have no cohort; they are desperate, and they are really preyed upon. Someone found me on Facebook, and once they found out that I’m honest with them and the wigs are good quality, the business grew by word of mouth.”

The Flemingers joined Tiferes Yisroel recently and are hoping to move closer to the shul soon.

“We’re both baalei teshuva,” says Lena, “and we didn’t realize until the last few years how important it is to be in a place where the baal teshuva experience is understood. The place is flexible and inclusive.” Lena had a prior relationship with the Rebbetzin, who gave a shalom bais shiur at the Flemingers’ home, and she had wanted for a long time to make TY their shul.

And Eli? “I listened to my wife. At the end of the day, she really is right.” Perhaps Eli could be persuaded to give a shalom bais shiur of his own.
