## 7th of Adar

According to the Talmud (**TB Megillah 18b**) Moses both born and died on the 7th of Adar. Traditionally, we are taught that our great and righteous leaders live such full lives that they live "full term" — from first birthday to last birthday.

The date has been given significance in later tradition to commemorate and honor the *hevra kadisha* (literally: the holy society), the group of individuals who help prepare and bury the dead.

Our sages also teach us that Moses was born three months premature (hence why his mother was able to seclude him for that time, Ex. 2:2). Which would make his accurate birth date the 7th of Sivan. That date, according to a popular opinion in the Talmud
