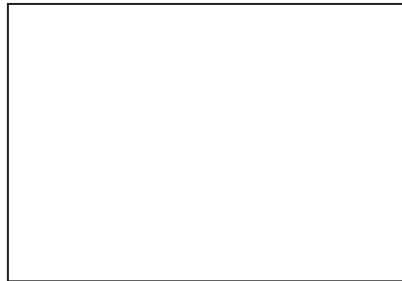
FRIDAY EVENING SHABBAT DINNER

The congregation is delighted to announce that our Winter Scholar in Residence will be one of our all time favorites amongst our Scholars-in-Residence, Rabbi Joseph Telushkin. He will speak to us on three occasions over Shabbat beginning with a Friday evening dinner at the Synagogue. He will also speak from the pulpit on Saturday morning and at a special Seudah Shlishit for the entire congregation on Saturday afternoon.

Rabbi Telushkin is the author of three of the most influential Jewish books of this era. With Dennis Prager he authored *Nine Questions People Ask About Judaism* and *Why The Jews?—The Reason for Anti-Semitism*. He also wrote *Jewish Literacy*, familiar to our congregation as a gift which the Couples Club gives to each Bar and Bat Mitzvah at KJ.

Rabbi Telushkin has also written two works of fiction, *The Unorthodox Murder of Rabbi Wohl* and *The Final Analysis of Dr. Stark*. Other titles include *Jewish Humor* and *Jewish Wisdom*.

Rabbi Telushkin's presentations over the weekend will concentrate on his most recent writings. Released this past year and reviewed in November by our Am Hasefer Book Discussion Club is the book, *Words That Hurt, Words That Heal*. It will be the subject of his Friday evening and Seudah Shlishit talks. His Saturday morning delivery will be from the book he is writing now, *Biblical Literacy*. It is a sequel to *Jewish*



Literacy and concentrates on the personalities, location and time periods of the Bible. It should be a real treat for Kehilath Jeshurun to hear his remarks on this book which will be published next Fall.

We are looking forward to an exciting and stimulating Shabbat and invite readers of this Bulletin to join us for the entire program and to send in reservations for the Friday evening dinner promptly as the weekend comes less than a week after the Winter vacation season. At that time we will have a *sofer* present who will examine your *tefillin* and *mezuzot klafs* which should be done at least twice in a seven year period. Plan to come that morning with all of your *mezuzot* and insure that they are kosher for your use.

NEW PROGRAM FOR SENIORS TO FEATURE MOVIES ON MONDAYS The First Showing December 16

Following the great success of the seniors' program Lunch and Learn on Wednesdays, Kehilath Jeshurun is adding another program to its roster of senior activities. MOVIES ON MONDAYS will feature films of Jewish interest. Some will be documentaries and docu-dramas while others will be full length motion pictures focusing on the Jewish character and personalities.

The first showing on Monday, December 16th, will feature a biography of former Prime Minister Yitzchak Rabin. We will be showing it in recognition of his first Yahrzeit a few weeks ago. This is a non political review of his personal life prepared for A&E Cable channel which features biographies of important personalities. The video traces his life from a young age to his years as an army hero and to when he became the first Israeli-born Prime Minister. It concludes with his assassination.

The movie will be shown following lunch, which will begin promptly at 12:00 noon. SAVE THE DATE AND SAVE A LIFE KJ /RAMAZ BLOOD DRIVE Sunday, December 15, 1996

The Annual KJ/Ramaz Blood Drive sponsored by the Parents Council of the school and the Men's Club of the congregation will be held Sunday, December 15 from 9:00 AM - 2:30 PM.

Please come and donate a pint of blood to save another person's life. Let's all help to make this year's blood drive as successful as it has been in the past.

The Blood Drive committee does more throughout the year. During the past year, our members have responded with additional donations when emergency calls came in to the committee. We are called for whole blood donations for patients from the KJ/Ramaz family and the greater metropolitan area who face blood loss from major surgery and anemia associated with various diseases. If you are willing to donate during the year, please let one of the committee persons know; this is especially true if you did not donate during last year's drive.

We also get calls for Platelet

Donors for patients with cancer receiving chemotherapy or undergoing bone marrow transplantation. This type of donation requires two steps: a screening to draw a couple of vials (a few tablespoons) of blood and the actual platelet pheresis procedure. The 15 minute screening is performed at the blood donor room of the hospital where the patient is treated, and if your platelets can be used, an appointment for the 1½ to 2 hour procedure will be arranged at your convenience. If you are willing to be a platelet donor, please call to be placed on the special platelet donor list, so that you can be called upon when the need arises.

We urge you to set aside time on Sunday, December 15, to be part of our blood drive. As always, brunch will be served. The New York Blood Center staff will make a special effort to ensure a quick and painless donation. Our thanks are extended to those who have responded and to those who are polite to our committee when we call upon you. The co-chairs are Dina Farhi and Barbara Weiss.

A GRANDER YOUTH PROGRAM THAN EVER BEFORE

One can feel it upon entering the building. The vitality of our youth program seems to know no bounds. Under the leadership of our new Youth Director, Chaim Zakheim, and our Youth Committee Chairman, Dr. Norman Magid, we are reaching new levels of participation and a greater diversity of activity than ever before.

On Shabbat morning, one can find seven different youth services scattered throughout the building. A toddler group; a nursery congregation; the Junior Junior Congregation for Kindergaren and First Graders; a Junior Congregation for Grades 2 to 4; and separate 5th and 6th grade boys and girls groups. All lead ultimately to our Teen Minyan, which is now drawing more than 40 teenage boys and girls per Shabbat.

In reporting about our Teen Minyan, we are pleased to note there is a traveling Minyan between four mid-Manhattan Synagogues. The first integrated teen Minyan was held November 23rd at Lincoln Square Synagogue. Our date to host will come up a little bit later in the season.

On Shabbat afternoon from 3:00 to 5:00, there are six groups between boys and girls first through sixth grades. In addition to their fun activities, different groups study Parashat HaShavua and learn Mishnayot. All of the boys participate in Mincha as well.

Sports Activities

KJBL, our Kehilath Jeshurun Ball League, has also reached a new level of participation and a higher level of activity. In addition to a 2nd Grade basketball clinic, there is a 3rd and 4th Grade league and a 5th through 7th Grade league.

We are also one of the few Jewish Ice Hockey programs around. We have a 1st through 5th Grade league that plays at Skyrink and a 6th through 10th Grade league that plays at the Lasker Rink. That group is

NEW CLASSES TO BEGIN IN DECEMBER AND JANUARY

Kehilath Jeshurun is proud to add to its already broad spectrum of adult education offerings by introducing several new classes during the months of December and January.

✧ **THE WORLD OF OUR FATHERS**, a Jewish History Course covering the 150 years preceding World War II, analyzing the trends which have shaped the Jewish world of today will be presented by Rabbi Yossi Weiser on Wednesday evenings from 7:00 to 8:15 PM starting this Wednesday evening.

✧ The exciting Tuesday evening Round Robin series geared to young families in the community and taught by Rabbi Mark Wildes, will begin another round of three sessions on December 10th. The classes, held from 7:00 to 8:30 PM take place in the homes of members of the Congregation. An exceptionally nice sized group participated in the first cycle, and this phase looks to be equally exciting.

The three topics Rabbi Wildes will cover are:

December 10: *Chanukah—What Really Was the Miracle?*

December 17: *Gemilut Chasadim—Acts of Kindness (Basis and Application)*

December 24: *The Messiah—What Will It Bring?*

✧ **Beginning Wednesday**, January 29th, a new cycle of Basic Judaism and Hebrew Crash Courses will begin. Our Outreach Director, Rabbi Yitz Motechin, will teach a new Level I Basic Judaism Course, while Rabbi Mark Wildes will teach Level II. These two classes run from 8:00 - 9:30 PM. They will be preceded by a Level I and a Level II Hebrew Reading Crash Course which will run from 6:30 to 8:00 PM. All four courses run for six weeks and these are outstanding introductory courses open to all.

✧ December will also see the start of the second semester of Rabbi Wildes' Thursday night classes entitled "Judaism in the Contemporary World." They will meet on six Thursday evenings beginning at 7:00 PM and will cover such topics as Jewish life cycle (circumcision, Bar/Bat Mitzvah, Marriage...) lifeboat ethics, the individual versus the community, Kashrut/Vegetarianism and the Mitzvah of honoring parents. All those interested in this dynamic course are invited to participate. It was not necessary to have attended the first semester.

PURIM MISHLOACH MANOT RESUMES FOR THIRD YEAR

With Chanukah here, Purim cannot be far behind. This shul-wide program has been a resounding success during its first two years.

The project works like this. Members of the Synagogue can participate in the Mitzvah of sending Mishloach Manot to their friends and neighbors in the Congregation while contributing to the Congregation at the same time. In Memoriam

OSCAR TRENCHER

We mourn the passing of a beloved and esteemed member of Kehilath Jeshurun, a prince of a man and a jewel of a Jew.

A survivor of Auschwitz, Mauthausen and other death and labor camps, Mr. Trencher successfully rebuilt his life and had the pride and joy of two children and seven grandchildren as graduates and students in Ramaz and Westchester Day School.
