
"GUILTY:

THE COLLAPSE OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE" JUDGE HAROLD J. ROTHWAX TO SPEAK AT SUNDAY SUPPER LECTURE ON MARCH 2

Was justice done in Crown Heights? Is the "real" assassin of Rabbi Meir Kahane really yet to be found? These and other questions may be posed by the audience following Judge Harold Rothwax's Sunday Supper Lecture on March 2nd when he discusses his new book: "Guilty: The Collapse of Criminal Justice."

Judge Rothwax is known in legal circles for his sharp mind, candor, and tough rulings. In this book, he has written a brilliant and controversial volume that puts our criminal justice system on trial. He takes us inside his courtroom and tells tales of justice gone awry and how he has done battle in his chamber with lawyers more their interested in personal ambitions than justice.

"Why should technicalities," he asks, "allow convicted murderers



we not simply asking the question: Did the accused commit the crime?"

In his book, Judge Rothwax's stories provoke outrage. We expect his lecture will do the same.

Sessions will examine changes over the past two decades that have particularly affected Orthodox Jewish women and consider the direction and means of additional changes in the next century.

WOMEN'S SUPPORT GROUP "MEETING WITH SUCCESS"

In October 1996, a women's support group was formed and began meeting once each week in the evening for one and one half hours. The group is led by Hedda Rudoff, a clinical social worker with training in individual and group therapy. Ms. Rudoff's academic training and professional experience have been most beneficial to the success of the group.

The purpose of the group is NOT therapy; rather, it was created to serve as a forum at which unmarried women, be they divorced, widowed, or never married, could share their thoughts and ideas with one another in an effort to make the most of each day, and to maximize the quality of life within person's given set circumstances. While this may sound simplistic, given the complexities of life today, there are nevertheless certain basics that everyone strives to maintain—the group has recognized this and has come together in a most positive manner.

Privacy and confidentiality are highly respected, most important for any group of this nature. There has been an initial pre-joining, four-week commitment, to insure for some degree of continuity. At this point, however, attendees are considering expanding the commitment to possibly six or eight weeks, as they have found that it takes time to get into issues and, when there is a shorter time constraint, there is more pressure to "hurry up" or perhaps not bring up something which would require a bit of time to fully discuss. This is yet to be decided.

The group is relatively small, but supportive of accepting additional members. Should the circumstances arise, other groups will be formed. The ages vary, but the mix is appropriate; the backgrounds in both religious and secular approaches differ, which has lent itself to an interesting cohesiveness. The formation of ideological support for the group comes from KJ Ketubah/Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun. However, the group is financed by the members themselves.

KJ HOCKEY IS GOING TO THE MACABBIAH!

The KJ YOUTH DEPARTMENT is pleased to announce that it will be sending our youth hockey team, KJ HOCKEY KERACH, to Metulla, Israel, to compete for the Maccabi Cup. 





FATULLA AMINI

He lived next door to our Synagogue and, together with his wife, was a regular worshipper in our midst on Shabbat until age and infirmity made it impossible for him to join us for worship.


