

RABBI ADIN STEINSALTZ 125TH ANNIVERSARY SCHOLAR SHABBAT MORNING AND AFTERNOON, NOVEMBER 15



The theme of our 125th Anniversary celebration has been an examination of the historical events, trends and movements that have impacted upon the Jewish people since KJ was founded in 1872. One of these is the tremendous growth in Jewish learning and Talmudic study that is taking place now including the great accessibility of Jewish texts.

Rabbi Adin Steinsaltz is internationally regarded as one of the leading scholars and rabbis of this century. According to *Newsweek*:

Jewish lore is filled with tales of formidable rabbis. Probably none living today can compare in genius and influence to Adin Steinsaltz, whose extraordinary gifts as scholar, teacher, scientist, writer, mystic and social critic have attracted disciples from all factions of Israeli society.

Rabbi Steinsaltz is the founder of the Israel Institute for Talmudic Publications. Under its aegis, he has published to date 58 books on the Talmud, Jewish mysticism, religious thought, sociology, historical biography, and philosophy. These books have been translated into Russian, English, French, Portuguese, Swedish, Japanese, and Dutch. His commentary on Pirkei Avot has been published in Chinese in Beijing.

As the spiritual mentor of Russian Jewry, Rabbi Steinsaltz travels to Russia and the Republics once each month from his home in Jerusalem.

Best known for his interpretation, commentaries, and translations of the Babylonian Talmud, he began this monumental task some 27 years ago. Thirty volumes of Rabbi Steinsaltz's Hebrew edition of the Talmud have been published. The Rabbi expects to complete the project over the next decade. With Hebrew, English, Russian, French and Spanish editions, Rabbi Steinsaltz believes that virtually every Jew, anywhere in the world, will have

access to this great repository of Jewish tradition and culture.

Rabbi Steinsaltz's other pioneering efforts in Russia include the founding of the Jewish University of Moscow and the Chairmanship of University of the Jewish Petersburg. These educational centers provide Hebrew language instruction and classes on Jewish life, history and philosophy to thousands of Russian Jews each year. The Jewish University of Moscow is the first degree-granting institution of Jewish studies ever established in the former Soviet Union. He has also established a publishing house in Moscow and formed Lamed, the national Jewish teachers' organization of the former Soviet Union.

Rabbi Steinsaltz's activities in the United States are supported by the Aleph Society chaired by KJ member, Jack Nash.

We will join with hundreds of New Yorkers at a number of very exciting events marking Israel's 50th Independence Day together with the citizens of the Jewish State.

Our own Mission attendees will also have a specially scheduled itinerary which meets our particular needs. We hope to visit the Tzippori excavations in the Galil, join with hundreds of thousands of Israelis at Mt. The Annual KJ/Ramaz Blood Drive sponsored by the Parents Council of the school and the Men's Club of the congregation will be held Sunday, December 14, from 9:00 AM - 2:30 PM.

Please come and donate a pint of blood to save another person's life. Let's all help to make this year's blood drive as successful as it has been in the past.

The Blood Drive committee does more throughout the year. During the past year, our members have responded with additional donations when emergency calls came in to the committee. We are called for whole blood donations for patients from the KJ/Ramaz family and the greater metropolitan area who face blood loss from major surgery and anemia associated with various diseases. If vou are willing to donate during the year, please let one of the committee persons know; this is especially true if you did not donate during last year's drive.

We also get calls for Platelet

Donors for patients with cancer receiving chemotherapy or undergoing bone marrow transplantation. This type of donation requires two steps: a screening to draw a couple of vials (a few tablespoons) of blood and the actual platelet pheresis procedure. The 15 minute screening is performed at the blood donor room of the hospital where the patient is treated, and if your platelets can be used, an appointment for the 1½ to 2 hour procedure will be arranged at your convenience. If you are willing to be a platelet donor, please call to be placed on the special platelet donor list, so that you can be called upon when the need arises.

We urge you to set aside time on Sunday, December 14, to be part of our blood drive. As always, brunch will be served. The New York Blood Center staff will make a special effort to ensure a quick and painless donation. Our thanks are extended to those who have responded and to those who are polite to our committee when we call upon you.

DERSHOWITZ' THE VANISHING AMERICAN JEW TO BE FIRST AM HASEFER BOOK SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 23 AT 8:00 PM

Are American Jews in danger of disappearing? What must be done now to create a renewed sense of Jewish identity for the 21st century?

In previous times, the threats to Jewish survival were external — often the consequences of anti-Semitism. Today, Jews are more secure, more accepted, more assimilated and more successful than ever before. American Jews have achieved the American dream and that, according to Dershowitz, is precisely the problem. More than fifty percent of Jews will marry non-Jews, and their children will most often be raised as non-Jews. Thus, Dershowitz concludes, American Jews will vanish as a distinct group sometime during the 21st century unless they act now.

Dershowitz urges a renewed Jewish identity based on the positive, focusing on our 3,500 year old legacy and Jewish culture, values and traditions. Dershowitz seeks to create a vibrant, self sustaining Jewish community. 


