

Paul Schulder came to us a little over five years ago after a very distinguished career as a leading *ba'al ha-bayit* in Flatbush. He served as the President of the Yeshiva of Flatbush and was one of the builders of that wonderful yeshiva day school. He was a board member of the Young Israel of Flatbush and for many years he has been very active in the UJA-Federation campaign.

In 1941 he enlisted in the United States Navy, a couple of days after Pearl Harbor. When he completed his service he had earned two extraordinary awards: He was a Lieutenant Senior Grade and he had met and fallen in love with his wife, the former Shirley Kestenbaum, with whom he has raised a wonderful family over a period of 51 years.

Paul and Shirley, who has been a leading force in Amit Women and its predecessor American Mizrachi Women since her Junior Mizrachi Women days are the proud parents of children and thirteen grandchildren, all either currently students in day schools or graduates of yeshivot. They include, of course, our own members Lynnette and Jerry Gruenhut and their children Jonathan and Johanna.

CHATAN BEREISHIT Dr. Mark Meirowitz

Born and raised in Washington Heights, Mark Meirowitz is a graduate of the Yeshiva Rabbi Samson Raphael Hirsch, Manhattan Talmudical Academy and Yeshiva College. He holds a Ph.D. in political science from Fordham University and is a graduate lawyer, practicing as a corporate attorney.

Mark is a very familiar face in our shul, occupying his seat in the Main Synagogue on Friday night and Shabbat and having a ready smile for everybody. The only time he talks in shul is when he is ushering. Otherwise, he is a model worshipper who adheres to all of the rules of decorum at KJ.

CHATAN MAFTIR Cantor Mayer Davis

Mayer Davis came to our congregation ten years ago on the High Holy Days as an Associate Cantor to his father, Avrum Davis. He grew up in Far Rockaway where he learned his chazanut from his father who was the Cantor of Congregation Shaare Tefillah before coming to KJ.

A graduate of the Hebrew Institute of Long Island (the forerunner of HAFTAR), Cantor Davis studied at the Cantorial Institute of Yeshiva University. He holds a B.A. in Jewish Studies from Queens College.

He has co-produced three albums of Jewish music, "Tayku" (performing contemporary pop/jazz Jewish music), "My Chiefest Joy" (including his original composition of Avinu Malkeinu), and "Mayer and the Shultones" (featuring the best of Simchat Torah *kedusha* at KJ.)

He has brought to KJ his wonderful davening style as both a chazan and folk singer, drawing the congregation into his singing and creating exciting moments through the year, particularly and most innovatively in the *kedusha* of *musaf* on Simchat Torah.

Cantor Davis divides his time between West Hempstead and Manhattan serving as leasing director at Philips International, a prominent New York real estate development and management company.

Cantor Davis and his wife, the former Rochelle Fastag, and their children Dani, Mikey and Elisheva, have brought so much to our congregation. We are delighted to be able to return a little of that gift in the form of this honor.

INTERNATIONAL TERRORISM EXPERT TO SPEAK SHABBAT AM, SEPTEMBER 20 STEVE EMERSON, LEADING AUTHORITY ON RADICAL ISLAMIC EXTREMIST GROUPS

Steven Emerson, an internationally recognized Washington-based expert and author on international terrorism and counter-terrorism, the Middle East conflict and U.S. foreign policy, and the operations of Middle East terrorist and militant Islamic fundamental networks, will speak at KJ during Shabbat morning services on September 20.

The New York Post has called him "the foremost expert in the world on radical Islamic groups operating on American soil." His documentary, "Jihad in America" (broadcast on PBS) is now standard viewing for federal law enforcement and international intelligence organizations and has received the nation's top journalism awards. Oliver Revell, former head of FBI Investigations and Counter-Terrorism, has stated that Mr. Emerson's "startling discoveries and findings on terrorism are all meticulously documented. impressive body of investigative work has shown that he is more knowledgeable on international Middle Eastern terrorist issues and

groups than either the FBI or CIA." Mr. Emerson's counter-terrorism intelligence archives is considered to be one of the most comprehensive Middle East terrorist databases in the world today

Mr. Emerson frequently testifies before Congress on U.S. foreign policy in the Middle East, the rise of Hamas, and the PLO's relationship toward terrorism and militant Islamic groups.

A regular contributor to national newspapers and magazines, such as the *Washington Post, The New York Times, The Wall Street Journal* and *The New Republic*, Emerson is now producing a new documentary series on

RABBI LOOKSTEIN TO DISCUSS AHAVAT YISRAEL AT

This year's Shabbat Shuva Discourse, which will take place on SATURDAY AFTERNOON, OCTOBER 4 AFTER MINCHA AT 5:30, will be delivered by Rabbi Lookstein on the subject of *Ahavat Yisrael*.

This subject has formed the background for many of the Rabbi's sermons over the past few years, particularly under the influence of the writings and teachings of Rabbi Shlomo HaKohain Aviner of Jerusalem and Bet E-l who, in turn, is a disciple of the late Chief Rabbi Avraham Yitzhak Ha-Kohain Kook and his son, Rabbi Zvi Yehuda Kook.

Perhaps never before has the subject been so relevant. The past few months have seen the most vitriolic verbiage and violent behavior directed by groups of Jews against other groups of Jews. From the violent Kotel disturbances on the nights of Shavuot and Tisha B'Av to the venomous statements from both sides on the issue of religious pluralism in Israel, the atmosphere has been filled with *sinat Yisrael* on a level perhaps unparalleled since the destruction of the Second Temple.

Rabbi Lookstein's discourse will attempt to uncover the sources of ahavat Yisrael and discuss the question of whether a Jew is required to love another Jew even when that other Jew doesn't deserve love. How can we deal with those with whom we disagree? Did Pinchas, the zealous Kohain of the Bible, also live by the principles of Ahavat Yisrael? Perhaps. as the late Senator Goldwater once said, "extremism in the defense of liberty is no vice," a statement which could easily be applied as follows: "Ahavat Yisrael in the absence of a true belief in God and a full commitment to Judaism is no virtue."

How can we relate to such an attitude? What should be our position in the difficult debates of our day and what are the *halakhic* guidelines for that position?

Rabbi Lookstein will explore these issues at the *Shabbat Shuva Drasha* this year. All are invited.

Close to 600 people will attend Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur services including Kol Nidre night and Neilah in a service intended for those with little or no background in Judaism.

Running from 8:15 AM to 1:00 PM on both days of Rosh Hashanah and on Yom Kippur beginning with Kol Nidre at 6:00 PM, attendees will not only participate in prayer but also hear holiday ritual explained. There will be biblical insights, historical oversights, congregational readings and singing — and, of course, the required Shofar blowing. There will be lots of opportunities for questions and answers.

The cost for these services is \$50 per person. Tickets may be obtained through the synagogue office. Through the generosity of members, the congregation has made special arrangements for those unable to pay this amount.

T'SHUVA: IT'S THE LITTLE THINGS NOT THE BIG THINGS

In a recent issue of *Commentary* Magazine, Nathan Glazer, the Harvard professor of Sociology, commented on the drop in the crime rate in the United States. After giving some of the most obvious reasons such as better police performance and more cops on the beat, Prof. Glazer cited a theory of George Kelling, a noted Professor of Criminology at Rutgers University, who suggests that crime is reduced in a community not so much by stopping the big crimes but by eliminating the little ones. For example: the elimination of the harassment of drivers by uninvited window washers at the bridge and tunnel entrances to New York has done a great deal for the quality of life in our city and also delivered a message that petty crime will not be tolerated. With the elimination of petty crimes came a reduction in serious ones too. Many credit Mayor Giuliani with adopting this theory successfully in our city.

T'shuva – repentance, or the elimination of *chet* – presents us with a similar opportunity. If we want to improve ourselves as Jews and as

human beings during the High Holy Day season and throughout the year ahead, perhaps we ought to concentrate not so much on the big things as on the little ones. Daily prayer, weekly attendance in shul on Shabbat, being careful about kashrut in the home and out of the horme. These are all little things that will do much for our spiritual growth in the year ahead.

Similarly, greater sensitivity to the needs of our spouses, looking for ways to make the home happier and the atmosphere more peaceful; respecting our children's needs even as we expect them to respect ours. These are all little things which can help us become better people and better Jews in the year ahead.

So let us remember the disappearance of uninvited window washers and banish from our own lives the uninvited intrusion of small mistakes and unintended errors of insensitivity. Let us appreciate the opportunities to do the little things that can change our lives and those of all our loved ones for the better.

May we all be inscribed for a year

REBBETZIN JUNGREIS AT KJ EVERY

We have been proud this year to welcome Rebbetzin Esther Jungreis' Tuesday evening classes to Kehilath Jeshurun. Needing a larger space than the Hineni Heritage Center on the West Side, the Rebbetzin approached Rabbi Lookstein last December to see if facilities in our synagogue might be available to her. Following approval by both the Rabbi and the KJ Board of Trustees, they began holding a weekly shiur in our auditorium. After only a few weeks, the packed auditorium was no longer large enough for them and the men's level of the Main Synagogue was opened to them. Now, that too is no longer large enough and they are using the entire Main Synagogue where approximately 800-1000 young Jews gather each week to combine Torah learning and socialization.

All MEN are invited to assemble at the mikveh, 234 West 78th Street (East of Broadway) at 6:30 AM on Friday, October 10. Everyone will have the opportunity to immerse and then we will return to KJ for Shacharit services.

KJ BARAK SKATES IN ISRAEL

It was a touching moment in the locker room next to the ice rink at Canada Centre in Metulla as 16 members of KJ Barak, our teen ice hockey team, embraced their Israeli counterparts in a final farewell and each KJ player handed over his helmet, gloves and other equipment, purchased by the Congregation, as a donation to Israel Youth Hockey. The gift was also a fitting way to end a week of friendship and competition.

Playing before a large crowd of fans during maccabiah hockey week in Metulla, KJ Barak met a skilled Israeli squad that included a number of former Canadian and Russian players from Israel's Junior National Team, Inspired by chants of "KJ USA," Barak won the first game on Friday afternoon, 3-2. Israel took the second, on Motzei Shabbat, setting up a tense final match on Sunday. In the final, Israel took a one-goal lead late into the third period before scoring twice more to take the game 6-3 and the Maccabi cup, two games to one.

The enthusiasm of KJ's players and large contingent of parents and friends carried through the three-team "Am Yisrael" Tournament which followed the Maccabiah. In this competition, in which players from Israel and the USA were mixed, KJ Coach Ben Epstein's "White" team, led by KJ's Eliezer Magid, Jeff Kleinhaus and Jonathan Roshanzamir, defeated Israel coach Boris Mindel's "Red" squad, 2-1, in the gold medal game. Three KJ players, defenseman Eliezer Magid, center David Greenbaum, and Goalie David Speiser, were named to the Am Yisrael all-tournament team. In addition, KJ's Jaime Widder, whose overtime goal decided the Am Yisrael semi-finals for "Red," was named best offensive defenseman for the entire week. KJ's Roshanzamir, who played in the finale despite an obviously painful injury that was later determined to be a fractured wrist, was voted the "most courageous" player.

KJ's Andrew Kluger, who scored a goal during the Am Yisrael competition, was voted "best young player."



In Memoriam

Dr. Abram J. Abeloff

After a long struggle with illness and disability, Abram J. Abeloff passed away in his 98th year. He was a giant of a gentleman and a superb professional throughout a life of great achievement.

A former head of surgery at Lenox Hill Hospital, he focused on community oriented preventive services. A member of the board of JDC for many years, he helped to shape the Joint's innovative medical and health programs in Israel, Europe, North Africa and Iran. After World War II he visited DP camps and designed JDC medical services for 250,000 Holocaust survivors in Germany, Austria and Italy.


