CEREMONIES BEGIN

WITH A CHANUKAH SHACHARIT

AT 9 O'CLOCK

Sunday morning, December 5, the second day of Chanukah, will be a great day in the history of the KJ/Ramaz community. On the Festival of Dedication we will officially dedicate The Benjamin and Esther Gottesman Center which houses the new Ramaz Middle School.

The ceremonies will begin with a *Shacharit* service at 9:00 AM in the Main Synagogue of the congregation. The *ba'alei tefilah* and the Torah readers will be students from the Middle School.

Following the service there will be a festive *Siyum Hasefer* — the completion of a Sefer Torah — contributed to the school by Judy and David Lobel. The closing letters of the Torah will be filled in

by the families which have dedicated the six Torah scrolls that are used in the Middle School. They are Miriam and Eric Feldstein, Linda and Michael Jesselson, Deborah and David Kahn, Helen and Dr. Daniel Potaznik and Janie and Robert Schwalbe. They will be joined by a number of leaders in the building program.

Following the completion of the Sefer Torah the entire assemblage will proceed to 85th Street, where all of the Torah scrolls will be carried under the *chupah* with song and dance, into the new school building. After the singing and dancing have been completed there will be opportunities for a tour of the building and also the serving of a light collation.

The entire congregational family is invited to participate in this great moment in the history of the community. This will be a Chanukah unlike any other which we have celebrated.

The sixty-third annual Dinner Dance, sponsored by the Ramaz Parents Council, will serve as a celebration for the completion of the Benjamin and Esther Gottesman Center and the new Ramaz Middle School on the south side of East 85th Street. As part of the festivities we will honor the memory of the late Benjamin and Esther Gottesman and we will pay tribute to their children, Dr. Ruth and David S. Gottesman who made the founding gift which launched the expansion effort for the school.

We will also honor all those who have contributed ten thousand dollars or more to this effort by giving them a beautiful memento of this extraordinary communal project. Each memento will be personally inscribed for the donors.

The proceeds from the Ramaz Dinner Dance are devoted exclusively to the Scholarship Fund, the Curriculum Fund, and the

Special Education Fund of the School. They make possible the attendance at Ramaz of many students whose parents would otherwise not be able to afford a Ramaz education and they also give the school an opportunity to enhance the educational program for all students.

In addition, the Ramaz Dinner is the most enjoyable event of the season for any organization. It is the only Dinner that does not have speeches. It is pure fun and the evening is capped by an outstanding performance of the Ramaz Upper School Chorus and Dance Troupe, strengthened by a delegation from the upper grades of the new Middle School.

We hope that many members of the KJ family will want to participate in what promises to be another great event and a most enjoyable evening.

In Memoriam

Dr. Beatrice Friedland

A grand lady in the New York Jewish community was taken from us after a short but difficult illness. She was a warm, exceptionally loving person who was cherished by her family, by her many friends and by the communities in which she was active.

Dr. Friedland received her Ph.D. in biology from NYU in 1944, long before women generally achieved such an academic status. She was the founding chairman of the Biology Department at Stern College for Women where she educated a generation of young women who both learned from her and loved her as a person. She was Teacher of the Year in 1977 and the guest of honor at the Stern College Dinner last year when she received a Doctor of Humane Letters Honorary Degree.

She was generous to many causes and particularly to our congregation in which she made her home over the past twenty-eight years. She suffered the loss of her beloved husband, Arthur, twenty years ago but carried on a vigorous, joyous, enthusiastic and productive life right to the last moment. She was an inspiration to her children, grandchildren and to a wide circle of friends.

PROCEDURES FOR LIGHTING CHANUKAH CANDLES

BEGINNING WITH FRIDAY EVENING, DECEMBER 3

While the practice of gift giving has become an integral part of the Festival of Lights, the lights themselves are the principal observance of the holiday and should be highlighted as the central feature of Chanukah in the home.

The following are a few items which should be kept in mind.

1. *The Menorah* — While one Menorah suffices for the household, it is customary — and desirable — for each member of the household to light his own Menorah. This is particularly recommended for the children of the family who will take special delight in kindling their own Chanukah lamps.

2. *The Time for Lighting* — The candles should be lit as soon as possible after nightfall (30 minutes after sunset). They should be allowed to burn for at least 30 minutes.

On Saturday night at home, the candles are lit after Havdalah. *On Friday afternoon, they are lit before the Sabbath candles* and they should be large enough so that they will remain lit for about an hour and a half.

3. *Arranging the Candles* — The candles are set from the right side of the Menorah as the candle lighter faces it. Each night an additional candle is lit.

4. *Lighting the Candles* — The candles are lit from left to

right — starting with the newest candle first. We begin by lighting the “Shamash.” Then the blessings are recited — three on the first night and two on the other nights. After the blessings are recited, we light the candles by the flame of the “Shamash.”

The reason for using the “Shamash” is in order to avoid any practical use of the Chanukah candles. These lights are holy and their sole purpose is the ritual one — to proclaim the miracle of Chanukah.

5. *Concluding Songs* — Following the lighting of the candles, we sing *ha-Nerot haLalu*, which explains the reasons for the ceremony, and *Maoz Tzur*, a ballad which describes in several stanzas how Divine Providence has intervened at various points in history to save us from our enemies.

CHANUKAH CANDLES

Through the courtesy of the Kehilath Jeshurun Benevolent Fund, Chanukah candles have been sent to every recipient of the *KJ Bulletin*.

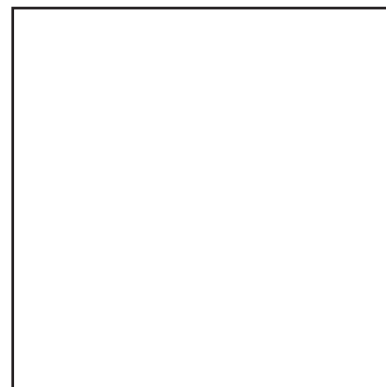
The proceeds of this Fund are used for deserving individuals who might not otherwise come to the attention of public charity.

Dear Rabbi Lookstein:

The Jewish High Holy Days come once again, reminding our world of who created it, who blesses it with life and who judges it in his merciful justice. G-d who gives all humanity the dignity of being made in his image, has chosen Israel as his particular people that they may be an example of faithfulness for all the nations of the earth. With sincere love and true admiration for your fidelity to the Covenant, I am happy once again to send my greetings for a blessed New Year.

This Sabbath evening, as the celebration of Rosh Hashanah commences, a new decade will begin. During the year of 5760 we will start a new era of the year 2000, the turn of another millennium in our history. Our Holy Father, Pope John Paul II, has asked all Christians to enter this new millennium in the spirit of Jubilee. Part of the process of

Jubilee is a call for *teshuva*, or repentance. Ash Wednesday, March 8th, has been specially set aside as a day for Catholics to reflect upon the pain inflicted on the Jewish people by many of our members of the last millennium. We most sincerely want to start a new era.
