Get ready for an unforgettable Shabbat at KJ! There is really no other way to put it. Bring yourselves. Bring your family. Bring friends. Bring everyone you know. There has been so much interest in the weekend already, that we have had to move one of the programs out of a member's home into the synagogue, because more space is needed to hold the number of

Torah, song, and, if we are fortunate, maybe even dance. We will become part of a spiritual Renaissance that has its roots in the Carlebach synagogue on the West Side, but whose branches have spread to the rest of the West Side, Riverdale, Teaneck, Los Angeles, Jerusalem, Efrat, and many other areas.

To desire an intense spiritual experience at KJ is in no way meant to imply a lack of spirituality here on a regular basis, much the way the same new infusion of spirituality in Jerusalem does not mean that there was a spirituality missing from the holiest city in the world. Many of us have been elsewhere on Shabbat and gain an appreciation for how things are done at KJ. Most every Shabbat, a visitor to our shul will either tell, call, or write to express gratitude for the way in which services are conducted at KJ. What is desired is a glimpse of what we can add to our services, to further enhance our davening.

Our two guests for the weekend will be working hand in hand to provide this experience. While they will each lead parts of the program individually, they will twice work as a team, complementing each other as people, as their Torah and song complement each other as vehicles toward greater depth in Torah and spirituality.

On Friday evening, Dr. Elli Kranzler will lead the davening in the traditional Shlomo Carlebach style. Later that night at 8:00 PM Dr. Kranzler and our Shabbat Scholar Rabbi Menachem Leibtag will alternate with Divrei Torah

and song to create a true atmosphere of Oneg Shabbat. This program will take place in the Riklis Social Hall.

Saturday morning, Dr. Kranzler will once again serve as Chazan and Rabbi Leibtag will deliver the sermon in the form of a shiur. In the afternoon, Rabbi Leibtag will teach a class before Mincha. Mincha will be followed by a Seudah Shlishit that we will begin and

end with Dr. Kranzler's songs and stories, which will be interrupted by a short lecture by Rabbi Leibtag. When you come to Seudah Shlishit, be prepared to end Shabbat a little later than the actual ending time. At this time of the year, Shabbat is over quite early and we use that as an opportunity to extend Shabbat a little longer to achieve the full benefit of our guests.

This will be a learning experience for all — the Rabbis, the Chazan, the officers and officials, and for you and the entire congregation. Show up! Bring everyone you can with you. It should prove to be an unforgettable Shabbat at KJ.

It was truly a spiritually spectacular Yom Tov at Kehilath Jeshurun. More than 2,500 people participated in our services, including hundreds of children, more than 500 Beginners, and packed houses in the Main Synagogue, Heyman Auditorium, and Riklis Social Hall. We enthusiastically thank all those who played a role in making them so meaningful.

Of course, the organization of the services, and the minute by minute flow of things was overseen by our Ritual Director, Chaim Ophir and our Gabbaim, Brian Haimm, Robert Kurzweil, Asher Levitsky, John Lieberman and Jay Lunzer.

From the beginning, the tone was set by Rabbi Haskel Lookstein, Rabbi Joshua Lookstein and Rabbi Eliezer Rubin. They instilled in us a sense of hope and promise for the coming year. Their leadership was emotionally uplifting and on the spiritual side, quite moving.

The season started on the Saturday night of Labor Day Weekend when Cantor Mayer Davis led us in the most beautiful Selichot services we have had in recent memory. Congregational participation was at an all time high for Selichot.

AM HASEFER BOOK DISCUSSION CLUB MEETING MOVED TO DECEMBER 12 A RETURN TO MODESTY: DISCOVERING THE LOST VIRTUE AUTHOR WENDY SHALIT TO BE PRESENT

The first Am Hasefer Book Discussion Club meeting of the year, to which all members of the congregation are invited, will be held in the home of Audrey and Rabbi Haskel Lookstein on Sunday evening, December 12, at 8:00 PM. The book under discussion, *A Return to Modesty: Discovering the Lost Virtue* was written by KJ member Wendy Shalit. The author will be present for the discussion.

With humor and piercing insight, Shalit invites us to look beyond the blush and to consider the new power to be found in an old idea. She maintains that the sex education curriculum forced on those of her generation at an early age is fundamentally flawed, centered as it is on overcoming reticence — what we today call "hang-ups."

Shalit persuasively argues that without these misnamed "hang-ups" there can be no true depth of relations between men and women. The natural inclination toward modesty is not a hang-up that we should set out to cure, but rather a wonderful instinct, that if rediscovered, and given the right social support, has the power to transform society.

A Return to Modesty: Discovering the Lost Virtue is brilliantly presented and challengingly provocative, written with style, passion, and plenty of wit that should make for great reading and a wonderful evening of discussion.

KJ BEGINNERS TO JERUSALEM by Linda Heller

Early this summer, Kehilath Jeshurun Beginners traveled to Jerusalem. There, Rabbi Yitz Motechin joined Isralight's Rabbi Dovid Aaron, Rabbi Binny Freedman and other Isralight teachers in immersing us in the beauty and wisdom of Judaism. Our Beit Midrash was a former Crusader hospice which overlooked the Kotel. To spend our days studying and to then step outside and immediately face the Temple Mount was a life-changing experience. We felt the holiness of Jerusalem in the deepest part of our hearts.

Some of our time was spent touring, again as students, with Rabbi Binny reading us Psalms and Torah portions at the sites where these events took place. The Bible took on a new reality. It was as though we were stepping into the Torah and traveling with Abraham, camping with David, or searching for donkeys with Saul.

We also learned modern history. An unforgettable moment occurred on the Golan Heights when we stopped at a little-known monument to offer prayers and songs in honor of those who had died fighting and came upon a group of inductees. All of them had grown up in difficult circumstances

and were now being taught leadership skills. At Rabbi Binny's invitation, these young soldiers joined us as we sang "Oseh Shalom." Their sweetness and willingness were especially moving because we knew that they would put their lives on the line to defend Israel for Jews everywhere.

Later that evening, we sailed the Kinneret (Sea of Galilee). As the sea and sky became the same rich, deepening blue, we glided past the hills which had been home to Rabbi Akiva and Rabbi Joseph Caro. In love with Israel, we sang nigunim and listened to Rabbi Binny's young daughter give a D'var Torah. On Shabbat we were welcomed into homes and shown the warmth and generosity of the Jewish community. For two weeks nothing distracted us from living a Jewish life. We felt God's presence as never before. Each class brought us closer to Him. And we began to understand the magnitude of His gift of Israel to the Jewish people and with it, our responsibility. So many generations of Jews were denied entry to Jerusalem. We Kehilath Jeshurun Beginners are so fortunate to have been offered this special and moving experience.


