THE MAIN READING

The main reading of the Megillah will be in the Main Synagogue beginning with Mincha services at 6:15 PM.

Teenagers of the congregation who are students in the Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein Upper School of Ramaz will lead the Maariv service and read the Megillah.

Children from nursery age through grade 6 should arrive between 6:00 and 6:15 PM and should meet in the Etra Chapel on the lobby level. Members of our youth department staff under the direction of our youth

director, Ari Segal, will be in charge of the children that evening.

DR. DEENA COHEN ZIMMERMAN TO BE KJ SHABBAT SCHOLAR

Amongst eight women who completed a two-year program to become halachic consultants is Dr. Deena Zimmerman who will be our next Shabbat Scholar, March 24-25. Deena, who grew up at KJ and is a graduate of Ramaz is the daughter of Dr. Charles Cohen and Naomi Cohen. The program was created by the Keren Ariel Institute for Jewish Law at Nishmat, the Jerusalem Center for Advanced Jewish Study for Women.

The graduation ceremony — with the participation of Minister for Diaspora Affairs Rabbi Michael Melchior, Dr. Norman Lamm, and Zevulun Orlev of the National Religious Party — marked the entry of Orthodox Jewish women into an area which in our times has been the sole purview of men.

The Keren Ariel program trains



women to become experts in the laws of family purity. Graduates of the program will now fill a vacuum in a highly sensitive area where women want and need to consult another woman. They will assist couples in finding solutions to infertility problems and halachic issues that deal with personal questions.

"This is the first time in Jewish

history that women have been fully qualified to serve in a communal role as halachic advisors to women," stated Nishmat dean and founder Rabbanit Chana Henkin. "I feel history looking over our shoulders. And equally important, we have succeeded in doing this with the backing of prominent rabbis, who are thrilled at the entry of women into this field of halachic consultation.

Melchior cited Nishmat's program as a "breakthrough for the Orthodox world" without violating Halacha. He noted the thirst for Torah learning on the part of Orthodox women today, and the need for women to play a central role in Judaism.

Dr. Zimmerman said, "Family purity involves such intimate questions that women really need to be able to consult with other women. As a physician, I already had the medical answers. Now, I also have the halachic ones. You would not believe how many women have approached me with questions they were too embarrassed to ask their rabbis!"

Noted author Anne Roiphe will discuss her book, 1185 PARK AVENUE: A MEMOIR at a meeting of the Am Hasefer Book Discussion Club on Sunday evening, March 12 at 8:00 PM. The discussion will take place at the home of Sandy and Dr. Robert April at 1185 Park Avenue. Dr. April will moderate the discussion.

Roiphe has always drawn on her family history in her novels and in her non-fiction. This memoir, 1185 PARK AVENUE, however, tells all, revealing the harsh, intimate secrets of her father, mother, brother, and of Roiphe herself.

The book is a compelling insider's view of what it was like to grow up in a rich, Jewish immigrant family in the 1940's and 1950's. She despised the newly rich and their longing to assimilate and become the "real Americans" even if she could not join their clubs, which were not open to Jewish girls.

This marks another outstanding communal role for Irwin in the service of his *alma mater* from which he is a college graduate and also from which he received rabbinic ordination from the late Rav Soloveitchik and Dr. Belkin, of blessed memory.

Irwin has served on the Board of Yeshiva University with great distinction and he took the Chairmanship of the Board of the Bernard Revel Graduate School at a time when that school was in danger of disappearing. It was under his leadership that BRGS turned around and it is now on a very sound financial and educational footing. We have every confidence that Irwin will serve with similar distinction in his new role as Chairman of the most important school of Yeshiva University and we wish him well in his tenure in office.

THE PUBLICATION OF THE RAV'S WRITINGS

At the same time, the first volume in a series to be known as The Rav: of Rabbi Joseph B. The World Soloveitchik was published. This marks the beginning of the publication of the manuscripts of Rabbi Joseph B. KJ TO AGAIN HOST SHABBAT ACROSS AMERICA Friday Evening, March 31

In synagogues across the United States, 65,000 North American Jews will gather on Friday evening, March 31, in an effort to revitalize Shabbat observance. Kehilath Jeshurun will be one of those sites.
