As Chatan Torah we are pleased to honor the Gabbai Emeritus of KJ, Irwin B. Robins. Irwin has been one of the most active and involved members of our congregation throughout a tenure of some forty years.

A graduate of Amherst College and Harvard Law School, Irwin served as a Trustee and as Secretary and Treasurer of the congregation. He was one of the leaders of our Soviet Jewry effort in the 1970s and 80s. When we first began our Parallel Service in the Auditorium 35 years ago, it was Irwin who gave it structure and worked on every detail in order to make it an integral part of KJ. He created the position of Gabbai and gave selflessly of himself for many years in helping to honor those who might otherwise have been ignored. He has always been a specialist in welcoming new worshipers in our House of God.

His wife, Sue, is known in our community as a one-woman chesed gang, deeply involved in *bikur cholim*, *chevra kadisha* and every aspect of

**AM HASEFER BOOK DISCUSSION CLUB
TO REVIEW ELIE WIESEL'S
“AND THE SEA IS NEVER FULL: MEMOIRS 1969”
RABBI HASKEL LOOKSTEIN
TO LEAD DISCUSSION
SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 19, 8:00 PM**

The first meeting of the year of the Am HaSefer Book Discussion Club will take place at the home of Rabbi Haskel and Audrey Lookstein, 993 Park Avenue at 84th Street.

“AND THE SEA IS NEVER FULL” is Elie Wiesel’s memoir of the period between 1969 and the present. A political activist, he begins the book remembering a challenge given to himself at age 40: “I will become militant. I will teach, share, bear witness. I will reveal and try to mitigate the victims’ solitude.” He defends dissidents in the Soviet Union; draws attention to the atrocities of Cambodia and Bosnia; and fights apartheid in South Africa. He attacks Holocaust deniers, stands with Lech Walesa in Poland, visits Albania as a representative of President Clinton, and wins the Nobel Peace Prize.

Wiesel's tragic boyhood compelled him to work very hard to love the world. He has learned to do so, and this memoir, like all of his best writings, teaches its readers to love the world while looking directly at its greatest terrors.

He makes words his weapon, and in these pages we relive with him his unstinting battles. Wiesel concludes his memoirs in his characteristically engaging and conversational tone. He tells us about his marriage to Marion (for the first time, at age forty), his frequent meals with Golda Meir and Teddy Kollek, and the birth of his son Elisha, a Ramaz graduate. We read about his exploits as human rights activist at a meeting in Paris to protest UNESCO's policy towards Israel.

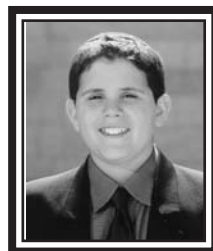
