NEW KIDDUSH DISCUSSIONS

An important addition to the KJ adult education menu this year has been the Kiddush Discussion. Each Kiddush Discussion features a KJ rabbi and a member of our community who is an expert in the particular field under discussion.

The discussions seek to combine Torah and secular analysis of cuttingedge issues facing us and the wider community. These discussions take place following services and Kiddush is served as part of the program.

Topics already discussed include *Medical Ethics* (featuring Rabbi Barry Gelman and Dr. Alan Tuchman), *Ethics and Leadership* (panel consisting of Rabbi Eliezer Rubin, Hank Sheinkopf and Steve Goldberg), and *The Death Penalty and Defending the Guilty* (featuring Rabbi Joshua Cypess and Barry Kluger, Chief Assistant District Attorney in Bronx County). Lively discussions were followed by many thought-provoking questions. Rabbi Barry Gelman, who

initiated this program, reports that the attendance at the Kiddush Discussions has grown to a standing room only crowd.

There has been great enthusiasm as people learn that the Torah has views and insights on issues which we face regularly.

One enthusiastic attendee at the "Ethics and Leadership" discussion said "This was a wonderful opportunity to learn about an issue from the Torah perspective but also hear from political experts who had fascinating insights about ethics and leadership."

On February 8th, Rabbi Haskel Lookstein and Dr. Lawrence Bryskin will discuss "Homosexuality and the Struggle of Jewish Observance."

These and other future programs will be of great interest to the entire KJ Community. Everyone is urged to attend.

AN HISTORIC CHANUKAH VISIT TO THE WHITE HOUSE

On the fifth day of Chanukah, I joined twenty-five other Jews in the White House sitting around a table facing President George W. Bush. As I listened to him and watched him in action during the Chanukah Menorah lighting ceremony that was highlighted by the singing of the Ramaz Chamber Chorus group, I was struck first by his menschlichkeit. I saw him greet each and every one of the children after they sang, shaking their hands and having a word for each of them. I saw his expression of admiration for our peerless music director, Caroll Goldberg, who has given the gift of music and song to these children. I saw his graciousness as he greeted me and everyone else who came for this celebration.

But sitting around the table at three o'clock in the afternoon in a small group, I saw something else that was

perhaps more important. I saw up close the character of a President who is leading us and the world in this struggle between good and evil. In his brief remarks to us, I saw his clarity of vision, his focus on the job that has to be done, his uncomplicated perception about who the bad guys are and who the good guys are. He isn't afraid to say it clearly, emphatically and with conviction. He sees today's struggle against terror in black and white terms, something for which we have to be grateful as we hear and read the words of others who are confused by pluralism and multi-culturalism, which have a place in our world, but not in this particular struggle.

I saw a President who does not equivocate on the nature of this struggle. He knows that the wicked do not equivocate and he realizes that we must not either; otherwise we are in grave trouble.

He sees Israel as the *tzadikim* and Prime Minister Sharon as the righteous when compared with the Palestinian Authority and its terrorist leadership.

As I sat across from him I thought about all of this, and when I had an opportunity to speak, I told him that there is a blessing that Jewish law requires one to pronounce when coming face to face with royalty. The presidency of this country is royalty and so I rose and made the blessing: "Blessed art thou O Lord our God, King of the Universe who gives of His glory to flesh and blood." He answered, "Amen," and was obviously moved.

I believe that this President at this time and in this situation does represent a gift of God's glory and I pray that he will be able to continue to manifest that glory until the *resha'im* will be decisively defeated by the *tzadikim*.

RABBI HASKEL LOOKSTEIN APPOINTED TO HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION

On October 15, 2002, Rabbi Lookstein was one of 11 civil and religious leaders appointed by Mayor Michael R. Bloomberg to the Commission on Human Rights. The commission is responsible for enforcing Title 8 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York upholding the civil rights laws of the city especially in the area of discrimination in employment and housing.

Rabbi Lookstein is the only representative of the Jewish community on this board which includes leaders of other ethnic and religious communities.

The commissioners are appointed to a three year term and serve in a non-salaried position, yet they carry a badge. Rabbi Lookstein's panel assists the Commissioner, Patricia T. Gatling, about issues of discrimination and bias in the city.


