A LOOK BACK AT THE 132ND ANNUAL MEETING RICHARD JOEL INSPIRES ROBERT J. LEIFERT HONORED

The 132nd Annual Meeting of the congregation was held on Wednesday evening, April 28. A packed Heyman Auditorium turned out for what can only be described as an extraordinary experience.

87 New Members Inducted

We were proud to induct 87 new members. (A listing of the new members appears on page 8.) These 150 people joined the congregation since our last Annual Meeting in May of 2003.

All present saw the touching presentations for a group of KJ families observing their 40th and 25th anniversaries of affiliation with us. (See the listing of those families on page 7.) Along with these introductions

and honors, the synagogue elected Trustees, approved the President's appointment of Associate Trustees, and participated in the Ramaz School Annual Meeting and their election of Trustees. Lists of the elected Trustees appear in this issue.

What made the evening particularly memorable were two extraordinary moments.

RICHARD JOEL INSPIRES

The first was an inspiring presentation by Richard Joel, the new President of Yeshiva University, entitled "Our Tomorrows: A Shared Vision for the Future of Modern Orthodoxy." Mr. Joel spoke about his vision for Yeshiva University as a bastion of Modern Orthodoxy, a place where the Orthodox community could derive strength for its twin goals of Torah Umadda, embracing the Tradition in all of its power and engaging the modern world with all of its challenges. We have heard this theme before but we were newly inspired by Richard Joel, who projects the kind of personal leadership and vision that we trust will enable the Yeshiva to meet the challenges that he described and serve communities like ours as only Yeshiva University can.

ROBERT J. LEIFERT HONORED

The most poignant moment of the Annual Meeting was when Rabbi Lookstein called on Robert J. Leifert, the Executive Director of the congregation, to

ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-THREE SENIORS ARE GRADUATED FROM RAMAZ SIXTY-FIVE TO SPEND NEXT YEAR IN ISRAEL OUTSTANDING COLLEGE ADMISSIONS RECORD AND HONORS ACHIEVED BY SENIOR CLASS

At the graduation exercises of the Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein Upper School on June 16th, 123 seniors received their diplomas. Of that number, 65 will be spending next year at a variety of Torah institutions in Israel. That is an astonishing number given the current security situation in Israel. It indicates the extent of the commitment of the young people and their parents to Israel, and to the opportunities offered to high school graduates these days to deepen their Jewish and religious roots by spending a year in the Holy Land.

SHIVAH ASSAR B'TAMMUZ, TISHA B'AV AND THE THREE WEEKS JULY 6 – JULY 27

During the summer months, we mourn the destruction of both Temples in Jerusalem, which took place on the ninth of Av, and the events that led to their destruction. We fast on the seventeenth day of the month of Tammuz, Shivah Assar B'Tammuz, because, according to tradition it was on that day that the enemy penetrated the walls of Jerusalem prior to the destruction of the Second Temple. The Talmud, however, writes that these were not the only tragedies that befell the Jewish people on this day. On the seventeenth of Tammuz four more tragedies occurred: the first tablets containing the Ten Commandments were broken by Moses after the sin of the Golden Calf, the daily sacrifice was suspended during the time of the First Temple, the wicked Apostumos burned the Torah, and an idol was erected in the Temple.

Additional tragedies also befell the Jewish people on the ninth day of the month of Av - Tisha B'Av. On this day, the spies (meraglim), returned to the Jews in the desert with a negative report about the Land of Israel. In addition, it was on this day that the city of Betar was destroyed and tens of thousands of Jews were killed, and the wicked Turnus Rufus plowed the site of the Temple and surroundings. Tradition asserts that the expulsion of the Jews from England in 1290 and the expulsion from Spain in 1492 also took place on Tisha B'Av.

Our mourning for the destroyed

Temples and for the other calamities which occurred on these days, extends beyond the fasts themselves. The period between these two fasts, traditionally called The Three Weeks, includes several practices of mourning. During these three weeks we do not get our hair cut, attend weddings or involve ourselves in large joyous gatherings. During the nine days which begin on the first of Av, July 19, and continue until midday on the tenth day of Av, July 28, we are additionally forbidden to eat meat and drink wine (except on Shabbat), to go swimming, or bathe for pleasure and to do any laundry or dry cleaning that is not absolutely necessary. The Talmud writes that when the month of Av begins, our mood should reflect our mourning for the destruction of the Temples. On Tisha B'Av itself, besides fasting, we are prohibited from washing our bodies, wearing leather shoes, anointing ourselves, and having marital relations. It is also forbidden to study Torah on this day with the exception of the sections of the prophets and the Talmud that discuss the destruction. We do not wear tefillin until Mincha and the custom is to sit on low chairs like mourners until midday. Our observance of mourning also forbids us from greeting friends on Tisha B'Av.

We mourn the Temples that were destroyed over nineteen hundred years ago and we pray that we will be worthy to see God rebuild the Temple in our lifetime.

I am not planning retirement either from KJ or from Ramaz in the near future. I hope that God will give me the opportunity to serve the congregation and the school community for many years to come.

We did initiate a search for a rabbi who would eventually succeed me but we have put that matter on hold for the time being. In the meantime, we are very excited to welcome Rabbi Meir Soloveichik as the new Assistant Rabbi and we hope that he will enjoy his association with us and give us the benefit of his many professional, intellectual and personal qualities.

At Ramaz, we have initiated a search for a new Head of School. The reason is quite simple: Ramaz now numbers more than 1,100 students, in three separate centers. It is not possible for one person to lead both the congregation and the school in an effective manner.

We hope that our search will be successful. We also hope that I will be able to work together with a new Head of School to maintain the integral relationship between KJ and Ramaz and to ensure that the school remains philosophically where it is at present: a centrist, modern Orthodox yeshiva for boys and girls.

In short, I look forward to serving this wonderful community for many years to come. I hope you feel the same way.

WELCOME TO RABBI MEIR SOLOVEICHIK

Kehilath Jeshurun is proud to welcome to the rabbinic family Rabbi Meir Soloveichik, one of the bright lights in the young Orthodox rabbinate here in the United States. Rabbi Soloveichik is a graduate of the Yeshiva of Brisk High School and Yeshiva College summa cum laude, and received his semicha from the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary at Yeshiva University. For the past three years he has been a member of Yeshiva's Kollel Elyon. Rabbi Soloveichik is an Associate Fellow at the Shalem Center in Jerusalem, for whom he is currently working on a book, and has studied philosophy of religion at Yale

University's Divinity School. He is now beginning a doctoral program in philosophy of religion at Princeton University's graduate school. Rabbi Soloveichik comes to us from the Jewish Center on West 86th Street, where he was first an Intern and then Resident Scholar over the past four years.

The Congregation has heard Rabbi Soloveichik speak from the KJ pulpit twice this year: in February on "The Theological Ruminations of a Chicago Cubs Fan," and in April on "The Making of a Modern Orthodox Gadol: A Reflection on the Lives of Rabbi Yosef Dov Soloveitchik and Rabbi Ahron Soloveichik." The latter presentation was inspired by the life of Meir Soloveichik's grandfather, Rebbe and hero, Rav Ahron Soloveichik, who passed away two years ago and who exerted a powerful influence on the life of his grandson. Rabbi Soloveichik has written numerous articles, including "Redemption and the Power of Man," which appeared in the journal of Azure, and he has lectured all over the country.

Rabbi Meir Soloveichik will serve as

Assistant Rabbi at KJ. We warmly welcome Rabbi Soloveichik and his wife, Layaliza, who was valedictorian of Stern College and graduated Yale Law School, has clerked for both the Israeli Supreme Court and for the Southern District in New York, and is currently an associate at the law firm of Paul Weiss.

KJ/RAMAZ WALKS THE WALK MAY 9, 2004

Sometimes a Walk in the park is more than just a walk in the park. On Sunday, May 9, members of the KJ and Ramaz families met in Carl Schurz Park to stroll, march, amble, and meander in support of an initiative to raise funds for the purchase of defibrillators - crucial life-saving equipment - for every ambulance in Israel that has not yet been equipped with one.

What better way to spend a part of Mother's Day and Lag B'Omer than by walking to save a life? In order to raise the funds for this much needed - and expensive - equipment, families who participated in the Walk were asked to donate a minimum of \$36, and to collect additional money from sponsors who could not participate that day but wanted to have a role in this tremendous mitzvah.

Thanks to an impassioned letter from Rabbi Haskel Lookstein, and the enthusiastic response from Ramaz students, the word spread throughout our community and beyond. Private individuals stepped to the fore and donated whole defibrillators at a cost of \$2,500 each in celebration of a family event or in memory of a loved one. Classes in the Ramaz Middle School, under the stellar guidance of faculty members such as headmaster Judy Fagin and Special Events coordinator

Judy Sokolow, raised thousands of dollars for this project.

They did such an excellent job, that our Magen David Adom liaison, Gary Kenzer, visited from Chicago recently to award a plaque to these dedicated children, many of whom donated their own Bar and Bat Mitzvah money to purchase defibrillators.

One especially nice aspect of the day was the fact that so many children actively participated in a charitable act. So frequently, the exposure children have to the giving of tzedakah is the knowledge of a parent putting a check into an envelope and mailing it to an unseen cause or organization. On this day, when they were an important part of the walk itself, children could see the direct correlation between the donation and the result.

Stacy Scheinberg and Riva Alper, Sisterhood leaders the who spearheaded this initiative, are delighted to report that the \$100,000 collected thus far will translate into 40 defibrillators — and it's not over vet. Money can still be donated to increase these numbers. Everyone is capable of Walking the Walk for this invaluable project. Readers who wish to still make a difference are invited to send an earmarked check made out to the KJ Benevolent Fund.

THE JUDITH KAUFMAN HURWICH KETER TORAH AWARD

At the conclusion of the morning service on the second day of Shavuot, Sue Robins and Elisa Lunzer were presented by Rabbi Haskel Lookstein with the Second Annual Judith Kaufman Hurwich Keter Torah Awards. The award has been named in memory of Judith Kaufman Hurwich, who attended the Ramaz Elementary School as a child and

who later became a central force for women's Torah study in Israel. Among her many achievements in promoting Jewish education was helping found MaTaN with Rabbanit Malka Bina. Her family continues her tradition of association with Kehilath Jeshurun and Ramaz in fostering opportunities for women to study Torah.

KETER TORAH AWARD ADDRESS BY ELISA LUNZER SHAVUOT II – MAY 27, 2004

I want to thank you for presenting me with this wonderful award. It is a credit to my mother, Ruth (Septee) who is here with us this Yom Tov, and my late father Moe Septee, *zichrono l'vracha*, who taught by example the meaning of community service. It also means so much to me that the Keter Torah Award is named in memory of Judy Hurwich, a family friend and then, once I married Jay, a cousin too. We remember her fondly and continue to have close relationships with her children.

Talking about relationships; God instructs Moshe to recount the exodus from Egypt: "You have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I carried you out on eagles' wings, and brought you to Me." Further said Hashem: "If you will pay attention to my voice, and keep my covenant, then you shall be my treasured people from among all other peoples; for all the earth is mine."

When Moshe repeats Hashem's words to Bnai Yisrael their immediate response is, Va'ya'anu kol ha'am yachdov vayomru; kol asher diber Hashem, na'a'se: "And Bnai Yisrael answered, yachdov, together - in one voice, and said: 'All that Hashem has said, na'a'se, we will do.""

All that Hashem says – we will do. No intellectual reasoning, no preamble, no hesitation. In one voice Bnai Yisrael said we will do whatever Hashem commands. The ideal of *Na'a'seh* rings very true in this shul as well. When called upon we do not hesitate, and more often than not KJ takes a leading role in chesed programs for Israel – such as the midrachov, and heart defibrillators initiated by the Sisterhood; the business loan fund for struggling Israeli businesses; the holiday missions - or in local programming such as Lunch and Learn for Seniors, the food and clothing drives, or supporting Dorot.

On an individual basis one could not find a better example of *Na'a'seh* in this shul than my co-awardee, Sue Robins. Chairwoman of the Bikur Cholim Committee, head of the Women's Chevra Kadisha, Sue together with Irwin, open up their home to anyone and everyone. Sue never asks why; her answer is always yes, and how soon.

Rabbi Lookstein; a Keter Torah is an adornment, an enhancement of a Sefer Torah that contains more inner beauty than any object known to man. The award bestowed upon Sue and me today is a reflection not so much on what we do for the community but rather the programs and opportunities afforded us to work on behalf of the community. We look forward to continuing to serve this wonderful institution that under your guidance embodies the principles of Torah, *Avodah*, and *Gemilat Chesed* through action and deed.



present him with a special honor on the occasion of the 25th anniversary of his assumption of this important role at KJ. When the Rabbi called Bob Leifert to the lectern the entire assemblage rose and gave him a standing ovation that seemed to last minutes in duration. It was simply thrilling and heartwarming. Bob was obviously touched, as was Jackie and their whole family who were present. It was a mark of respect and love which Bob Leifert has engendered in this community since his earliest childhood and, of course, culminating with his great service to the congregation, a service which we pray will continue in the future.

Herewith follows the presentation offered by Rabbi Lookstein:

At the age of two, Bob Leifert was sitting on the lap of his maternal grandfather, Dr. Zigmund Wechsler in our Main Synagogue. Dr. Wechsler turned to his son-in-law and said: "Some day, Bob is going to be President of KJ."

Well, your grandfather got it wrong but he wasn't far from the truth. Ninety years ago, 1914, he and your grandmother, Nancy Wechsler, joined this Congregation. Your late and remarkable parents, Lillian and Ben Leifert, were leading members of the community. You were born into this community almost six decades ago, and when you married Jackie Kirschenbaum, whose parents, Cantor Ben-Zion and Sylvia are here, thank God, you immediately joined KJ even though you lived in Riverdale.

Twenty-five years ago we needed an Executive Director so we pirated one from the professional leadership of United Synagogue Youth. And we have been blessed ever since with the kind of commitment that comes from somebody who was born to serve in this congregation and who from earliest childhood had the idealism and the drive to devote himself to a life of Jewish communal service.

So many creative ideas over the last twenty-five years came from your initiative. Ramaz Shabbatonim at KJ, Chesed Committees, Chevra Kadisha, Volunteer of the Year Awards, dozens of guest speakers, right up to your suggestion that we invite the new President of Yeshiva University to address our Annual Meeting. But far more than that, you have lived and breathed KJ for the last twenty-five years. And we are so much the better because of it.

Jewish tradition says that God provides the rewards for those who serve the community. He certainly did in your case in the form of Jackie, who is a magnificent Jewish educator but also surely the most wonderful wife you could ask for; Aryeh, who is now studying for the Rabbinate and who along with his wife, Michal, is expecting a member of the fifth generation in the KJ family; and Dina, a Ba'alat Chesed, who some day is going to render very important service to the Jewish community.

Bob — you have come through a period of very difficult illness. You still face a long recovery. But we expect you to be in the KJ saddle for a long time to come.

As a mark of this anniversary of your service as Executive Director, we present you with this framed certificate done in gold leaf by Morris Wyszogrod, and we also give you something that we know you need, a beautiful Menorah. May it light your life and the life of your family for generations to come.
