# What is CSS?

The Community Security Service (CSS) is the leading Jewish volunteer security organization in the United States. Founded in 2007, the CSS was the first organization to bring to the United States a mindset long held by sister communities around the world, that protecting Jewish life and Jewish way of life starts with taking ownership of our own security. The CSS is focused on training volunteers in basic security procedures to help protect their institutions and events across the country. Through programs developed by foremost industry security experts, and tailored to various levels of interest and ability, volunteers learn to identify suspicious activity and prevent and respond to potential threatening situations. Our success stems from strong communal partnerships and established relationships with governmental agencies and law enforcement. To date, we have created a national network of over 6,000 trained volunteers, which help to protect hundreds of synagogues and Jewish community events each vear.

Can men and women sign up? Yes

#### What training is required?

Level 1 Training consists of several short online modules totaling about 4 hours, followed by a 3 hour inperson practicum.

What is the cost of the training? It is free!

# What would my role be in CSS?

Volunteers commit to a shift rotation, and perform several critical activities, including:

- · liaison with professional guards
- check the perimeter & area
- conduct building sweeps
- inspect visitors & bags
- watch the block (passing pedestrians and vehicles)

The consensus among security professionals is that outside standing shifts serve as a major threat deterrent.
