

MEET THE HONOREES

The Offenbachers are relatively new members of OZ but have already made a big impact. Introduced to the shul via Esther Varon soon after they moved to the Upper West Side in July 2022.

Rachel grew up in Woodmere, where she attended the Hebrew Academy of the Five Towns and Rockaways. She then went on to study at Shaalvim for Women in Israel. She earned her Doctor of Medicine in 2017 from at the State College of New York Downstate in 2017, graduating after completing the Sophie Davis School of Biomedical Education (a 7 year BS/MD program at CUNY).



She completed her residency in Pediatrics and fellowship in Pediatric Hematology/Oncology at the Children's Hospital at Montefiore and recently joined the faculty as an Assistant Professor where she is on a physician-scientist track at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine.

In the summer, Rachel volunteers as a physician at Camp Simcha, where she has the pleasure of seeing many of her patients enjoy time away from the hospital.

Joseph (Joe) is from Brooklyn where he attended Yeshiva of Flatbush. He went on to spend a year at Yeshivat Reishit Yerushalayim where he also volunteered as an EMT for Magen David Adom, followed by Yeshiva University where he majored in Middle Eastern Studies. After graduation he completed the one-year Presidential Fellowship in University and Community Leadership at YU followed by a post-baccalaureate at New York University before attending SUNY Downstate, graduating with Rachel. He completed his residency in Emergency Medicine at Montefiore Medical Center/Jacobi/Albert Einstein College of Medicine. He is a faculty member at NYU where he serves as an Associate Program Director of their EM program.

Rachel and Joe met through Yachad while they were both working as coordinators for the Rayim division. They were assigned to work together on a Shabbaton and the rest is history. They are the proud parents of Ari (12), Judah (8) and Asher (5).

Their meeting though Yachad set the tone for their marriage as Rachel and Joe have always been drawn to chesed within their community and beyond. Struck by the October 7th massacre, Joe quickly obtained an emergency medical license in Israel and boarded a plane to support his fellow physicians. He continues remote sessions while back in NY and returned in January for another two weeks in the emergency department. He founded the organization MiluiEM -- a partnership between the Israel Association of Emergency Medicine and emergency physicians across the world to bring experienced emergency doctors to Israel to meet current and projected clinical and academic needs.

When asked by a close friend and pilot to raise money for his unit, Joe quickly agreed. Rachel and Joe delivered the equipment to the 669 unit in March, made possible by the generous donations of the OZ community.

Rachel and Joe are proud to call OZ their spiritual home and feel blessed by the wisdom, kindness, inspiration, and guidance of Rabbi and Rebbetzin Schwartz and Rabbi and Rebbetzin Varon. They are so grateful that Esther recruited them to this truly wonderful community. They feel humbled and honored to receive the Nathan K. Gross Community Service Award and look forward to many more fruitful years with this wonderful and embracing community!
