

Torah Academy offers several programs for struggling students. When students begin to struggle with a concept, they can quickly fall behind in their academics. Torah Academy offers a Response to Intervention program called ICE. In ICE, students get one on one or small group help with the concept they find challenging. Some students need ICE support for a few classes, while other need support for a few months. ICE offers students the opportunity to catch up to their peers in Judaic and General Studies concepts if they are behind, for whatever reason.

Shaarim is our Special Education partner, offering deep academic support for students on 504 plans or IEP's. Shaarim meets with students individually to meet the needs of their special education plan. Shaarim offers support in both Judaic and General Studies programs. Shaarim also assists Torah Academy in evaluating students who are struggling and may need referrals for further services or testing. While evaluation is at no cost, there is an additional fee for Shaarim services.

Students at Torah Academy can also be referred to the public school for testing and for academic, physical, and speech services.

Torah Academy provides nursing services through the public school. Our nurse provides vision and hearing checks, keeps immunization records up to date, and teaches hand washing and deals with other health related needs with students and staff. When on site, the nurse also handles any illness or injury that may occur.

Torah Academy is pleased to offer the services of a social worker as our school counselor. Our counselor works with students, teachers and families to identify areas of concern related to health needs, academic struggles, or friendship groups. Our counselor works closely with students and staff to problem solve issues and identify needs. Social skills groups are offered in classes as well as providing individual and family assistance for confidential matters.

Torah Academy works with a local health services organization to provide evaluations and services for occupational or physical therapy needs. Torah Academy makes a recommendation to parents that services may be needed and connects them with the health service organization. Referrals are made and parents pay for the services through their medical insurance. Services can be received before, during or after school for students who qualify for services and have insurance to cover the cost of the services. This opportunity is provided as a courtesy to families and is NOT part of Torah Academy.
