Expectations

Beth Sholom Temple is dedicated to providing your child(ren) a well rounded and sound Jewish-Hebrew Education. The persons who are providing this education are volunteers within our community and are doing this very important job out of love for the children and learning. We here at Beth Sholom expect you, the parents or guardians, to support our endeavors in providing a quality education program for your child(ren).

Behavior is rarely an issue ; however, it is a topic that needs to be addressed. Each classroom will establish its own rules; the basic tenets of the rules will include respect for the teacher, fellow classmates, and the property used and/or surrounding the students. Discipline will include such methods as warnings and may include separation from the group if the need is determined. In severe cases, the child or children may be sent to the Principal or Vice-Principal for intervention. If being sent to the Principal or Vice-Principal is utilized, the parent or guardian will be notified of this instance and the offending situation.

In addition to classroom behavior, children are required to act with a certain degree of restraint within the building. They are to be supervised at all times by a parent/guardian, the teacher, or another responsible person. There is to be no running, horseplay, or throwing of objects within the Temple Building this is not respectful or other people or the property. This is especially important during the holiday seasons when the Judaica Shop has multiple display tables set up. Please, discuss with your children that during this time they should not touch or play with the objects on display as damage may be incurred and impair the purchase of these items. If your child(ren) is/are playing roughly near the tables, running, throwing objects, or playing with displays, be aware that persons attending the Judaica shop or a fellow member of the congregation may ask your child(ren) to sit quietly to the side until they are attended to by you or another responsible person.
