We're glad you've joined us this Shabbat! We are a participatory worship community and encourage you to join us in prayer and song. We've been conducting services & sponsoring programs for over 80 years, for Fredericksburg, Culpeper, Manassas, Colonial Beach and Warrenton, as well as Spotsylvania, Stafford, King George, Orange, and Caroline Counties. We first met in homes, but in 1940 we built our first building at 515 Charlotte Street, Fredericksburg. In the late 90's our growing communities required a different space. A new, larger Temple was completed in late 2001 in the England Run area of Stafford County, Virginia. Over the years we have been served by full-time rabbis, student rabbis, and lay leadership. Regardless of leadership, we always provide a place of worship and community for the greater Fredericksburg area Jews and online services are just a new way of coming together. Beth Sholom is affiliated with the Union for Reform Judaism.
