RABBI'S DESK

I don't know about you, but I don't usually think of the Torah as being effusive in its expression of emotions (other than G-D expressing His anger). It tends to be filled with lots of laws – thou shalt and thou shalt nots. Not so this week as parshas Re'eh is uncharacteristically emotional with Hashem expressing his care and love of the Jewish People.

In this week's parsha, Hashem says "Bonim atem L'Hashem Elokeichem" - You are <u>children</u> to Hashem your G-D. Quite literally he is our Father, and we are His children. We know that on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur we refer to Hashem as "Avinu Malkeinu" –

Our Father our King. Too many people focus on the Malkeinu (King) part and forget that he is also our Tatty, our Father.

Hashem also tells us that we are an "Am Kadosh" – a holy nation to Him, and that He has <u>chosen us</u> (u'vecha bachar Hashem) to be an Am segulah (a treasured nation). So many superlatives and so much focus on the uniqueness of the Jewish People and how near and dear we are to Him.

All of this should give us something to really contemplate. I once read a short comment from one of the more famous travelling rabbinic speakers: "If He is Aveinu Malkeinu (our Father our King), then you know what that makes you? A Prince! You are royalty! Remember that and live it!"

As we come into Elul and hear the call of the shofar beckoning us to Rosh Hashanah, let's keep in mind that we are nobility and live up to our potential!
