RABBI'S MESSAGE

The Tipping Point

After six years of indentured servitude, the *eved ivri* slave must be set free in the seventh year. Not only must he be set free but the master is required to send him off with some parting gifts. "*Haanek Taanik Lo mizoncha, umigarnacha, umiyikveicha*" Give him generously from your flock, from your grain and from your wine stores.

We may intuit the morality for limiting a slave's tenure of service. But why must the master send him off with such abundance?

The answer lies in the unique command phrase "haanek taanik." Though Rashi says it means give him something big and noticeable from the word *anak*, giant, R. Bachya says it means you shall honor and glorify him, *aseh lo kavod v'tiferet*. Again, we ask why?

R. Yochanan Zweig suggests that the purpose of the mitzvah can be understood in light of common tipping practice today. We tip a car attendant but not the cashier. We tip maid service but not the hotel maintenance staff. We may tip for a shoe shine but not the salesperson at the shoe store. We tip for personal service because when someone waits on us, they are in some way lowering themselves to do our bidding. To tip is to restore the balance of relationship. It's not just about showing appreciation for a job well done. You are not my servant; rather, you are a professional providing service. Therefore, to tip is to restore personal dignity to the maid, the waiter, the car attendant, etc.

When the master releases his slave after six years, he gives him a massive tip – sheep, grain, and wine – in order to restore the slave's personal dignity, and in order to rebalance and reframe the relationship that the two have shared in extremely unequal status over the last six years.

It seems therefore, based on this halakha, that to pay for service might be human, but to tip is truly Divine.
