

Haazinu

In the second verse of our Parsha, we are told that "My lessons (the Torah) should drop like rain, and My words should flow like dew." Why the two expressions dew and rain?

Rain and dew represent two sources of religious inspiration and growth. Rain falls from the sky, and thus represents the times when religious inspiration comes from the heavens like in Yom Kippur or the Shabbos, or general times when God lights a divine spark within you. Dew, on the other hand, comes from the ground, and thus represents times of religious inspiration which come from within ourselves; when we produce our own inspiration with our own minds and efforts.

The pasuk is telling us our Torah and spirituality should encompass both types of inspiration. We have to take advantage of the inspiration that God grants us, but we can't wait for that! We have to make "dew" for ourselves and take the initiative.


