

President's Message August 2020

I hope that everyone had somewhat of a respite over the summer. We are certainly in the middle of changing times and I am hopeful that as we exit Summer and move into Fall we gain the upper hand on the COVID-19 virus.

Temple Israel is working on a "new normal" concept of operations. Last Spring was filled with our reaction to the pandemic, which, for all intents and purposes, caused us to move out of our building about 3 months earlier than planned. Summer has been spent thinking and charting a course for our new future, one in which operating virtually is a major focus. There are no quick answers to how we engage a congregation virtually; this is going to be a continuous learning curve as we try things out. Some approaches will take hold and work, and some ideas will fall to the wayside. As always, we welcome your input.

Here are some highlights of our issues and solutions over the summer and looking forward through the remainder of 2020. In 2021 we'll see what works and what doesn't as we feel our way in this new world.

- Religious Services such as Shabbat, Life Cycle Events, High Holidays: We are focusing on operating virtually, whether it be via YouTube, Zoom, or some other method yet to be determined. As our Rabbi stated in her previous email, this year's High Holidays will be observed virtually, with links to services being sent out to the membership. This is due to taking Coronavirus precautions and our new building status (which I'll get to in a moment). This is a huge undertaking; even Shabbat services are more complex than meets the eye. Since we live in a digital age, we are planning to send the majority of the High Holiday booklets out via email with a limited number of booklets being printed and sent through postal mail for those who do not have email capability. Tishrei memberships will be available online through ShulCloud.
- Religious School: We will be operating virtually via Zoom for Sunday School and Hebrew School. As with religious services, a lot happens behind the scenes to make this work; being a teacher is difficult already, but keeping kids engaged online really amps things up. Parents know this already with virtual public/private school. To help prepare ourselves, the temple teachers, principal, and Rabbi are attending an in-service training by Behrman House called "Creative and Playful Ways to Engage Learners on Zoom". This is in addition to the school's planning meetings.
- New building: The new building is still under construction and we have funds to complete the project. The building roof is dried in, rooftop air conditioning units are soon to be installed, followed by connection to electricity. Windows and doors have been installed. We have a wonderful drive thru entrance covered by a canopy!! The building exterior is painted, with beautiful stone on the eastern wall. Site grading in preparation for drainage installation has begun. Signage has been ordered. Kitchen appliances will soon be ordered. On the inside, electrical wiring is nearly complete. Drywall is installed and painting will begin imminently. We have applied for two Grants, one for commercial playground equipment and the other for a garden on the building east side, which we call Gan Tikvah, or Garden of Hope. Impacts from coronavirus have affected the schedule but we are still looking to construction completion by the end of September (previously was end of August).

Our Certificate Of Occupancy (CO) will probably be in October because County inspections will likely take longer due to inspector/inspection delays. We are hopeful to receive a temporary CO in August which will allow move-in of items from storage ahead of opening. This projected delay in a CO is a major factor in conducting High Holidays virtually since we will likely not have the CO in our new building in September. We have begun discussions about how to implement reduced building occupancy if we can reopen in October with coronavirus restrictions in place. We still plan on a Grand Opening/Gala sometime in the future in the new building and our Annual Congregational Meeting this November (either via Zoom or in person).

- *Budget, income, and operating expenses*: The temple received funding from the Paycheck Protection Program and a forgivable loan from the Small Business Administration. As I have said in previous messages, these are tough times, both for our emotional/physical well-being and financially. Our congregation has been amazing in both areas; Rabbi Hickman, along with the Caring Chavurah committee, led by Lynda Wilson, have reached out to so many members of our congregation and community. Our membership has been very gracious with donations and dues payments. These factors combine to give us a “leg up” and its looking good to meet our 2020 budget. This plan works as long as there are continued payment of member dues and High Holiday donations. As expected, operating expenses have been dramatically reduced by moving out of the building at 7350 Lake Andrew Drive. By emailing the High Holiday booklets out via email (with a limited number of booklets printed and sent through postal mail) we will save about \$1,000. In addition, donations can be made online through ShulCloud. If you are financially able, please help us meet our budgetary goals and consider a High Holiday donation. If all goes as we plan, this may be the year that we get ahead (financially) and begin 2021 with a head start.

I know this message is getting to be long in the tooth so I will end with one last subject: election of a slate of Board of Directors for 2021. To this end, per our By-Laws, a nomination committee has been formed and is led by the current 1st Vice President (Joel Askinazi) and the immediate Past President (Jeff Fishkin). If you have an interest in serving on the Board...a vision of what kind of temple we should be...or want to understand how Temple Israel is run...please consider putting your name in the hat. There are several positions coming open in 2021.

It's at this point in my message that I will let you know I will not seek another term as your President. It's time that I step down and give someone else a chance. I've been on the Board for 8 years in positions ranging from Trustee to 1st / 2nd VP and now finishing up as President. And before that I served in several other positions including Chair of the House Committee. During my term in these positions I've seen the temple evolve; yes, there been ups and downs. Teams that I have been a part of or have led brought many improvements in the way we do business. Plus, I am priveledged to have a stake in a brand-new temple. I could never have done the job if it weren't for so many dedicated people who believe in what they do, who also want to make a difference in people's lives. To those and the rest of the congregation: thank you for your support, knowledge, and wisdom. It's the people and our relationships that I cherish the most. Thank you for believing in me and giving me the opportunity to serve you in these capacities. It's something I will never forget and is a highlight in my life.

Beginning in 2021, Joel Askinazi has chosen to continue to serve on the Board as a Trustee and Mike Slotkin has volunteered to be considered for President. Both have excellent minds and personalities; they will serve well in those positions and they have my wholehearted support.

As for me, I will remain on the Board still...you're still stuck with me for a bit (if that's ok). I have my eye on Financial Secretary but we'll see how the new Board slate shapes up. I also plan on applying for Grants on behalf of the Temple; we have a great committee and always need help (hint, hint;). In 2021, I hope to have more time and get back to one of my favorite hobbies, woodworking in my garage.




