The following list of Resources was compiled by the members of Beit R'fuah -- House of Healing -- at Congregation Beth Am in Los Altos Hills California.

Beit R'fuah is a support group for both individuals and family members who cope with mental health issues. We are lay led by a congregation member who is a National Alliance on Mental illness trained facilitator.

Our meetings are strictly confidential. We share a meal, have sharing time and share group strategies for coping as well as community resources available. We have guest speakers, music programs and holiday celebrations. We are listed in the congregational newsletter, in weekly announcements and online.

This Resources list was designed to gather critical information about services available in our local community available to those needing help for themselves or loved ones who are dealing with mental illness. It is important to note that specific counties provide different services so it's important, especially in time of crisis, to know what is available where you live.

The list also includes general resources that can help to inform both those in need and members of congregational communities about mental illness and to help combat the stigma that is still associated with it.

We encourage others to use this list as a template for gathering a list specific to their communities. Having the list prominently available to clergy and congregation members will, we believe, help those in need, especially those in crisis, get the help they need.
