

# A Message from Rabbi Fasman

Kohelet (Ecclesiastes 7:1) makes a remarkable

statement: "the day of one's death is better than the day of one's birth." Surely death is not better than life in any part of Jewish tradition and thought. Other religions see death as the ultimate goal of life, the "payoff." But Judaism, while insisting on the immortality of the soul, never celebrates or eagerly anticipates the death of the body.

Actually, this statement concerning life and death is the second part of a verse, the complete text of which is: טוב שם משמן טוב ויום המות מיום הולדו (tov shem mi-shemen tov ve-yom ha-mavet mi-yom hivaldo) – "A good name is better than good oil, and the day of death [is better] than the day of one's birth." Our commentators understand this verse to be teaching that all commodities, such as olive oil are ultimately consumed – over time, they diminish and disappear. But a good name lasts – and is not diminished over time.

We should read the second part of the verse in light of the first part: one's name at the time of death is better and more meaningful than it is at birth. At birth, a name is just a label. It may be chosen to perpetuate the name of someone who has died or someone who is living. A name tells us very little about a newborn. But eventually that name will be attached to the person, not a namesake.

The names of our legacy congregations are as meaningful as they are ever going to be. The congregations to which they were attached have reached the end of their century-long lives. Anywhere in the St. Louis Jewish community (or throughout the Jewish world), it has meant something to say you were a member of Brith Sholom Kneseth Israel or Shaare Zedek. The name of each of our legacy congregations was attached to a history and to the names of congregants and rabbis and hazzanim who have been associated with that congregation.

Our newborn congregation's name "Kol Rinah" means very little to anyone. But soon, the name Kol Rinah will be associated with our names and with our unique programs (and, eventually, traditions). Each of us is responsible for building our name; each of us can make a significant

difference in the meaning of the words "Kol Rinah." Our friends and colleagues will know what Kol Rinah stands for because they know us. Will we be known as leaders in singing, or social action, or Jewish learning, or social networking, or creative programming ... or will "Kol Rinah" mean "same old thing?" That's up to us.

When a child is born, it is the parents who have the greatest influence as to what their child's name means. We are the ones who have given birth to our new congregation. We have given it a name – Kol Rinah. It is up to us to shape what that name means – now and for generations to come, here and around the world.

Welcome to the world, Kol Rinah. It is an awesome responsibility and a great privilege for us, together, to determine and shape the meaning of our new name, Kol Rinah.

### It's Official! The Merger is Complete!

At the time this column is being composed, the only remaining requirement for the completion of the merger is for the official Decree to be filed by the Missouri Secretary of State, which hopefully happens by the end of June.

So now what?

The immediate changes are already occurring. The new Kol Rinah logo will be more visible in signage, stationery and electronic and hard copy communications.

The Kol Rinah leaders and Board of Directors have been working to institute all changes necessary to conduct the day to day business of the new shul which will be instituted when all of the legal details are finalized by the state.

The personnel and search committees are actively reviewing resumes for a professional person to fill the vacancy left by Hazzan Dulkan with her move to the East Coast. The first candidate for the position, Carol Chesler, has spent a weekend with our congregation leading Shabbat services, meeting with members, professional and lay leaders. The committee expects to interview more individuals and make selections for other candidate visits. How long this process will take is unknown, but it is the charge of the committee to be sure the person who is selected is right for Kol Rinah.

Plans for the High Holidays are beginning with Rabbi Fasman and the Ritual Committee. Details to date are:

1. Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur services will be at the Linden location.
2. Melissa Cohen will be the Cantorial Soloist for the third year, having participated in services with the legacy BSKl congregation the past two years.
3. All seating will be open, which means tickets will be required to attend the services, but there will not be assigned seats.
4. Rabbi Fasman will be housed within walking distance of the Linden campus during the High Holidays.
5. Rabbi Paul has declined the invitation from the

congregation to return to St. Louis to participate in services. He has made the decision for personal and family reasons.

The Facility Committee continues to manage the move from Linden to Hanley for the short term location of the congregation. The committee is also looking at all possible options for the future and permanent home for Kol Rinah. There are some promising options, and for reasons of privacy and uncertainty the information must be kept confidential. If any of those possibilities become promising realities the members will be informed of all facts.

For the immediate short term, Rabbi Fasman will be away for vacation the month of July. The spiritual and personal needs of all members of Kol Rinah will be taken care of in his absence by local rabbis and lay leaders. Lay leaders and special guests will be davening and leading services on Shabbats and daily minyans.

With the completion of the merger, a new energy and vibrancy can be felt among the members. The creation of Kol Rinah is an important and major accomplishment in the St. Louis Jewish Community.

However, the work continues with more goals to be reached. I invite all interested members to be participants and contributors to the exciting future of Kol Rinah.

Summer is just beginning and I wish all of you a safe and happy one as you travel and enjoy seasonal activities.



The JOLT program is a very successful community based high school Jewish education program. This opportunity will allow our students to combine with other

high school students from all over St. Louis. JOLT offers opportunities to build friendships and numerous choices of study so that each student can put their time and energy into what is important to them in terms of their interests and Jewish Identities.

It of course is all about our students. I am truly looking forward to continuing to work with our innovative, creative, and passionate staff members who make our program a success.




