A Message from Rabbi Fasman

The Book of Genesis is filled with journeys. Perhaps the most famous is the one that begins with a call to Abraham, nearly 4,000 years ago:

לך-לך מארצך וממולדתך
ומבית אביך אל הארץ אשר אראך

"go for yourself from your land, from your relatives, and from your father's house to the land that I will show you" [Gen 12:1].

Others left their father's house: Jacob had to flee for his life, and his son Joseph was sold into slavery. Moses was placed in a basket and floated downstream away from his birthplace and his father's house.

But only Abraham had to leave his father's gods, his father's values, and his family. He even got a new name. Of course, Abraham took Sarah with him. And his nephew Lot and Lot's wife. However, in terms of their past identity and culture they traveled light.

So, on what kind of journey is Kol Rinah? Kol Rinah is a newborn. We have begun a new journey with a new name. But what do we take with us? Do we leave our buildings? Yes. Do we leave our histories? Yes. But do we leave our culture? And our values?

We have left BSKI and Shaare Zedek – we have begun to leave things behind. Physical things: buildings, plaques, photographs, sanctuaries, social halls... and also cultural things: ritual practices, policies and procedures. And some people as well.

There are some who see our congregational journey as an Abrahamic journey – cutting our ties with our birthplace, our birth culture, our parents' values. Starting anew. Not looking back.

I disagree. Ours is not a journey like that of Abraham. We want – and need – to bring with us as many members of our legacy congregations as we can. We have institutional commitments – we are still a Conservative congregation. We have many, many emotional ties to things and practices and people and melodies that we want to carry forward. That's one way we know Kol Rinah is *ours*: we recognize it in the stuff we carry forward.

We know that, even without a merger, we were going to have to change in order to survive. Unlike Abraham, we do not start from scratch. We still need to meet the needs of our current members – otherwise, we will fail.

We also know that our members' needs are changing, and that we need to draw a new demographic, probably from the unaffiliated. In most cases, the needs of the unaffiliated are being met – they *want* to be unaffiliated. But there are a number of unaffiliated Jews who are looking for a meaningful, joyous, culturally welcoming, intellectually stimulating, socially responsible community to which they can attach themselves and their families.

We can be that community without throwing out all that is precious about our past. How we do that is our primary challenge in the months ahead.

*Anita Kraus has resigned her position of Director of Kol Rinah Religious School effective Sept. 30. The Personnel Committee has selected and hired Paula Hertel as the interim director for the remainder of the school year. Paula is an experienced educator in public schools grade K-5 and local religious school and CAJE programs. We are happy to have her with us.

The search for a permanent religious school director will begin soon.

*The Facilities Committee will begin the very big job of shuttering the Linden building, and all shul services will be conducted at the Hanley location for the short term.

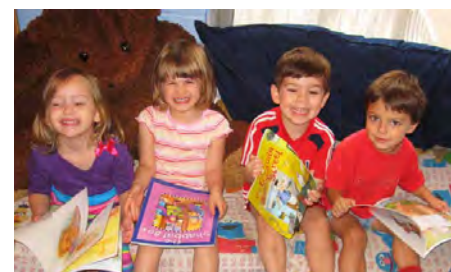

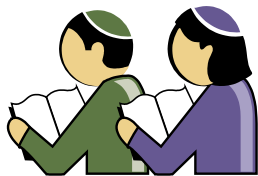

***Memory*: A Novel by Philippe Grimbert**

Twenty years after his mother and father jumped to their deaths from a balcony, Philippe Grimbert has written a gripping novel about the hidden memories that dominated their lives. A colossal bestseller in Europe, *Memory* is the story of a family haunted by the secret of their past: an illicit love affair, a lost child, and a devastating betrayal dating back to the Second World War.



Nancy Berg is Professor of Hebrew and Comparative Literature at Washington University, where she also holds courtesy appointments in WGSS (Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies) and IAS (International and Area Studies). Her teaching includes courses on Hebrew, Jewish, and Middle Eastern literatures, and Israeli society. She has lived and worked in the Middle East - Cairo, Jerusalem, Tel Aviv - for several years.

Her first book, *Exile from Exile*, explores the writings of Israeli Jews from Iraq, heirs to the longest continuous Jewish community: Babylonian Jewry. She has completed a book manuscript *We Remember Babylon*, about the ways in which Israeli immigrant writers remember home.

Prof. Berg has also written on the Israeli mystery, women writers, food in literature, place, memory, and the choice of language. Works in progress include a study of the father-daughter relationship in Israeli literature, an anthology of exile, and a project on women's creativity.

She currently serves as president of the National Association of Professors of Hebrew.
