Kol Rinah is our traditional Shabbat morning services with full Torah reading, opportunities for celebrating simchas, coffee bar, participatory lay-led and clergy-led prayers, Torah Talk, sermons and weekly kiddush lunch with lots of schmooze time.

Kol Rinah is our Early Childhood Center, creating Jewish connections for young children and their families as we raise a generation.

Kol Rinah is our staff, board, officers, and committees that ensure that we have the resources, smooth operations and governance we need.

Kol Rinah is our Friday night services, with a wide and sophisticated musical repertoire bringing moments of joy and introspection at week's end.

Kol Rinah is our multigenerational population, all of whom bring their own wisdom, perspectives and joy.

Kol Rinah is our multiple opportunities for engagement on the High Holidays, from learning, to different styles of services, to family gatherings, to a moment when our whole congregation gathers together to hear the shofar.

Kol Rinah is our Sisterhood and Brotherhood, creating opportunities for fellowship for male and female identified folks associated with our congregation, while serving Kol Rinah in so many helpful and generous ways.

Kol Rinah is our sweet, small and radically inclusive USY chapter.







## Jewish Education for Our Ever Changing World

The world of Jewish education has changed in fantastic and dramatic ways in every generation. Indeed, the last ten years have seen a flowering of new ideas about what it means to learn Jewishly, what experiences encourage spiritual growth and curiosity, and how families and communities can work to educate not only young students, but Jewish learners at every stage of life.

Here at Kol Rinah, we have made incredible strides in how we educate our school-age children. Our Kol Rinah Education Hub (KoREH) is staffed by extraordinarily compassionate, thoughtful, and dedicated educators, focused on experienced-based learning. Together, we guide students from kindergarten through seventh grade to understand Judaism, sensitizing them to Jewish moments, milestones, celebrations, and culture by giving them these experiences in miniature. And thanks to the amazing dedication of our teachers, we were able to adapt the last two months of lessons into content that could be shared online and completed in groups over Zoom or at home with the help of parents and families.

Kol Rinah's amazing new building on Maryland Avenue has well-equipped KoREH learning rooms as well as centers and outdoor spaces to enjoy. We are also set up technologically to be able to enhance and supplement learning when we are not physically together. I have been so inspired by our community parents as they participate in our Parent Learning Track at KoREH and engage with their young learners at

home. Our wonderful faculty is constantly learning new ways to integrate Jewish ideals, concepts, experiences, and values into the everyday

lives of our students and their families.

Working together with teachers, students, parents, relatives, and the leadership of our community, I can see a myriad of ways a passion for Jewish life can be inculcated in our youth and families. It is that hope that pushes us to develop new ways to connect and learn with one another, no matter what barriers may exist.

During these summer months, we have been preparing for a school year at KoREH that will inspire new learning and growth, continue to build deep personal relationships, and safeguard the health and wellness of our students, staff, and families. While that may look different from previous ways we learned together, I ardently believe this is merely the latest iteration of the infinitely adaptable history of Jewish learning and life.

**Kol Rinah is privileged** to have as part of our legacy magnificent works of art by two local artists of international significance and renown: the extraordinary stained glass windows of Rodney Marshall Winfield and the profound series of paintings by Edward Eugene Boccia.

Winfield's chapel windows, one depicting The Ten Commandments and one the Exodus, were originally created for Shaare Zedek's Diamond Chapel, renamed the Guller Chapel. He received the commission soon after moving to St. Louis and joining the glass company of Emil Frei Associates. The windows, conceived of in collaboration with Rabbi Ephraim Epstein and installed in 1954, are thought to be the first three-dimensional stained glass windows ever created. The Winfield stained glass in the Guller Chapel flanking our beautiful new ark, as well as additional elements in the entry foyer and our Community Hall, are all thanks to the generosity of Sidney Guller.

Winfield went on to have a prominent and storied career as an artist, not only teaching at Maryville University but also creating prominent commissions in stained glass, metal and paint. His Space Window, containing a bit of moon rock, hangs in the National Cathedral in Washington, D.C., and his silver and brass relief plaque commemorating the United Nations, The Brotherhood of Man, is displayed at Grace Cathedral in San Francisco.

Boccia, who painted in his Webster Groves studio as well as taught at Washington University in St. Louis, had

already earned a reputation for his Expressionist diptychs and polyptychs when he was commissioned in 1970 by Brith Sholom Kneseth Israel to create





a series of 10 heroically-scaled figurative works with Judaic themes, directed and inspired by Rabbi Benson Skoff. The 18' 6" tall paintings lit up the walls of the BSKI Allen Sanctuary. His paintings today are found in more than 600 public and private collections and religious institutions worldwide.

The Boccia paintings, newly framed, restored and cleaned, are currently being installed in our new Community Hall, with each painting to grace an arch of its vaulted ceiling, thanks to the generosity of The Samuel Honigberg Foundation, the Sabin and Samuels families, Margaret and Dr. Martin Israel, Phyllis Hyken, Elaine Kaufman and Mark Silvermintz.

It is now our honor to preserve and display these significant artworks in our new facilities. Many thanks are due to our donors, Facilities Committee and Capital Campaign Committee, who provided the leadership and work to ensure these works of art will provide our community with inspiration and enjoyment for decades to come.



## Campaign Update as of 6-15-2020

Thanks to the hard work and dedication of many, great progress has been made readying 7701 Maryland Avenue for occupancy as our new spiritual home. We hope you are as excited as we are!

### Phase One Fundraising Achieved:

1. Full renovation of the Community Hall space
2. Construction of:
  - ✧ Our new sanctuary
  - ✧ The Guller Chapel
  - ✧ KoREH classrooms, meeting rooms, and the Sara Myers Room
  - ✧ The Memorial Alcove
  - ✧ The large pre-services gathering space
3. Exterior improvements: parking, lighting and landscaping (required by Clayton).

**To date, Phase One pledges total \$6,495,107. That exceeds our Phase One Pledge Goal of \$6,416,000!! And we have already collected 63% (\$4,171,318).**

We also have received generous pledges outside of our Phase One campaign.

1. One pledge included:
  - ✧ Painting/staining all existing brick to match our new look
  - ✧ Upgrading exterior lighting
  - ✧ Upgrading landscaping
  - ✧ Replacing original building windows
2. Several pledges are earmarked for finishing top floor Administration Offices. (For over half the projected costs.)

### Phase Two Fundraising:

We have also received pledges for Phase Two. The scope of this phase consists of:

- ✧ The Early Childhood Center
- ✧ Commercial kitchens
- ✧ Boccia paintings & Winfield stained glass installation
- ✧ Building the Sanctuary Balcony, which will add 100 seats to our Sanctuary capacity.

**We continue to work hard** to ensure we can provide our congregation and community with the best facilities we can. Even now, during these challenging times, Kol Rinah's leadership is working hard to fulfill the promise of our new home.

We have achieved great things so far, but we are by no means finished. The gap between our full vision for the location and




