Appreciating Rabbi Scott Shafrin

I remember I was sitting in the car in the parking lot outside the allergist's office when I first spoke on the phone with Scott Shafrin.

More than seven years later, I want to appreciate a little of what Rabbi Shafrin brought to Kol Rinah. (And I say "a little" because I know I cannot capture more than a small amount of what he brought.)

A key part of his job from the beginning has been leading our religious school. The KRRS, or the Kol Rinah Religious School, was good, and scrappy, and small back in 2016. Rabbi Shafrin took the assignment to reboot the school seriously. He met with teachers and parents and students and got to know the culture of strengths of the school his first year. Soon, he renamed it KoREH, the Kol Rinah Education Hub, and changed up the curriculum, adding chugim, or electives. The school has doubled in size over these years, and next year, will probably have about seventy students. It's a constant work

in progress, and Covid was a major challenge, but Rabbi Shafrin has owned and been responsible for the school, and he deserves the credit for its wonderful success.

One of my great joys has been making music, singing, harmonizing, and leading davening with Rabbi Shafrin. I remember him telling me that he was sold on Kol Rinah after five minutes of Kabbalat Shabbat during his first visit here. He has become a wonderful baal tefillah (prayer leader). He sings perfect harmony to anything and everything. He seems to know the guitar chords to songs he's never heard. He understands music intuitively, and keeps us musically in tune, and in good taste. Creating Kol Chadash with him and Karen Kern has been a joy. And you may not realize it, but there are melodies Rabbi Shafrin wrote that we'll be singing here at Kol Rinah for many years to come.

Rabbi Shafrin has also been a critical resource to, leader of and advocate

for our Tzedek Team, our committee that tries to make the world, and our community, better and more just. Rabbi Shafrin cares about justice, about equity, about kindness. He wears his values on his sleeve, and you know what he believes, and you know he believes it with all his heart. He shows up wherever and whenever he's needed, and has created a culture here at Kol Rinah of caring about justice.

I will miss his presence at KoREH. I will miss singing with him as much as we have. And I will miss his justice leadership as a rabbi of Kol Rinah.

But I know that he and I, with you all, will sing together again, every so often. And I know his justice rabbinate will continue and expand in his work with our JCRC of St. Louis. We will all be the beneficiaries of his work there.

During Rabbi Shafrin's last two months with us, take a moment to let him know how he's touched your life.

The "Yoms"

What a great nickname for the most important days of the year. As I am writing this I am working on my activities for Yom HaShoah, HaZikaron, and of course, independence day has already been ready for months. Although you will be reading this after the fact, I would like to share some thoughts as they approach.

These days will once again be a challenge, remembering and celebrating these ceremonies from afar. In the beginning of this year, I was troubled by celebrating Rosh Hashanah away from home. Since then, most other holidays seem "easy", and I've gotten the gist of it. But these days will undoubtedly be challenging.

These are days of family, a recurring theme in Israeli events. My extended family goes to our Kibbutz's Yom HaShoah ceremony, then to a larger party at our Kibbutz's Yom HaZikaron ceremony. The next morning, even more of my family meet at the gravesite of my grandmother's brother who was killed during the Yom Kippur war.

I must say, I've gotten used to missing out. I am excited to experience the American "Yoms". The ceremonies, celebrations, and anything in between. But there is one part that worries me. That moment where all of Israel stands in silence. The Siren. How can I commemorate these days without the basis of what differentiates them from all other days of the year? The siren is one of the parts that cannot be recreated in

any other way. Sadly, I have not found a solution, although as I said I am eager to learn and experience these days for the next few weeks.

Now that we know a little bit of what is coming soon, I would like to share something incredible that happened recently in Israel. Yom HaShoah ceremonies usually include reading texts, and listening to beautiful songs that retell the stories of the Holocaust.

In 2011 an Israeli woman created a non-profit called "zikaron ba'salon" - memories in the living room, which offers a way to commemorate Yom HaShoah by hearing a person's holocaust story, first or second generation. The website lets you search for homes near you and RSVP. This organization has boomed in the past few years. I have heard multiple survivors' stories and it was an amazing experience.

This same woman reached out the GLGLZ, a major Israeli radio station, to create a seminar for Israeli musicians. Why? Because they agreed that the music we hear on Yom HaShoah is repetitive and outdated. Although these songs tell accurate stories, they do not resonate with the younger generation - the third or fourth generation after the holocaust. Some of these children will have never met a survivor.

What was their solution? A seminar gathering a huge group of Israel's most popular musicians. They all listened

to survivor stories and went through writing sessions. With no expectation, these incredible songwriters made music. You guessed it, Yom HaShoah music. What is the difference? These songs are made by the people I grew up listening to and by musicians younger people adore. They too tell the stories of survivors, but in a format that is more familiar to our ears.

These songs will be played in ceremonies for years to come. They are the next generations holocaust music. An odd niche to create an entire ALBUM'S worth of music, 14 songs, by so many different people, all there not for fame or popularity, but to retell others' stories. Stories which must continue being told, no matter how far in the future.

On June 11 at 4pm, in-person, Donn Rubin will introduce BioSTL to his fellow Kol Rinah members.

In its early years (2001-02), the group launched Cortex, St. Louis' urban

innovation district, and jumpstarted local venture capital. BioSTL's startup and investment arm, the BioGenerator, has become one of the most active bioscience seed investors in the U.S. BioSTL has won national and international accolades for innovative best practices from the Brookings Institution, Harvard Business School, and the Organization of American States.

Donn conceived of GlobalSTL (BioSTL's international initiative) to connect St. Louis with dynamic innovation hubs worldwide, starting with Israel in 2014, with the aim

of enriching St. Louis' innovation economy with high-growth companies, technology, and talent from overseas that bring competitive advantage to St. Louis.

In 2022, Donn and BioSTL hosted the first trilateral (Israel-United Arab Emirates-St. Louis) innovation symposium in the U.S., marking the historic Abraham Accords.
