



Music is Holy by Karen Levi

After the Kabbalat Shabbat, the young woman bolstered her courage and stepped up to the rabbi, "The music inspires me more than the actual prayers. The melodies, along with the Hebrew, transport me to a place faraway. Is this, o.k.? Or am I not doing what I should?"

"Go on," Rabbi Ruth encouraged the woman to continue.

"Sometimes, when we sing, I feel I am in a room with wooden benches. Men daven and chant. The elderly, bearded men wear tallit and sway. It could be the old synagogue in Worms, Germany that I visited a few years ago. But I am there—connected by music to people praying a hundred years ago." "There are no 'shoulds.' That is beautiful, Kendra. I am touched that our music transports you to the past. This is a sacred bridge. Music is certainly a form of prayer. And prayer is music." The rabbi touched her heart as she speaks.

"How so?" Kendra asked the rabbi.

"The music connects you to prayer from the past. The music allows you to lift yourself into a mystical realm. The Hebrew words are like poetry when read and repeated. Surprisingly, the translated versions are inspiring, as well. Joined together, the words in either language, form a rhythm that is verbal but nonetheless moving."

"Mm. I see Rabbi. Sometimes when we sing the music, I enter a space of raw emotion. I sense fragile, pure feeling, that is all."

"That is prayer in my mind, Kendra. You are blessed. Continue your path--see where the journey leads. Thank you for sharing your thoughts. Amen."

"Shabbat Shalom." Kendra responded, as she walked away.



An Eternal Window

In a garden I once heard a song or an ancient blessing and above the dark trees a window is always lit, in memory of the face that looked out of it, and that face too was in the memory of another lit window.

-Yehuda Amichai

The whole world heard it--Kristallnacht's shattered cities, stores, lives. For most, deafness and paralysis. Yet one petite woman with dark eyes, her own Lalique and Baccarat still untouched, gazed beyond her beveled windows, imagined each orphaned face, heard each small voice calling. Paying any price to bring them out of Germany, Czechoslovakia, Austria each child a jewel added to the Rothschild collections. Mme gathered them into her own Chateau de la Guette until Paris fell. buying a hotel in the south, moving them, feeding and schooling them in La Bourboule. Leaving money for them when she, herself, had to flee for her life, enough to bring them out over the Pyrenees to Spain, to fishing boats that would take them to America. Tiny charges implored to say only oui or non and smile when questioned, only smile. After the war, Madame would return to ransacked homes, crushed chandeliers, stolen paintings. She would search freight cars filled with her belongings marked "Goerring for Hitler." Some canvases could never be restored, some heirlooms were never found-precious possessions smelted for the Reich. Yet one hundred thirty children settled in other countries, learned new languages, began again. Sixty years later, they would return to Chateau de la Guette from Boston, Miami, Cincinnati, Canada, Israel, Australia. Strangers linked by dim, grim details, coming together to place a plaque for the Baroness Germaine Halphen de Rothschild who heard the call of shattered glass and added to the Rothschild collection irreplaceable, terrified treasures.

Baroness Germaine Halphen de Rothschild (1884-1975): rescued 130 children from Germany after Kristallnacht, brought them to her home in France and then paid for their passage out of Europe to America and elsewhere.

Each year, our Yizkor Book pays tribute to the people and community of Boskovice, also known as Boskowitz, for whom BJC serves as home of its sacred Holocaust Torah. Our charge is to keep the memory of Boskovice and its people alive, caring for and studying their Torah.

Bethesda Jewish Congregation is a proud guardian of one of 1,564 Torah scrolls that, having been gathered for storage during World War II, survived the communities that owned them before the Shoah. Scroll # 143, from the town of Boskovice located in Moravia, Czech Republic, is on permanent loan to Bethesda Jewish Congregation from the Czech Memorial Scrolls Trust in London. It is over 160+ years old and arrived at BJC in 1971.

Boskovice was home to one of the largest Jewish communities in the province of Moravia. On March 19, 1942 the entire Jewish population of the town was deported and/or executed by the Nazis. Only 14 Jews are known to have survived. A descendent of one surviving family, Charles Ticho, visited BJC in 2005 and read from this Sefer Torah, one of only four that remain intact from the town.

Very fragile, with holes where vermin gnawed on the sheepskin, faded print in many places, and with a few missing sections, the congregation still lovingly reads from the scroll on Yom HaShoah and on, or near, the anniversary of Kristallnacht. With 160+ years of service, we consider it the oldest member of our congregation and honor the memory of the Jewish community of the town each time we take it from the ark.

Such is the case, as the United States and the world moves out of a general quarantine phase from the COVID-19 pandemic which has fewer restrictions. However, unlike Tommy, the main character in The Who's rock opera, ending his own restricted existence and screaming, "I'm Free," the new Delta variant should remind us that we cannot remove all of our shackles just yet.

While we should always appreciate what we have, we should never fail to appreciate being in good health ever again. As President Biden recently said, the number of deaths of Americans dying of COVID, 600,000, is greater than those lost in both world wars, Korea, Vietnam, Iraq and Afghanistan combined. As Rabbi Zelig Pliskin has written, "human beings are susceptible to all sorts of diseases and accidents. Many things can harm a person. Even a person walking on straight and solid ground can trip and break a limb. The person who can feel joy because he is not ill or injured lives a happy life."

So for this upcoming year, we should all live it up cautiously and responsibly.


The Committee:






